## **RAMS TRAVEL TO DALLAS TO TAKE ON COWBOYS**

### **900 AND COUNTING**

It was Sept. 9, 1994 at the Georgia Dome against the Atlanta Falcons when rookie WR Isaac Bruce caught a 34-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter, his first NFL reception. Fourteen seasons later at Raymond James Stadium in Tampa, Bruce caught an 11-yard pass from QB Marc Bulger in the first quarter, marking his 900th career reception, seventh most in NFL history. Bruce finished the game with three receptions, giving Isaac 901 for his career, more receptions than any receiver presently in the NFL's Hall of Fame.

Bruce has eclipsed the 900-reception mark in 186 games, the third fastest to reach the mark, behind only Marvin Harrison (149) and Jerry Rice (168). Bruce has had at least 10 receptions in a game eight times in his career.

In 1995, his second season, Bruce led the NFL with 119 receptions, sixth most receptions in one season in NFL history.

In 1999, he led the Rams with 12 touchdown receptions and led the team in receptions eight games that season. In the NFC Divisional Playoff Game, Bruce caught his first postseason touchdown reception, a 77-yard strike from QB Kurt Warner, the second-longest pass reception in team playoff history. In Super Bowl XXXIV against Tennessee, Bruce's 73-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter gave the Rams a 23-16 victory.

Bruce became the franchise career leader in receptions for touchdowns in 2001, and in 2002 became the Rams' all-time leader in receptions passing Henry Ellard who had 593 from 1983-93.

In 2003, Bruce became the Rams' all-time leader in receiving yards, making him one of only 15 players in NFL history to lead their franchise in the three major receiving categories – receiving yards, receptions and receptions for touchdowns.

## THIS WEEK

The Rams are on the road for the second consecutive week as the team travels to Irving, Texas to face the Dallas Cowboys at Texas Stadium. The Cowboys are one of five undefeated teams in the NFL.

The game will feature three of the most productive wide receivers in NFL history. Rams' wide receivers Isaac Bruce and Torry Holt will face off against the Cowboys' Terrell Owens. All three players rank in the top 25 for most career receptions and in the top 20 for most career receiving yards. Bruce's 901 receptions rank seventh in NFL history and Holt's 730 receptions rank 25th. Owens' 817 receptions rank 17th. Bruce ranks seventh in all-time receiving yards with 13,555 yards. Owens' 12,044 receiving yards rank 14th and Holt ranks 20th with 10,885 receiving yards.

The Rams lead the all-time series versus the Cowboys, 14-13. The series dates to 1960 when the Rams defeated the Cowboys in Dallas, 38-13. The Rams won the last meeting versus the Cowboys on Jan. 1, 2006, defeating Dallas, 20-10, at Texas Stadium.

## LAST WEEK

### Raymond James Stadium, September 23, 2007 (65,267)

– The Rams traveled to Tampa Bay looking for their first win of the 2007 campaign, but ultimately came up short, falling to the Buccaneers by a final score of 24-3. Rams WR Isaac Bruce's three catches raised his career total to 901, making Bruce the seventh player in NFL history to reach the 900-catch milestone. Rams RB Steven Jackson's 115 yards rushing moved him past Les Josephson into sixth place on the Rams all-time rushing list, bringing Jackson's career total to 3,480. After Rams K Jeff Wilkins and Bucs K Matt Bryant each missed field goal attempts earlier in the first half, Bryant connected from 27 yards with just 0:03 left in the second quarter, giving Tampa Bay a 3-0 halftime lead. Following a 7-yard touchdown run by Bucs RB Carnell Williams, the Rams drove deep into Tampa Bay territory before an interception in the end zone by Tampa Bay CB Phillip Buchanon halted the St. Louis drive. With Tampa Bay on top 10-0, Rams S OJ Atogwe forced and recovered a Carnell Williams fumble on the first play of the fourth quarter, leading to a successful 25-yard field goal attempt by Wilkins. A pair of fourth quarter touchdown runs by Bucs RB Earnest Graham put Tampa Bay on top for good, bringing the final score to 24-3.

