RAMS RETURN HOME TO FACE NFC WEST RIVAL ARIZONA

X-FACTOR

WR Dante Hall still is one of the best return men in NFL history. He continued to ascend the NFL charts after making his first punt return for a touchdown of the season at Dallas last week. With just more than two minutes left to play in the first half, the Rams' defense forced Dallas to punt. Hall caught the ball at the Rams' 15-yard line and returned it 85 yards for the touchdown, tying the score 7-7. The return marked Hall's sixth-career punt return for a touchdown, most among active players. It also marked his 12th-career touchdown return, tied for second most in NFL history. With one more return for a touchdown, Hall will be tied with Brian Mitchell for most returns for touchdowns all time. Mitchell played 14 years. Hall is in his eighth season.

In the season opener against Carolina, Hall returned the opening kickoff of the second half 82 yards, marking the sixth longest kickoff return in the league in 2007.

Hall ranks second in the NFL in kickoff return yards (398), third in the league in total return yards (532) and seventh in the league in punt return average (13.4). His 85-yard return is the longest punt return in the NFL this season.

THIS WEEK

The Rams return home this week to take on NFC West rival Arizona. The contest will be the Rams' second division matchup this season; the Rams faced San Francisco in Week 2.

The Rams lead the all-time series against the Cardinals 31-24-2, dating to 1937, and have won seven of the last 10 meetings between the teams since Arizona joined the "new" NFC West after realignment in 2002. The Rams split the 2006 series against the Cardinals, winning 16-14 in Week 3 at Arizona and dropping the Week 13 matchup in St. Louis, 34-20.

Since the Rams relocated to the Gateway City in 1995, the Rams hold a 7-5 advantage over the Big Red, including a 7-3 mark since the teams were aligned in the "new" NFC West in 2002. The teams have met once in the post-season, with the Rams taking a 35-23 home victory in the 1975 NFC Divisional Playoffs.

LAST WEEK

Texas Stadium, September 30, 2007 (62,866) – The Rams traveled to Dallas in Week 4 to face the Cowboys, falling 35-7 in the 28th meeting between two of the most storied franchises in NFL history. Rams RB Brian Leonard made the first start of his NFL career, rushing for 58 yards on 16 carries. Rams P Donnie Jones punted eight times for an average of 55.3 yards per punt, second highest in franchise history. Rams QB Gus Frerotte saw his first action of the season, completing three of six pass attempts for 29 yards. A scoreless first quarter ended when S Oshiomogho Atogwe recorded the Rams first interception of the season, which he returned 31 yards into Dallas territory. After a 2-yard touchdown run by Cowboys RB Julius Jones opened the scoring midway through the second quarter, Rams WR Dante Hall retaliated with the first touchdown of his Rams career, returning a Mat McBriar punt 85 yards to even the score at seven. With 0:11 remaining in the half, Dallas QB Tony Romo capped a 12-play, 83-yard drive with a 15-yard touchdown run to put the Cowboys on top by a touchdown. Romo found WR Patrick Crayton early in the third quarter for a 59-yard touchdown before again hooking up with Crayton for the pair's second touchdown in as many possessions. Romo added his third touchdown pass of the quarter with a 17-yard strike to TE Jason Witten, bringing the score to 35-7.

THE HEAD COACHES

SCOTT LINEHAN (2nd season as head coach, 2nd with Rams; Career Record: 8-12) – Named twenty-second head coach in franchise history by Owner/Chairman Georgia Frontiere on January 19, 2006. Linehan rallied the Rams to an 8-8 finish in his first season. Quarterback Marc Bulger enjoyed the best season of his career, including 4,301 yards passing and 24 touchdowns. Balancing the offensive attack, Linehan guided Steven Jackson to lead the league with 2,334 combined yards, and set a Rams running back record with 90 catches. Prior to joining the Rams, Linehan was the offensive coordinator of the Miami Dolphins; the Dolphins improved from 29th in 2004 to 14th in total offensive in 2005. Linehan spent three seasons (2002-2004) as offensive coordinator for the Minnesota Vikings. In 2004, Daunte Culpepper posted the fourth-highest single season passer rating in NFL history (110.9). A college quarterback, Linehan was a free agent signee with the Dallas Cowboys before a shoulder injury ended his active career.

