BIG GAME + A BIG GAME = 11,000

On a 26-yard reception in the fourth quarter against Arizona last week, WR Torry Holt surpassed the 11,000-receiving yard mark for his career, ranking Holt 20th on the NFL's all-time receiving yards list. Holt reached the 11,000-yard mark, more than six miles of receiving yards, in 131 games, the fastest of any player in league history. Holt led the team with 89 receiving yards off five receptions, with one touchdown.

This season, Holt has led the team in receiving yards in four of five games and has scored three touchdowns.

In 2006 in Week 6 vs. Seattle, Holt caught eight passes for 154 yards and three touchdowns to become the fastest player in NFL history to reach 10,000 receiving yards.

In 2003, Holt collected ten 100-yard receiving games, breaking WR Isaac Bruce's 1995 franchise record (nine) for most 100-yard receiving games in one season, and tied for second most on the NFL's all-time list.

Since 2000, one year after Holt entered the league, he has 10,238 receiving yards, more than any other player in league. From 2000-2005, he had at least 1,300 receiving yards in each season, the first player in NFL history with six consecutive 1,300-yard receiving seasons.

Holt has the most receiving yards (10,675) in a player's first eight seasons in NFL history and has the second most 100-yard receiving games in a player's first eight seasons (43). In Super Bowl XXXIV against Tennessee,

Holt set a rookie record with 109 receiving yards and one touchdown.

Holt ranks second in franchise history in receiving yards, only behind teammate Bruce (13,579).

THIS WEEK

The Rams travel to Baltimore this week to take on the Ravens at M&T Bank Stadium.

The meeting will mark only the fourth time the Rams have faced the Ravens and it will be the first time the Rams have traveled to Baltimore since 1996. The Rams and Ravens last played in 2003, with the Rams defeating the Ravens, 33-22, at the Edward Jones Dome.

The Rams lead the all-time series against the Ravens, 2-1 and have won two consecutive games versus Baltimore. The Rams have outscored the Ravens 91-69 in the three previous meetings.

LAST WEEK

Edward Jones Dome, October 7, 2007 (61,788) – In a matchup of NFC West rivals, the Rams faced off against the visiting Arizona Cardinals, falling by a final score of 34-31. QB Gus Frerotte made his first start as a Ram, completing 24 of 43 pass attempts for 262 yards and three touchdowns. RB Brian Leonard recorded the first 100-yard game of his career, rushing 18 times for 102 yards in addition to 33 receiving yards on five catches. WR Torry Holt topped 11,000 career receiving yards in just 131 games, reaching that mark faster than any player in NFL history. P Donnie Jones punted four times for a 56.0-yard average, a new single-game team record. CB Fakhir Brown returned from suspension to record eight tackles, adding two interceptions and four passes defensed, both of which were career highs. Rookie NT Adam Carriker recorded the first blocked kick of his career and the first Rams blocked kick since 2003. WR Drew Bennett and TE Randy McMichael both recorded their first touchdown as members of the Rams. LB Pisa Tinoisamoa led the team with 15 total tackles, the most since he had 18 as a rookie.

THE HEAD COACHES

SCOTT LINEHAN (2nd season as head coach, 2nd with Rams; Career Record: 8-13) – Named twenty-second head coach in franchise history by Owner/Chairman Georgia Frontiere on January 19, 2006. Linehan rallied the Rams to an 8-8 finish in his first season. Quarterback Marc Bulger enjoyed the best season of his career, including 4,301 yards passing and 24 touchdowns. Balancing the offensive attack, Linehan guided Steven Jackson to lead the league with 2,334 combined yards, and set a Rams running back record with 90 catches. Prior to joining the Rams, Linehan was the offensive coordinator of the Miami Dolphins; the Dolphins improved from 29th in 2004 to 14th in total offensive in 2005. Linehan spent three seasons (2002-2004) as offensive coordinator for the Minnesota Vikings. In 2004, Daunte Culpepper posted the fourth-highest single season passer rating in NFL history (110.9). A college quarterback, Linehan was a free agent signee with the Dallas Cowboys before a shoulder injury ended his active career.

BRIAN BILLICK (9th season as head coach, 9th with Baltimore; Career Record: 83-58) – Entering his ninth season with the Baltimore Ravens, Brian Billick is tied for third in longevity with one team in the NFL. Billick, Philadelphia's Andy Reid and Seattle's Mike Holmgren trail only Tennessee's Jeff Fisher (13) and Denver's Mike Shanahan (12). For the second time in their history, the Ravens won the AFC North in 2006 with a franchise-best 13-3 record. Baltimore's elite defense was No. 1 in the NFL and boasted six Pro Bowl players (team had seven in total). Billick led the Ravens to the Super Bowl XXXV title in 2000. Baltimore defeated the New York Giants, 34-7, on January 28, 2001. During that season, Billick's Ravens allowed the fewest points in NFL history (165) in a 16-game season and also became the first team since 1978 to allow fewer than 1,000 rushing yards (970) in a regular season. His teams made the playoffs in 2000 (Super Bowl XXXV champions), 2001 (lost in Divisional playoff to the AFC champion Steelers), and 2003 (lost to Titans in Wild Card playoff). Prior to becoming the Ravens' head coach, Billick spent five years as Minnesota's offensive coordinator, where in 1998, the Vikings' offense scored an NFL single-season record 556 points. Billick was named the second head coach in Ravens history on January 19, 1999.