## **THE HEAD COACHES**

**SCOTT LINEHAN** (2nd season as head coach, 2nd with Rams; Career Record: 8-11) – Named twenty-second head coach in franchise history by Owner/Chairman Georgia Frontiere on January 19, 2006. Linehan rallied the Rams to an 8-8 finish in his first season. Quarterback Marc Bulger enjoyed the best season of his career, including 4,301 yards passing and 24 touchdowns. Balancing the offensive attack, Linehan guided Steven Jackson to lead the league with 2,334 combined yards, and set a Rams running back record with 90 catches. Prior to joining the Rams, Linehan was the offensive coordinator of the Miami Dolphins; the Dolphins improved from 29th in 2004 to 14th in total offense in 2005. Linehan spent three seasons (2002-2004) as offensive coordinator for the Minnesota Vikings. In 2004, Daunte Culpepper posted the fourth-highest single season passer rating in NFL history (110.9). A college quarterback, Linehan was a free agent signee with the Dallas Cowboys before a shoulder injury ended his active career.

**WADE PHILLIPS** (6th season as head coach, 1st with Cowboys; Career Record: 48-35) – Named the seventh coach in club history on February 8, 2007, Phillips brings to the Cowboys 30 years of NFL coaching experience, including five as a head coach and 20 as a defensive coordinator. The six times Phillips has taken over as a head coach or defensive coordinator, his new team has reached the playoffs in Phillips' first season. For the past three seasons, Phillips served as the defensive coordinator for the San Diego Chargers (2004-06). Phillips directed a unit that improved each season, moving from 18th in total defense in his first season to 13th in 2005 and then 10th in 2006. He spent two years as defensive coordinator in Atlanta in 2002-03, finishing the 2003 season as interim head coach, with a 2-1 record. During the 1998-2000 seasons as head coach in Buffalo, the Bills compiled a regular season record of 29-19. Before becoming the Bills head coach in 1998, he was the team's defensive coordinator (1995-97). Phillips had a two-year stint as Denver's head coach (1993-94), after serving as defensive coordinator the previous four seasons. He led the Broncos to a playoff berth in his first season (1993) and finished his stint as head coach with a 16-16 record. He was the Philadelphia Eagles defensive coordinator and linebackers coach from 1986-88. His first coordinator position came with the New Orleans Saints (1981-85). Phillips' professional coaching career began with the Houston Oilers in 1976 as the linebackers coach under his father, longtime NFL coach Bum Phillips. From 1977-1980 he coached the Oilers' defensive line.

## **THE LAST TIME**

**Texas Stadium, January 1, 2006 (63,131)** – The Rams finished the 2006 season with a 20-10 win over Dallas, improving their record to 6-10. Pro Bowl WR Torry Holt had four receptions for 40 yards in his 100th career start, putting Holt over 1,300 receiving yards and 100 catches for the season. Holt became the first player in NFL history to have six-straight 1,300-yard receiving seasons. K Jeff Wilkins extended his streak of consecutive PAT to 310, the second-longest streak in NFL history. Wilkins hit two field goals, the first from 49 yards and the second from 20. RB Steven Jackson was inactive due to a hip injury, so, while RB Marshall Faulk started the contest, RBs Aveion Cason and Arlen Harris were forced to step up and fill the void. Both backs finished the game with 10 rushes and a touchdown, while Cason amassed 65 yards and Harris added another 15. The defense held Cowboys' RB Julius Jones to 35 yards on 15 rushes. DE's Leonard Little and Anthony Hargrove found themselves in the backfield on numerous occasions as Cowboys' QB Drew Bledsoe was sacked five times for a total of 28 yards and pressured 15 times. The Cowboys were the first to strike in the game as Bledsoe hit TE Jason Witten with a 19-yard pass to give Dallas a 7-0 lead. After a Wilkins field goal early in the second quarter, Cason ran eight yards and spun his way to his first touchdown as a Ram late in the quarter to give the Rams a 10-7 lead. Cowboys' K Shaun Suisham tied the game at 10-10 as the clock ran out in the first half. The third quarter was scoreless. The Rams added another touchdown on a 1-yard run by Harris, his first of the season, to take a 17 -10 lead. After S Oshiomogho Atogwe's first career interception, which was one of two second half interceptions by the Rams' secondary, Wilkins added his second field goal of the game for the final game.

## **BIG PLAY ATOGWE**

S Oshiomogho Atogwe recorded his first forced fumble and fumble recovery of the season last week at Tampa Bay. On the first play of the fourth quarter, Atogwe striped RB Carnell Williams and recovered the fumble on Tampa Bay's 33-yard line. The turnover led to a 25-yard field goal by K Jeff Wilkins cutting the Buccaneers lead to 10-3.

Atogwe has developed a knack of separating the ball from the carrier. Last season he tied for a team-high and career best six forced fumbles.