KEN WHISENHUNT (1st season as head coach, 1st with Arizona; Career Record: 2-2) – Became an NFL head coach for the first time when hired by Arizona on January 14, 2007. Comes to the Cardinals with 10 years of experience as an NFL assistant coach and also played nine seasons in the league as a tight end. Whisenhunt spent the previous six seasons as an assistant on Bill Cowher's staff with the Pittsburgh Steelers, the first three as tight ends coach and the last three as offensive coordinator. Whisenhunt took over as Pittsburgh's offensive coordinator in 2004, the same year the team drafted quarterback Ben Roethlisberger, who went on to set an NFL record with wins in his first 13 career starts en route to Offensive Rookie of the Year honors. The next season he became the youngest quarterback in NFL history to win a Super Bowl and finished third in the league in passer rating (98.6). In Whisenhunt's first year as coordinator, the Steelers rushing attack improved from thirty-first to second and the overall offense ranked sixteenth. His second year ended with an NFL title after the Steelers offense averaged 26.8 points per game in the playoffs. Prior to joining the Steelers, Whisenhunt coached at the pro level with the New York Jets (tight ends, 2000), Cleveland Browns (special teams, 1999) and Baltimore Ravens (tight ends, 1997-98). He began his coaching career at Vanderbilt University coaching for two seasons (1995-1996). Whisenhunt was selected in the 12th round of the 1985 NFL Draft by the Atlanta Falcons out of Georgia Tech. He went on to play nine NFL seasons with the Falcons (1985-88), Redskins (1989-90), and New York Jets (1991-93).

THE LAST TIME

Edward Jones Dome, December 3, 2006 (65,612) – In their second meeting of the 2006 season, the Rams lost to division rivals the Arizona Cardinals, 34-20. WR Isaac Bruce had five receptions for 75 yards, totaling 867 receptions for his career, passing WR Jimmy Smith (862) for seventh place on the NFL's all-time receptions list. Bruce's 75 receiving yards gave him 13,042 for his career, extending his Rams' record, and allowing him to become the third-fastest player in NFL history to reach 13,000 career receiving yards, doing it in 178 career games, behind only WR Jerry Rice (154) and WR Marvin Harrison (162). QB Marc Bulger passed for 314 yards, totaling 15,104 for his career, to become the fourth player in Rams' history with 15,000 passing yards, and tying QB Kurt Warner and Hall of Famer Dan Marino as the fastest players in NFL history to that milestone by doing so in 56 games. RB Steven Jackson had a combined 165 yards from scrimmage, with 96 rushing yards and 9 receptions for 69 yards, giving him his second straight 1,000-yard rushing season. Jackson (3,878) also passed Jerome Bettis (3,734) for 20th on the Rams' all-time scrimmage yards list.

ROOKIE RUNNER

RB Brian Leonard, the Rams' second-round draft pick in 2007, started his first NFL game last week at Dallas.

Leonard rushed for 58 yards on 16 attempts (3.6 avg.). His first NFL carry came in Week 3 against Tampa Bay, a 6-yard run in the beginning of the second quarter. Leonard picked up the Rams' only fourth-down conversion of the season against the Buccaneers on a 2-yard run in the second quarter. On the season he has 20 carries for 79 yards (4.0 avg.) and six receptions for 41 yards (6.8 avg.).

Leonard, from Rutgers University, was selected by the Rams in the second round of the 2007 Draft with the 52nd overall pick.

Hanifan became head coach of the Cardinals, leading them from 1980-85 and later returned to coach the Rams offensive line from 1997-2003 before retiring from coaching...**LB Raonall Smith** was born in Mesa, Ariz...**LB Will Witherspoon**, the son of a retired military officer, lived for a period of time in Arizona...**T Brandon Gorin** spent the 2006 season with the Arizona Cardinals after being traded from New England...**G Milford Brown** spent the 2006 season with the Cardinals playing in 13 games with 12 starts.

GIVE 'EM THE BOOT!

P Donnie Jones has been one of the best punters in the league through the first quarter of the season. Last week at Dallas, Jones punted eight times for a career-high 55.3-yard avg. with a career long 66-yarder, two touchbacks and four kicks inside the 20-yard line. His 55.3-yard avg. is the highest one-game average for a Rams' punter with a minimum of five punts since Jack Jacobs had a 55.8-yard average on Sept. 27, 1942 at Detroit.