THE LAST TIME

Edward Jones Dome, November 9, 2003 (66,085) –

The Rams defeated the Baltimore Ravens, 33-22, improving their record to 6-3, tying them for first place in the NFC West. K Jeff Wilkins made field goals of 49, 48, 46 and 27 yards, setting an NFL record for most field goals made in a quarter. At the beginning of the first quarter, CB Jerametrious Butler intercepted a QB Kyle Boller pass on third down, returning it 45 yards. The Rams capitalized off the turnover, driving 36 yards in four plays, resulting in a five-yard TD run by RB Marshall Faulk to give the Rams an early lead, 7-0. On the Ravens' ensuing possession, the Rams defense forced a three and out, where a P David Zastudil punt took a Rams' bounce that WR Dane Looker returned for 44 yards to Baltimore's one-yard line. The following play, Faulk ran for a one-yard touchdown to extend the lead, 14-0. CB DeJuan Groce fumbled a Zastudil punt that was recovered by Baltimore S Jerome Sapp for no return, giving the Ravens possession at the Rams'15-yard line. In four plays, the Ravens offense set K Matt Stover up for a 41-yard field goal to narrow the margin, 14-3. With 1:01 into the second quarter, Boller ushered an eight-play, 26-yard drive resulting in a K Matt Stover 25-yard field goal to narrow the lead, 14-6. On Baltimore's next possession, Boller drove the Ravens 45 yards in five plays, resulting in a RB Jamal Lewis two-yard TD run to narrow the margin, 14-12. With 5:21 left in the first half, S Adam Archuleta sacked, forced and recovered a Boller fumble, returning it 45 yards for a touchdown, extending the lead, 21-12. Early in the third quarter, Baltimore S Chad Williams recovered a Groce muffed return, giving the Ravens possession at the Rams 28-yard line. In four plays, the Ravens set Stover up for a 41-yard field goal to give the Ravens their first lead of the game, 22-21. At the beginning of the fourth quarter, Bulger engineered a seven-play, 32-yard drive that resulted in a 49-yard goal by Wilkins to take the lead back, 24-22. After LB Tommy Polley intercepted a QB Chris Redman pass, Bulger completed two passes to set Wilkins up for a 46-yard field goal to further the margin, 27-22. LB Pisa Tinoisamoa forced a Lewis fumble, recovered by DT Brian Young for no gain. Young recovered three fumbles, tying the NFL single-game record and tying the franchise season record with five. Faulk ran three times for nine yards, setting Wilkins up for a 48-yard field goal to extend the lead, 30-22. With 3:39 left in the contest, Bulger engineered a seven-play, 26-yard drive that was capped off by a 27-yard Wilkins field goal, resulting in the final margin. 33-22.

Baker later attended and played for the University of Maryland from 1981-83 before beginning his coaching career with the Terrapins, coaching outside linebackers from 1984-85...Director of Football Operations **Samir Suleiman** was born in Washington, D.C. and later earned a degree in Sport Management from James Madison University (Harrisonburg, Va.)...**Tom Guthrie**, director of entertainment, attended Virginia Commonwealth University (Richmond, Va.)...Newly signed **S Bhawoh Jue** played running back and defensive back for Chantilly HS (Chantilly, Va.) where he earned USA Today All-American and Associated Press All-State after leading the Chargers to an AAA State Championship as a senior...**WR Marcus Hagans** grew up in Hampton, Va. and later attended the University of Virginia (Charlottesville, Va.) where, as a two-year starter at quarterback, finished in the top five of virtually every quarterback category for the Cavaliers...**WR Dominique Thompson** (practice squad) played collegiately for Williams & Mary (Williamsburg, Va.) where he earned NCAA Division I-AA All-America second team honors.