In Week 1 against Carolina, Atogwe led the team with a career-high 10 tackles (nine solo). He ranks fourth with 20 tackles (16 solo), with one pass defensed, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

## **RAMS-COWBOYS CONNECTIONS**

**RAMS** – Head Coach **Scott Linehan** was signed as a rookie free agent with the Dallas Cowboys in 1987 but suffered a shoulder injury, ending his playing career...**Judd Garrett**, tight ends coach, spent the 1993 season on the Dallas Cowboys practice squad and later spent the 1995 campaign with the San Antonio Texans of the CFL. Judd is also the younger brother of Cowboys offensive coordinator **Jason Garrett** and tight ends coach **John Garrett**...**Jeff Horton**, special assistant/offense, is a native of Arlington, Texas...Strength and conditioning coach **Dana LeDuc** filled the same role at the University of Texas (Austin, Texas) from 1977-1992...**Ron Milus**, assistant secondary coach, entered the pro ranks after spending the 1999 season as the defensive backs coach for Texas A&M University (College Station, Texas)...Director of Player Personnel **Lawrence McCutcheon** was a star running back at Plainview High (Plainview, Texas) and this past February he was inducted into the Texas Panhandle Hall of Fame. McCutcheon was named Player of the Century for Texas' South Plains in 2000...College scout **Dick Daniels** played with the Cowboys from 1966-68 after being signed as a rookie free agent...**Steve Kazor**, scout, spent two seasons with the Cowboys from 1980-81, serving as administrative assistant to the vice president Gil Brandt and head coach Tom Landry...**Brad Roll**, assistant strength and conditioning coach and native of Houston, Texas, played collegiately at Blinn Junior College (Brenham, Texas) and Stephen F. Austin (Nacogdoches, Texas) where he earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in education. Roll also started his coaching career at Stephen F. Austin in 1980 as a graduate assistant and was inducted into their Ring of Honor in 2004...Special teams coach **Al Roberts** started his NFL coaching career as running backs/special teams coach for the Houston Oilers from 1984-85...**Jim Anderson**, head athletic trainer, began his athletic training career in high school, spending summers working in the training camps of the Houston Oilers, who trained near his home in Huntsville, Texas...**DT La'Roi Glover** spent the 2002-05 seasons with the Cowboys recording a career-best 76 tackles in 2002 and earning Pro Bowl honors in each of his four seasons there before joining the Rams last year...**WR Dante Hall** grew up in Houston, Texas, and earned All-America honors at Nimitz High School before attending Texas A&M, where he finished his collegiate career with 4,707 all-purpose yards, the second-highest mark in school history...**K Jeff Wilkins** was signed as an undrafted free agent by Dallas in 1994...**QB Brock Berlin** (practice squad) was signed and released in the offseason as an unrestricted free agent by the Cowboys in 2007...**CB Eric Bassey** (practice squad) grew up in Garland, Texas where he played at North Garland earning All-District honors.

## **ROOKIE RUNNER**

Rookie RB Brian Leonard will make his first NFL start this week when the Rams take on the Cowboys at Texas Stadium.

Leonard, from Rutgers University, was selected by the Rams in the second round of the 2007 Draft with the 52nd overall pick. Leonard saw extensive action at RB in the 2007 preseason, finishing with a team-leading 39 rushes and 125 yards with one touchdown. He was also the team's second-leading receiver with 10 receptions for 63 yards.

Leonard, who was known for his versatility in college, has gotten playing time at the running back and fullback positions during the 2007 regular season. In three games, Leonard has rushed four times for 21 yards (5.3-yard average) and has caught six passes for 41 yards (6.8-yard average).

## **GIVE ME THE BALL**

In 2006, the Rams finished fourth in the NFC and seventh in the NFL with 32 take-aways (17 interceptions, 15 fumble recoveries). The Rams have five takeaways in 2007. Since 1995, their first season in St. Louis, the Rams have totaled 383 take-aways, the third-highest total in the NFL during that time. ## **LINES FROM LINEHAN**

### **(On the status of LG Mark Setterstrom)**

“Mark Setterstrom did have a torn ACL in his left knee, some cartilage damage from the MRI showed up as well. He’ll be out for the year. The good news is it’s one of those injuries that will be repairable. He’s a young guy and should be able to bounce back from this for next season.

### **(On who will start for injured RB Steve Jackson)**

“No. 23 (Brian Leonard) is going to get his first NFL start. This is one of those things where we’ve been hit by the injury bug. You can’t go there. You have to look at it like we have an insurmountable (on paper) challenge this week. We’re sitting here with no wins in three games and we’re playing probably the hottest team in, maybe all of football right now. If we keep our minds right it will be the greatest win we’ve had since we’ve been here. It will be exciting to watch Brian Leonard and Travis Minor play. That’s the only way you can look at it.