Through four games this season, Jones has punted 20 times for a 49.6-yard average, second highest average in the league, only behind San Francisco Andy Lee's 49.7-yard average. His 40.9-yard net average ranks third in the NFL, while his eight kicks inside the 20-yard is tied for fourth most in the NFL.

GIVE ME THE BALL

In 2006, the Rams finished fourth in the NFC and seventh in the NFL with 32 take-aways (17 interceptions, 15 fumble recoveries). The Rams have six takeaways in 2007. Since 1995, their first season in St. Louis, the Rams have totaled 384 take-aways, the fourth-highest total in the NFL during that time. WR Isaac Bruce continues to build on his career numbers, catching one pass for 24 yards at Dallas last week. Bruce has 902 career receptions, only the seventh player in NFL history to catch at least 900 receptions.

In Week 3 at Tampa Bay, Bruce eclipsed the 900-reception mark in 186 games, third fastest to reach the mark behind Marvin Harrison (149) and Jerry Rice (168). In Week 2 against San Francisco, Bruce led the team with eight receptions for 145 yards.

Dollar-Help was awarded a 2007 Summit Creative Award for its Warmthgiving Weekend campaign, which called for children across the St. Louis area to host their own hot chocolate stands in order to raise money and awareness of Dollar-Help.

"Dollar-Help is helping to make sure that fewer people shiver in their homes [during winter] time," Witherspoon said. "Warmthgiving Weekend is a wonderful way for young people in our community to help share the warmth [during] winter."

Since 1982, Dollar-Help has raised and distributed more than \$14.5 million to help pay heating bills of all types in more than 48,644 households.

Rams' WRs Isaac Bruce and Torry Holt (1999-present) represent one pair, joining Pittsburgh's Lynn Swann and John Stallworth (1974-82), Miami's Mark Clayton and Mark Duper (1983-92), San Francisco's Jerry Rice and John Taylor (1987-95) and Denver's Rod Smith and Ed McCaffery (1995-2003).

The tandem of Bruce and Holt has proven to be one of the most effective long-term wide receiver pairs in NFL history, as Bruce and Holt have more receptions (1,325) and receiving yards (19,853) than any of the other four pairings.

SAFETY NET

Oshiomogho Atogwe and Corey Chavous have made big plays on defense through the first quarter of the season. Last week at Dallas, Chavous led the team for the second week in a row with 10 tackles (six solo), one pass defensed and 1.0 sack. The performance marked only the second time in Chavous' career that he has notched consecutive double-digit tackle games, the last time in 2004 for Minnesota (11 vs. NYG 10/31, 10 @ Ind. 11/8). Chavous collected his first sack of the season, third of his career, when sacking QB Tony Romo for an 8-yard loss in the first quarter, helping force the Cowboys to punt.

At Tampa Bay in Week 3, Chavous made a team-high 10 tackles (six solo) and finished second on the team in Week 2 against San Francisco with eight tackles (three solo). In Week 1, Chavous made eight tackles (five solo) and a forced fumble against Carolina.

Chavous leads the team with 36 tackles (20 solo), 1.0 sack, one pass defensed, and one forced fumble.

In his third year with the Rams, Atogwe has developed a knack for creating turnovers. At Dallas, Atogwe nabbed the team's first interception of the season, fifth of his career, when O.J. picked off Romo at the close of the first quarter and returned the pick 26 yards. Atogwe also finished tied for second on the team with eight tackles (five solo).

A week earlier at Tampa Bay, Atogwe got his first forced fumble and fumble recovery of the season after stripping RB Carnell Williams and recovering the fumble. In 2006, Atogwe tied for the team lead with a career best six forced fumbles. In the season opener against Carolina, Atogwe led the team with a career-high 10 tackles (nine solo).

Atogwe ranks third of the team with 28 tackles (21 solo), one interception, one pass defensed, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

BIG GAME T. HOLT

For the third time in four games, WR Torry Holt has led the team in receptions. At Dallas in Week 4, Holt made five receptions for 52 yards with a long of 18 yards. This season, Holt is fifth in the NFC in receptions with 23.

In Week 3 at Tampa Bay, Holt led all receivers with five receptions for 63 yards and against San Francisco in Week 2, Holt was second with five receptions for a season-high 74 yards. In the season opener against Carolina, Torry had a season-high eight receptions for 73 yards and one touchdown.

With nine receptions for 93 yards and two touchdowns on third-down in 2007, Holt leads in the NFC and is tied for third in the NFL.

In two meetings with the Cardinals last season, Holt made 15 catches for 235 yards and two touchdowns. Holt has played the Cardinals eight times and has notched 57 receptions for 818 yards (102.3 yards per game avg.) and four touchdowns.

For his career, Holt ranks 20th on the NFL's all-time receiving yards list with 10,937, and his 735 career receptions is 25 most in the league's history.

OFFENSE

QUARTERBACKS (2) – Doug Nussmeier

Marc Bulger (7), Gus Frerotte (14)

Two-time Pro Bowler Marc Bulger starts at QB for the Rams. Bulger comes off of a career-year in 2006 and is the Rams' second-leading passer in team history, totalling over 16,000 yards. In 2007, Bulger has completed 74-of-133 passing attempts for 765 yards with two touchdowns and four interceptions for a 64.9 passer rating. In Week 2 vs. San Francisco 9/16, Bulger totaled 368 passing yards, which stands as the fifth-highest passing yardage total in the NFL in the young season. Backing up Bulger, is 14-year veteran **Gus Frerotte**. Frerotte provides valuable experience and is familiar with coach Scott Linehan's offensive system, after spending time with Linehan while he was the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Minnesota (2003-04) and Miami (2005). Frerotte saw his first playing time of the season in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, completing three-of-six passes for 29 yards.

RUNNING BACKS (4) – Wayne Moses

Steven Jackson (4), Brian Leonard (R), Travis Minor (7), Richard Owens (4), Antonio Pittman (R)

Pro Bowler **Steven Jackson** serves as the Rams feature back. In Week 3 vs. Tampa Bay 9/23 Jackson posted his first 100-yard rushing performance of the year, rushing 30 times for 115 yards. Jackson leads the Rams in 2007, with 233 rushing yards on 69 carries. Jackson will miss his second consecutive game after suffering a groin injury vs. Tampa Bay. Rams 2007 second-round draft pick **Brian Leonard**, replaces Jackson in the starting lineup. In his first NFL start in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, Leonard rushed 16 times for 58 yards. The former All-America honoree from Rutgers has made contributions in 2007 as a rusher and as a receiver out of the backfield, rushing 20 times for 79 yards and gaining 36 yards on six receptions. **Travis Minor** joined the Rams in the offseason after spending the previous six seasons with Miami. Minor provides added depth and valuable contributions on special teams. Minor received his first carry of the season in Week 2 vs. San Francisco 9/16, gaining four yards. Minor is tied for second on the squad with three special teams tackles. Rookie Antonio Pittman, joined the Rams on a waiver claim 9/2 after being waived by the New Orleans Saints during final roster cuts, but was a gameday inactive in each of the first three weeks of the season and did not play at Dallas. Pittman, a fourth-round draft choice of the Saints out of Ohio State, ranks eighth on the Buckeyes' all-time rushing list despite playing only three seasons.

FB Richard Owens joined the Rams after being signed as a free agent 9/12. Owens, a four-year veteran, was waived by Minnesota during final roster cuts and saw his first action as a Ram at Tampa Bay. At Dallas, Owens notched one special teams tackle.

WIDE RECEIVERS (6) – Henry Ellard

Drew Bennett (7), Isaac Bruce (14), Marques Hagans (1), Dante Hall (8), Torry Holt (9), Dane Looker (7)