The injuries are the part you don’t plan on. You have to respond the right way and that’s the only way we’re going to respond.”

### **(On the play of Gs Milford Brown and Claude Terrell at Tampa Bay)**

“They have the size for the position. It helps us match up against the interior people we were playing in that game. It’s better in the run (versus the pass); I think you saw some of that from our success when we ran the ball in this game versus the first two. It should enable us to continue to do that. (The presence of Brown and Terrell) still gives you a couple options there with the bulk and size of those guards, which I think will continue to help our run game.”

Since the Super Bowl era only five wide receiver tandems have been together for nine or more seasons. Rams' WRs Isaac Bruce and Torry Holt (1999-present) represent one pair, joining Pittsburgh's Lynn Swann and John Stallworth (1974-82), Miami's Mark Clayton and Mark Duper (1983-92), San Francisco's Jerry Rice and John Taylor (1987-95) and Denver's Rod Smith and Ed McCaffery (1995-2003).

The tandem of Bruce and Holt has proven to be one of the most effective long-term wide receiver pairs in NFL history, as Bruce and Holt have more receptions (1,319) and receiving yards (19,777) than any of the other four pairings.

The Rams and Cowboys feature three of the NFL's top young running backs as the Rams' rushing attack is led by RB Steven Jackson and the Cowboys are led by a duo of running backs in Julius Jones and Marion Barber III.

Last season, RB Steven Jackson's 2,334 yards from scrimmage led the NFL, were the most in Rams history and were the fifth-most for a single-season in NFL history. His 90 receptions led all running backs in 2006.

LB Brandon Chillar finished second on the team with a season-high eight tackles (five solo) and one forced fumble at Tampa Bay last week. In his second year starting at weak side linebacker, Chillar is third on the team with 21 tackles (15 solo), two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.

In Week 2 against San Francisco, he made six tackles (four solo), and in the season opener against Carolina he was second among linebackers with seven tackles (six solo), one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. WR Torry Holt led the team in receptions for the second time this season after catching five passes for 63 yards last week at Tampa Bay. Holt is tied for fifth in the NFC with 18 receptions.

When a first down is needed, Holt has come through for the Rams. Holt is tied for first in the NFC, tied for third in the NFL with seven third-down receptions.

With his 63 receiving yards, Holt moved into 20th place on the NFL's all-time receiving yards list with 10,885 receiving yards. His 730 career receptions rank 25th on the league's all-time list.

In Week 2 against San Francisco, Holt finished second on the team with five receptions for a season-high 74 yards and one touchdown. In the season opener, he led the team with eight receptions for 73 yards and one touchdown.

### **JACK IN THE BOX**

RB Steven Jackson recorded his first 100-yard rushing game this season, coming last week at Tampa Bay. It marks the 11th time in his career Jackson has rushed for 100 or more yards in a single game. On an NFL season-high 30 rushing attempts, Jackson rushed for 115 yards. His 30 carries were the most by an NFL running back in Week 3 and ties him for second among all running backs for the season with 69. Last week was Jackson's third 30-plus carry game of his career. The last time he recorded 30 or more carries was last season against the Washington Redskins (12/24), when he carried for a career-high 33 times for 150 yards. The Rams are 2-1 when he carries more than 30 times a game; and 9-2 when he rushes for 100-plus yards. Jackson's 115 rushing yards was the fourth most yards by a running back in the NFL in Week 3 and second in the NFC.

Chavous stripped RB DeAngelo Williams after a 13-yard reception and LB Will Witherspoon recovered the ball to give the Rams possession. Chavous is now tied for the team lead in tackles with 26 (14 solo), the best start of his career.

### **NEW FACES JOIN RAMS STAFF**

**Mike Cox (Defensive Quality Control/Assistant Defensive Line)** – Cox joins the Rams after spending nearly 20 years at the collegiate level, including 17 seasons under the tutelage of former collegiate head coach John L. Smith. A four-time letterman at Idaho and a three-year starter at linebacker, Cox landed his first coaching position with his alma mater, where he spent eight seasons (1987-1994) as linebackers coach. Upon Smith’s departure following the 1994 season, Cox followed his mentor to his next three stops, including a three season stint with Utah State (1995-1997), five seasons with Louisville (1998-2002) and five seasons with Michigan State (2002-2006), handling the linebackers at each spot while also serving as recruiting coordinator at Michigan State. In 2000, Louisville forced an NCAA-best 37 turnovers and in 2002 Louisville ranked among the NCAA leaders in rushing defense. As a player at Idaho, Cox recorded 252 tackles, which still ranks among the Vandals’ all-time leaders.