The Rams' receiving corps is led by **Torry Holt** and **Isaac Bruce**, two of the best wide receivers in the NFL. Holt and Bruce are one of only five pairs of wide receivers who have played together for nine or more seasons in the Super Bowl era. The pair has totaled 1,325 receptions and 19,853 receiving yards with 117 touchdowns since their first season together in 1999. Holt leads the Rams this season with 23 receptions and 262 yards with two touchdowns while Bruce has added 15 receptions for 203 yards, including posting eight receptions for 145 yards in Week 2 vs. San Francisco 9/16. With his three receptions in Week 3 at Tampa Bay 9/23, Bruce surpassed 900 receptions during his career and reached the milestone in only 186 games, becoming the third-fastest player to reach the mark in NFL history. After spending the past six seasons with the Tennessee Titans, **Drew Bennett** joins the Rams after signing as a free agent in the offseason. Bennett made his debut for the Rams in Week 2 vs. San Francisco, posting three catches for 42 yards. Bennett was deactivated for the season opening contest vs. Carolina 9/9 after suffering a thigh injury in practice. Joining Bennett as a new addition to the Rams receiving corps is former Kansas City Chief **Dante Hall**. One of the most dynamic return men in NFL history, Hall entered 2007 with 11 return touchdowns, good for third in NFL history. Hall proved his worth quickly in the 2007, returning the opening kickoff of the second half vs. Carolina for 84 yards. Hall produced his first kick return touchdown as a Ram in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, taking a Mat McBriar punt back 85 yards for a touchdown. Hall is tied for second in NFL history with 12 total kick return touchdowns (six kickoff returns, six punt returns). **Dane Looker** is in his fifth year with the Rams and is an important backup at the receiver position and critical on special teams, serving as the holder for K Jeff Wilkins. Looker saw action on offense vs. Carolina 9/9, catching two passes for 10 yards. Second-year receiver **Marques Hagans** joined the Rams' 53-man roster this season after spending the 2006 campaign as a member of the practice squad. Hagans, selected by the Rams in the fifth round of the 2006 NFL Draft, is a former college quarterback and also serves as the team's emergency signal-caller.

TIGHT ENDS (4) – Judd Garrett

Randy McMichael starts at tight end for the Rams, after joining the team as a free agent in the offseason from Miami. McMichael spent five seasons with the Dolphins, one of which was spent under the tutelage of then Dolphins offensive coordinator Scott Linehan. McMichael is a receiving threat and an effective blocker from the tight end position. In 2007, McMichael has made nine receptions for 101 yards, including a two-catch 40-yard performance in Week 2 vs. San Francisco 9/16. A pair of second-year tight ends, **Joe Klopfenstein** and **Dominique Byrd**, join fifth-year player, **Aaron Walker**, to provide depth at the position.

Starting **LT Orlando Pace** and starting **LG Mark Setterstrom** are out for the season and **Adam Goldberg**, who had been serving as the Rams' starting RT in the last two games, suffered a knee injury in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30 and will miss some time. Pace suffered a shoulder injury in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9 and Setterstrom injured his knee during the Rams' Week 3 matchup at Tampa Bay 9/23. **Pace**, a former No. 1 overall pick, had his streak of seven consecutive Pro Bowls snapped last year after his season was derailed by a torn triceps. After four games, the Rams have used eight different offensive line combinations. **Alex Barron**, a third-year veteran, moves to the left side of the line and serves as the team's starting left tackle in place of the injured Pace. Barron, returns to the position for his most extensive action since he was a senior at Florida State University. **Brett Romberg** serves as the Rams' starting center after winning the job in training camp, the first time in his career that he has been named a full-time starter. **Milford Brown** joined the Rams in training camp to provide depth, but was pushed into service in Week 1 vs. Carolina after Incognito was unable to play. Brown switched positions again after the loss of Pace. With Barron moving to left tackle, Brown took Barron's place on the right side of the line in Week 2 vs. San Francisco. At Tampa Bay, Brown served as a reserve, but was called upon at LG after the injury to Setterstrom. Veteran center **Andy McCollum** returns for his 14th NFL season and is a valuable backup. **Claude Terrell** provides added depth at the guard position,

and started at right guard for the Rams vs. San Francisco and at Tampa Bay in place of Incognito and started at left guard at Dallas after the loss of Setterstrom.

DEFENSIVE LINE (8) – Brian Baker, Mike Cox

Victor Adeyanju (2), Adam Carriker (R), La'Roi Glover (12), James Hall (8), Trevor Johnson (4), Louis Leonard (R), Leonard Little (10), Clifton Ryan (R).

DE Leonard Little, the Rams' all-time leader in sacks since the statistic was made official in 1982, starts at right defensive end. Little ranks 11th among active players with 74.0 sacks. This season Little has totaled 15 tackles, tied for the team lead among defensive linemen. In Week 2 vs. San Francisco 9/16 Little notched six tackles. **DE James Hall** starts at left end for the Rams after joining the Rams in the offseason in a trade with Detroit. In his first game as a Ram in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9, Hall notched four total tackles, including one tackle for loss. Hall leads Rams' defensive linemen with 18 takedowns. **DT La'Roi Glover** and **DT Adam Carriker** start along the inside of the Rams' defensive line. Glover, who is in his 12th season, stands 10th among active players with 77 sacks. Glover has 15 tackles through the first four games of the 2007 season. Carriker, the Rams' 2007 first-round draft pick is playing nose tackle after a standout career at defensive end for Nebraska. In his debut vs. Carolina, Carriker notched three assisted tackles and has four total tackles on the year. **DT Clifton Ryan** has been called upon to give the Rams' significant playing time after second-year player DT Claude Wroten was suspended for four games and will be unable to play until the Rams' contest at Baltimore 10/14. Ryan proved to be ready to contribute as he saw increased action in the Week 2 matchup vs. San Francisco. Ryan, led the Rams' defensive linemen with eight total tackles including two sacks and also caused a fumble by 49ers QB Alex Smith, which he recovered himself. Ryan became the first Rams' rookie since Sean Gilber in 1992 to record two sacks in a game. **DE Victor Adeyanju** had a promising rookie season in 2006, and provides important depth on the defensive line. Adeyanju was unable to get onto the field in the season opener vs. Carolina, being declared inactive after suffering an ankle injury in practice, but has returned to see action. **DE Trevor Johnson** also provides depth at the defensive end position for the Rams. Johnson, who has made three tackles in 2007, joined the Rams in the offseason after splitting time between the New York Jets and New Orleans in 2006. In Week 3 at Tampa Bay, Johnson recorded his first sack of the season, dropping Tampa QB Jeff Garcia for an 11-yard loss. **DT Louis Leonard**, a rookie from Fresno State, was added to the Rams active roster from San Diego's practice squad 9/12.

LINEBACKERS (7) – Rick Venturi

Brandon Chillar (4), Quinton Culberson (R), Chris Draft (9), Tim McGarigle (1), Raonall Smith (6), Pisa Tinoisamoa (5), Will Witherspoon (6)

Six-year veteran **Will Witherspoon** starts at middle linebacker for the Rams and ranks second on the team with 34 tackles in 2007. Witherspoon started fast this season, totaling eight tackles, one pass defended and one fumble recovery in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9 and added 11 total tackles in Week 2 vs. San Francisco. Witherspoon led the team in tackles in 2006, his first season with the team. Starting at strongside linebacker, **Brandon Chillar** had seven tackles, one forced fumble and a fumble recovery in the Rams' season opener vs. Carolina and posted a season-high eight tackles in Week 3 at Tampa Bay 9/23. Chillar's 23 tackles on the year, rank fourth on the team. Chillar also sees action on special teams and is tied for fourth place on the team with two special teams tackles. **Pisa Tinoisamoa**, starts at weakside linebacker and has three tackles in 2007, all of which he notched in the season-opener vs. Carolina. Tinoisamoa missed the Week 2 matchup vs. San Francisco and the Week 3 contest at Tampa Bay with an ankle injury. Tinoisamo returned to action in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, making nine total tackles. The Rams acquired free agent **Chris Draft** in the offseason, and the nine-year veteran from Stanford, is an important backup and special teams player, with the ability to be a starter. Draft has five total tackles in 2007 and started at weakside linebacker vs. San Francisco and at Tampa Bay in place of Tinoisamo. Draft made three total tackles on defense and adding one tackle on special teams vs. San Francisco and six tackles at Tampa Bay. **Raonall Smith** is a valuable asset on special teams and provides depth at linebacker. In the 2007 season opener vs. Carolina, Smith notched two special teams tackles and added one special teams tackle vs. San Francisco. He is tied for second on the squad with three special teams tackles. 2006 seventh-round draft choice **Tim McGarigle** spent last season on the Rams' practice squad, but has found a home on the team's active roster this season despite being slowed by a hamstring injury in the preseason. McGarigle serves as a backup linebacker and is an important special teams player. Undrafted rookie free agent **Quinton Culberson** from Mississippi State rounds out the linebacking corps. Culberson was inactive in the season-opener, but saw his first NFL action in Week 2 vs. San Francisco, notching two special teams tackles and earning Special Teams Player of the Week from the team's coaches.