**Keith Murphy (Offensive Quality Control)** – Murphy comes to the Rams after eight seasons coaching wide receivers and special teams at Eastern Washington University. A former wide receiver at the University of Washington, Murphy worked with receivers, quarterbacks and special teams as a graduate assistant with his alma mater under Scott Linehan for three seasons (1997-1999) after spending the 1996 campaign working with the running backs and special teams as a Huskies student assistant. During Murphy’s five-year career as a player, he was part of two Pac-10 Conference champion teams, as well as five bowl teams.

**Al Roberts (Special Teams)** – After spending the past four years coaching and teaching on the high school level, Roberts joins the Rams as special teams coach, bringing with him 17 years of NFL experience. After playing college football at the University of Washington and the University of Puget Sound, Roberts began a coaching career that took him to a variety of stops on both the collegiate and professional levels. Roberts returned to the University of Washington in 1977 as running backs coach, where he spent six years (1977-1982) before moving to the USFL. Roberts served as both running backs and special teams coach for the Los Angeles Express in 1983 and 1984, then moved to the Houston Oilers (1984-1995), Purdue University (1986) and University of Wyoming (1987). Roberts returned to the NFL in 1988, making stops as special teams coach with the Philadelphia Eagles (1988-1990), New York Jets (1991-1993) and Arizona Cardinals (1994-1995). In 1996 Roberts returned to the University of Washington, coaching running backs and special teams for one year before again moving to the NFL as special teams coach with the Cincinnati Bengals (1997-2002). In 1999 the Bengals finished third in the NFL in both kickoff and punt returns, while Tremain Mack became the first Bengal to lead the AFC (27.1 avg.) in kickoff returns, as well as the first Cincinnati player to be named to the Pro Bowl as a kick return specialist.

#### **OFFENSE**

##### **QUARTERBACKS (2) – Doug Nussmeier**

Marc Bulger (7), Gus Frerotte (14)

Two-time Pro Bowler Marc Bulger starts at QB for the Rams. Bulger comes off of a career-year in 2006 and is the Rams' second-leading passer in team history, totalling over 16,000 yards. In 2007, Bulger has completed 63-of-109 passing attempts for 651 yards with two touchdowns and three interceptions for a 69.8 passer rating. In Week 2 vs. San Francisco 9/16, Bulger totaled 368 passing yards, which stands as the fifth-highest passing yardage total in the NFL in the young season. Backing up Bulger, is 14-year veteran **Gus Frerotte**. Frerotte provides valuable experience and is familiar with coach Scott Linehan's offensive system, after spending time with Linehan while he was the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Minnesota (2003-04) and Miami (2005).

##### **RUNNING BACKS (4) – Wayne Moses**

Steven Jackson (4), Brian Leonard (R), Travis Minor (7), Richard Owens (4), Antonio Pittman (R)

Pro Bowler **Steven Jackson** serves as the Rams feature back. In Week 3 vs. Tampa Bay 9/23 Jackson posted his first 100-yard rushing performance of the year, rushing 30 times for 115 yards. Jackson leads the Rams in 2007, with 233 rushing yards on 69 carries. Jackson will miss the Rams' Week 4 contest at Dallas after suffering a groin injury vs. Tampa Bay. Rams 2007 second-round draft pick **Brian Leonard**, will replace Jackson in the starting lineup. Leonard typically serves as Jackson's backup and has also played at the fullback position. The former All-

America honoree from Rutgers has made contributions in 2007 as a rusher and as a receiver out of the backfield, rushing four times for 21 yards and gaining 35 yards on five receptions. **Travis Minor** joined the Rams in the off-season after spending the previous six seasons with Miami. Minor provides added depth and valuable contributions on special teams. Minor received his first carry of the season in Week 2 vs. San Francisco 9/16, gaining four yards. Minor is third on the squad with two special teams tackles after posting one tackle in each of the team's first two games. Rookie Antonio Pittman, joined the Rams on a waiver claim 9/2 after being waived by the New Orleans Saints during final roster cuts, but has been a gameday inactive in each of the first three weeks of the season. Pittman, a fourth-round draft choice of the Saints out of Ohio State, ranks eighth on the Buckeyes' all-time rushing list despite playing only three seasons. **FB Richard Owens** joined the Rams after being signed as a free agent 9/12. Owens, a four-year veteran, was waived by Minnesota during final roster cuts and saw his first action as a Ram at Tampa Bay.