SECONDARY (9) – Willy Robinson, Ron Milus

Oshiomogho Atogwe (3), Ron Bartell (3), Fakhir Brown (8) Jerome Carter (3), Corey Chavous (10), Tye Hill (2), Todd Johnson (5), Jonathan Wade (R), Lenny Walls (6)

S Corey Chavous, a 10-year veteran, starts at strong safe-

ty for the Rams and provides valuable leadership for a secondary that features only three other players with five or more years of experience. Chavous is ranks first on the team with 36 total tackles and notched eight total tackles in each of the Rams first two games. In Week 3 at Tampa Bay 9/23 Chavous led the team with 10 tackles including six solo stops. Chavous posted his second consecutive game with 10 tackles in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, leading the team. Starting free safety **S Oshiomogho Atogwe** got off to a fast start in 2007, leading the team in tackles with 10 in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9. Atogwe's 28 tackles are third on the team in 2007. Atogwe, who has shown a propensity for making big plays, recorded his first forced fumble and fumble recovery of the season at Tampa Bay. He continued his strong play at Dallas, notching eight tackles and intercepting a Tony Romo pass, returning it 31 yards. **CB Ron Bartell**, starts at cornerback. Bartell, who began the year in the starting lineup after a suspension to Fakhir Brown, has impressed notching 22 tackles including 1.0 sack in 2007. **Brown** returns from his four-game suspension this week vs. Arizona and will be in the starting lineup immediately. **CB Tye Hill**, a second-year player out of Clemson, is a Rams regular starter at cornerback, but has missed the last three games due to a back injury that was suffered in practice prior to the Week 2 contest vs. San Francisco. Hill made six tackles in the Rams season-opener vs. Carolina. **CB Lenny Walls** has started in Hill's place vs. San Francisco, at Tampa Bay and at Dallas. Walls has nine tackles and one pass defended in 2007. **S Jerome Carter** serves as a backup safety and sees action on special teams. Carter posted his first special teams tackle of the year vs. San Francisco. **S Todd Johnson**, aquired in the offseason as a free agent, provides valuable experience and is a standout on special teams. In Week 1 vs. Carolina, Johnson shared the Rams' special teams Player of the Week honors with LB Brandon Chillar after Johnson notched two special teams tackles. Johnson's five special teams tackles rank first on the team. 2007 third-round pick **CB Jonathan Wade** out of Tennessee, where *Associated Press* All-Southeastern Conference honors, contributes as a backup in the secondary this season and is a gunner on the Rams' punt coverage teams. Wade saw extensive action vs. San Francisco, at Tampa Bay and at Dallas as the team's nickelback after the injury to Hill moved Walls into the starting lineup.

SPECIAL TEAMS (3) – Al Roberts, Todd Downing

Donnie Jones (4), Chris Massey (6), Jeff Wilkins (14)

K Jeff Wilkins, a 14-year veteran, has converted on six-of-10 field goal attempts this season. Wilkins has been successful on all three of his PAT attempts this season and continues his streak of 349 consecutive PATs, which stands as a Rams' franchise-record and ranks second in NFL history behind Jason Elam's streak of 371 consecutive extra point conversions from 1993-2002. Wilkins has converted 289

career field goals, which stands as the Rams' all-time mark and his 1,147 points make him the Rams' all-time scoring leader. **LS Chris Massey**, one of the most consistent players at his position, continues long snapping duties, while **P Donnie Jones** plays his first season with the Rams after spending 2006 in Miami. Jones has been one of the best punters in the league through the first quarter of the season. In Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, Jones punted eight times for a career-high 55.3-yard avg. with a career long 66-yarder. His 55.3-yard avg. is the highest one-game average for a Rams' punter with a minimum of five punts since Jack Jacobs had a 55.8-yard average on Sept. 27, 1942 at Detroit. Through four games this season, Jones has punted 20 times for a 49.6-yard average, second highest average in the league, only behind San Francisco Andy Lee's 49.7-yard average. His 40.9-yard net average ranks third in the NFL, while his eight kicks inside the 20-yard is tied for fourth most in the NFL.