##### **WIDE RECEIVERS (6) – Henry Ellard**

Drew Bennett (7), Isaac Bruce (14), Marques Hagans (1), Dante Hall (8), Torry Holt (9), Dane Looker (7)

The Rams' receiving corps is led by **Torry Holt** and **Isaac Bruce**, two of the best wide receivers in the NFL. Holt and Bruce are one of only five pairs of wide receivers who have played together for nine or more seasons in the Super Bowl era. The pair has totaled 1,311 receptions and 19,700 receiving yards with 117 touchdowns since their first season together in 1999. Holt leads the Rams this season with 18 receptions and 210 yards with two touchdowns while Bruce has added 14 receptions for 179 yards, including posting eight receptions for 145 yards in Week 2 vs. San Francisco 9/16. With his three receptions

in Week 3 at Tampa Bay 9/23, Bruce has made 901 receptions during his career and reached the milestone in only 186 games, becoming the third-fastest player to reach the mark in NFL history. After spending the past six seasons with the Tennessee Titans, **Drew Bennett** joins the Rams after signing as a free agent in the offseason. Bennett made his debut for the Rams in Week 2 vs. San Francisco, posting three catches for 42 yards. Bennett was deactivated for the season opening contest vs. Carolina 9/9 after suffering a thigh injury in practice. Joining Bennett as a new addition to the Rams receiving corps is former Kansas City Chief **Dante Hall**. One of the most dynamic return men in NFL history, Hall entered 2007 with 11 return touchdowns, good for third in NFL history. Hall proved his worth quickly in the 2007, returning the opening kickoff of the second half vs. Carolina for 84 yards. Hall also has three catches for 20 yards. **Dane Looker** is in his fifth year with the Rams and is an important backup at the receiver position and critical on special teams, serving as the holder for K Jeff Wilkins. Looker saw action on offense vs. Carolina 9/9, catching two passes for 10 yards. Second-year receiver **Marques Hagans** joined the Rams' 53-man roster this season after spending the 2006 campaign as a member of the practice squad. Hagans, selected by the Rams in the fifth round of the 2006 NFL Draft, is a former college quarterback and also serves as the team's emergency signal-caller.

#### **TIGHT ENDS (4) – Judd Garrett**

Dominique Byrd (2), Joe Klopfenstein (2), Randy McMichael (6), Aaron Walker (5)

**Randy McMichael** starts at tight end for the Rams, after joining the team as a free agent in the offseason from Miami. McMichael spent five seasons with the Dolphins, one of which was spent under the tutelage of then Dolphins offensive coordinator Scott Linehan. McMichael is a receiving threat and an effective blocker from the tight end position. In 2007, McMichael has made six receptions for 77 yards, including a two-catch 40-yard performance in Week 2 vs. San Francisco 9/16. A pair of second-year tight ends, **Joe Klopfenstein** and **Dominique Byrd**, join fifth-year player, **Aaron Walker**, to provide depth at the position.

#### **OFFENSIVE LINE (9) – Paul Boudreau, Jim Chaney**

Alex Barron (3), Milford Brown (6), Adam Goldberg (5), Brandon Gorin (7), Richie Incognito (3), Andy McCollum (14), Brett Romberg (4), Mark Setterstrom (2), Claude Terrell (3)

Due to injuries, the Rams' offensive line has undergone shuffling throughout the first three games of the 2007 season. Starting **RG Richie Incognito** has missed the first three games of the season due to an ankle injury and start-

ing **LT Orlando Pace** and starting **LG Mark Setterstrom** are out for the season. Pace suffered a shoulder injury in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9 and Setterstrom injured his knee during the Rams' Week 3 matchup at Tampa Bay 9/23. **Pace**, a former No. 1 overall pick, had his streak of seven consecutive Pro Bowls snapped last year after his season was derailed by a torn triceps. After three games, the Rams have used six different offensive line combinations. **Alex Barron**, a third-year veteran, moves to the left side of the line and serves as the team's starting left tackle in place of the injured Pace. Barron, returns to the position for his most extensive action since he was a senior at Florida State University. **Brett Romberg** serves as the Rams' starting center after winning the job in training camp, the first time in his career that he has been named a full-time starter. **Milford Brown** joined the Rams in training camp to provide depth, but was pushed into service in Week 1 vs. Carolina after Incognito was unable to play. Brown switched positions again after the loss of Pace. With Barron moving to left tackle, Brown took Barron's place on the right side of the line in Week 2 vs. San Francisco. At Tampa Bay, Brown served as a reserve, but was called upon at LG after the injury to Setterstrom. Veteran center **Andy McCollum** returns for his 14th NFL season and is a valuable backup. **Adam Goldberg** provided valuable versatility as a backup lineman during the 2006 season. Goldberg served as the Rams' left tackle vs. Carolina after Pace left the game due to injury and saw some action vs. San Francisco after Claude Terrell missed brief time with a thigh bruise. Goldberg started at RT at Tampa Bay. **Terrell** provides added depth at the guard position, and started at right guard for the Rams vs. San Francisco and at Tampa Bay in place of Incognito.

### ***DEFENSE / SPECIAL TEAMS***

#### **DEFENSIVE LINE (8) – Brian Baker, Mike Cox**

Victor Adeyanju (2), Adam Carriker (R), La'Roi Glover (12), James Hall (8), Trevor Johnson (4), Louis Leonard (R), Leonard Little (10), Clifton Ryan (R).

**DE Leonard Little**, the Rams' all-time leader in sacks since the statistic was made official in 1982, starts at right defensive end. Little ranks 11th among active players with 74.0 sacks. This season Little has totaled 15 tackles, tied for the team lead among defensive linemen. In Week 2 vs. San Francisco 9/16 Little notched six tackles. **DE James Hall** starts at left end for the Rams after joining the Rams in the offseason in a trade with Detroit. In his first game as a Ram in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9, Hall notched four total tackles, including one tackle for loss. Hall is tied with Little for the most tackles among Rams' defensive linemen with 15 take-downs. **DT La'Roi Glover** and **DT Adam Carriker** start

along the inside of the Rams' defensive line. Glover, who is in his 12th season, stands 10th among active players with 77 sacks. Glover has 12 tackles through the first three games of the 2007 season. Carriker, the Rams' 2007 first-round draft pick is playing nose tackle after a standout career at defensive end for Nebraska. In his debut vs. Carolina, Carriker notched three assisted tackles and has four total tackles on the year. **DT Clifton Ryan** has been called upon to give the Rams' significant playing time after second-year player DT Claude Wroten was suspended for four games and will be unable to play until the Rams' contest at Baltimore 10/14. Ryan proved to be ready to contribute as he saw increased action in the Week 2 matchup vs. San Francisco. Ryan, led the Rams' defensive lineman with eight total tackles including two sacks and also caused a fumble by 49ers QB Alex Smith, which he recovered himself. Ryan became the first Rams' rookie since Sean Gilbert in 1992. **DE Victor Adeyanju** had a promising rookie season in 2006, and provides important depth on the defensive line. Adeyanju was unable to get onto the field in the season opener vs. Carolina, being declared inactive after suffering an ankle injury in practice, but has returned to see action. **DE Trevor Johnson** also provides depth at the defensive end position for the Rams. Johnson, who has made three tackles in 2007, joined the Rams in the offseason after splitting time between the New York Jets and New Orleans in 2006. In Week 3 at Tampa Bay, Johnson recorded his first sack of the season, dropping Tampa QB Jeff Garcia for an 11-yard loss. **DT Louis Leonard**, a rookie from Fresno State, was added to the Rams active roster from San Diego's practice squad 9/12.

#### **LINEBACKERS (7) – Rick Venturi**

Brandon Chillar (4), Quinton Culberson (R), Chris Draft (9), Tim McGarigle (1), Raonall Smith (6), Pisa Tinoisamoa (5), Will Witherspoon (6)

Six-year veteran **Will Witherspoon** starts at middle linebacker for the Rams and is tied for the team lead with 26 tackles in 2007. Witherspoon started fast this season, totaling eight tackles, one pass defended and one fumble recovery in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9 and added 11 total tackles in Week 2 vs. San Francisco. Witherspoon led the team in tackles in 2006, his first season with the team. Starting at strongside linebacker, **Brandon Chillar** had seven tackles, one forced fumble and a fumble recovery in the Rams' season opener vs. Carolina and posted a season-high eight tackles in Week 3 at Tampa Bay 9/23. Chillar's 23 tackles on the year, rank third on the team. Chillar also sees action on special teams and is tied for third place on the team with two special teams tackles. **Pisa Tinoisamoa**, starts at weakside linebacker and has three tackles in 2007, all of which he notched in the season-opener vs. Carolina. Tinoisamoa missed the Week 2 matchup vs. San Francisco and the Week 3 contest at Tampa Bay with an ankle injury.

The Rams acquired free agent **Chris Draft** in the offseason, and the nine-year veteran from Stanford, is an important backup and special teams player, with the ability to be a starter. Draft has five total tackles in 2007 and started at weakside linebacker vs. San Francisco and at Tampa Bay in place of Tinoisamo. Draft made three total tackles on defense and adding one tackle on special teams vs. San Francisco and six tackles at Tampa Bay. **Raonall Smith** is a valuable asset on special teams and provides depth at linebacker. In the 2007 season opener vs. Carolina, Smith notched two special teams tackles and added one special teams tackle vs. San Francisco, tying him for the team lead with three special teams tackles. 2006 seventh-round draft choice **Tim McGarigle** spent last season on the Rams' practice squad, but has found a home on the team's active roster this season despite being slowed by a hamstring injury in the preseason. McGarigle serves as a backup linebacker and is an important special teams player. Undrafted rookie free agent **Quinton Culberson** from Mississippi State rounds out the linebacking corps. Culberson was inactive in the season-opener, but saw his first NFL action in Week 2 vs. San Francisco, notching two special teams tackles and earning Special Teams Player of the Week from the team's coaches.

#### **SECONDARY (9) – Willy Robinson, Ron Milus**

Oshiomogho Atogwe (3), Ron Bartell (3), Jerome Carter (3), Corey Chavous (10), Tye Hill (2), Todd Johnson (5), Darius Vinnett (R), Jonathan Wade (R), Lenny Walls (6)

**S Corey Chavous**, a 10-year veteran, starts at strong safety for the Rams and provides valuable leadership for a secondary that features only two other players with five or more years of experience. Chavous is tied for first on the team with 26 total tackles and notched eight total tackles in each of the Rams first two games. In Week 3 at Tampa Bay 9/23 Chavous led the team with 10 tackles including six solo stops. Starting free safety **S Oshiomogho Atogwe** got off to a fast start in 2007, leading the team in tackles with 10 in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9. Atogwe's 20 tackles are fourth on the team in 2007. Atogwe, who has shown a propensity for making big plays, recorded his first forced fumble and fumble recovery of the season at Tampa Bay. **CB Ron Bartell**, starts at cornerback in place of Fakhir Brown, who is serving a four-game suspension. Bartell has impressed notching 17 tackles including 1.0 sack in 2007 and has been an important part of a Rams' defense that ranks third in the NFL in pass defense and seventh in the league in total defense. **CB Tye Hill**, a second-year player out of Clemson, is the Rams regular starter opposite of Bartell, but has missed the last two games due to a back injury that was suffered in practice prior to the Week 2 contest vs. San Francisco. Hill made six tackles in the Rams season-opener vs. Carolina. **CB Lenny Walls** has started in Hill's place vs. San Francisco and at Tampa Bay. Walls has been a

solid performer in starting duty, with six tackles and one pass defended. When Hill returns, Walls will likely serve as the team's nickelback. **S Jerome Carter** serves as a back-up safety and sees action on special teams. Carter posted his first special teams tackle of the year vs. San Francisco. **S Todd Johnson**, aquired in the offseason as a free agent, provides valuable experience and is a standout on special teams. In Week 1 vs. Carolina, Johnson shared the Rams' special teams Player of the Week honors with LB Brandon Chillar after Johnson notched two special teams tackles. Johnson's four special teams tackles rank first on the team. 2007 third-round pick **CB Jonathan Wade** out of Tennessee, where *Associated Press* All-Southeastern Conference honors, contributes as a backup in the secondary this season and is a gunner on the Rams' punt coverage teams. Wade saw extensive action in Week 2 vs. San Francisco and Week 3 at Tampa Bay as the team's nickelback after the injury to Hill moved Walls into the starting lineup.

#### **SPECIAL TEAMS (3) – AI Roberts, Todd Downing**

Donnie Jones (4), Chris Massey (6), Jeff Wilkins (14)

**K Jeff Wilkins** continues to be one of the best kickers in the NFL. Wilkins has converted on six-of-nine field goal attempts this season. Wilkins has been successful on both of his PAT attempts this season and continues his streak of 348 consecutive PATs, which stands as a Rams' franchise-record and ranks second in NFL history behind Jason Elam's streak of 371 consecutive extra point conversions from 1993-2002. Wilkins has converted 289 career field goals, which stands as the Rams' all-time mark and his 1,147 points make him the Rams' all-time scoring leader. **LS Chris Massey**, one of the most consistent players at his position, continues long snapping duties, while **P Donnie Jones** plays his first season with the Rams after spending 2006 in Miami. Jones has punted 12 times this season for 549 yards, posting a 45.8-yard average and a 38.4-yard net average with four punts inside the 20.