RAVENS – **Jeff Friday**, strength and conditioning coach, earned his master's degree from Illinois State University, and was the assistant strength and conditioning coach there from 1990-91...**Dennis Thurman**, defensive backs coach, played safety for the St. Louis football Cardinals in 1986...**Vince Newsome**, pro personnel, played safety for the Los Angeles Rams from 1983-90 after being selected by the club in the fourth round (97th overall) of the 1983 NFL Draft...**Kevin Byrne**, VP of Public and Community Relations, was the sports information director for the University of Missouri-St. Louis from 1972-73, was the public relations director for the St. Louis football Cardinals from 1977-78, and remained in St. Louis to become the director of public affairs for Trans World Airlines from 1979-80...**LB Bart Scott** played collegiately at Southern Illinois (Carbondale, Ill.)...Director of Player Development **O.J. Brigance** played linebacker for the Rams from 2001-02...**Jeff Goering**, chief financial officer, graduated from Rockhurst University (Kansas City, Mo.) where he was a varsity basketball player and later worked for Ernst & Young in Kansas City, Mo. as an audit senior...**CB Corey Ivy** was born in St. Louis and spent the 2005 season with the Rams, starting in five games and posting a career-high 57 tackles...Ravens offensive coordinator **Rick Neuheisel** and Rams running backs coach Wayne Moses coached the wide receivers and running backs, respectively, at UCLA from 1990-93 and later coached together again in 1999 and 2000 for the Washington Huskies where Neuheisel was head coach...**WR Derrick Mason**, **QB Steve McNair** and **CB Samari Rolle** teamed up with Rams **WR Drew Bennett** for the Tennessee Titans from 2001-04...**LB Edgar Jones** signed with the Ravens as a rookie free agent this season after playing collegiately at Southeast Missouri St. (Cape Girardeau, Mo.)

A PUNTING JONES

P Donnie Jones leads the NFL after five games with a 50.6 punting average. Against Arizona in Week 5, Jones notched four punts for a 56.0 average with a long of 60. His 56.0 gross average was the best in franchise history, eclipsing the mark that he set a week earlier where he punted eight times for a then career-high 55.3-yard average with a career long of 66 yards, two touchbacks and for kicks inside the 20-yard line at Dallas in Week 4.

This season, Jones also ranks second in the NFC, third in the NFL with a 41.9 net punting average. His eight kicks inside the 20-yard line are tied for sixth most in the NFL.

X-FACTOR

WR/KR Dante Hall continues to be one of the best kick returners to ever play the game. This season, Hall ranks second in the NFC, third in the NFL in punt return average (15.1). He also ranks fifth in the NFC in kickoff return average (25.2). Against Arizona last week, Hall returned two punts for a 23.5-yard average with a long of 36 yards. He also had four kickoff returns for a 26.3-yard average with a long of 29 yards.

At Dallas in Week 4, Hall returned a punt 85 yards for a touchdown, the longest punt return in the NFL this season, and his sixth-career punt return for a touchdown, most among active players. It also was his 12th-career touchdown return, tied for second most in NFL history.

In the season opener against Carolina, Hall returned the opening kickoff of the second half 82 yards, the sixth longest kickoff return in NFL this season.

ST. LOUIS RAMS PLAYERS UNVEIL \$25,000 RAMS FITNESS ZONE CREATED TO GET KIDS FIT

--Unveiling was part of Hometown Huddle, the NFL's national day of community service and effort to get kids active--

As part of this year's Hometown Huddle, the St. Louis Rams and United Way of Greater St. Louis partnered with the Healthy Youth Partnership to promote healthy exercise activities and diet habits in order to reduce and prevent youth obesity.

Tuesday's activities focused on Rams players leading a demonstration of the Rams Fitness Zone including an interactive workout powered by HOPSports, a company that uses cutting-edge technology to train people ranging from elementary students to professional athletes. The Rams Fitness Zone, which is located at the Wohl Recreation Center on North Kingshighway, was a gift from the Rams and something that the kids will be able to use on a daily basis moving forward. Participating in the Hometown Huddle were 100 elementary school students and several Rams' players including Chris Draft and Adam Carriker.

Introduced in 1999, Hometown Huddle is a day for NFL players from all 32 teams come together and participate in various community service activities through their local United Way partners. WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?

Fakhir means "superb" in Arabic. That is what CB Fakhir Brown was in his first game of the season against Arizona last week.

Brown made his presence known immediately, leading the secondary with eight solo tackles, two interceptions and a career-high four passes defended. Brown recorded a career-high two interceptions for 12 yards. His two picks led the NFL in Week 5 and marked first time a Ram had multiple interceptions in a game since CB Ron Bartell tallied two against Minnesota (12/31/06).

Brown's first interception came during the first series of the game when he picked off QB Matt Leinart's pass and returned it 12 yards. The interception led to a 46-yard field goal by K Jeff Wilkins to give the Rams an early 3-0 lead. The interception was Brown's first since last season at Oakland (12/17/06).

His second interception occurred in the third quarter when Brown intercepted QB Kurt Warner in the endzone, halting the Arizona scoring drive. The picks mark the seventh and eighth of his career.

HOLT vs. MASON

In 2003, WR Torry Holt earned his second NFC Pro Bowl berth after making 117 receptions for 1,696 yards and 12 touchdowns. That same season, WR Derrick Mason, then of the Tennessee Titans, earned Pro Bowl honors for the second time, and for the first time as wide receiver after catching 95 passes for 1,303 yards with eight touchdowns.

Since that season, Holt and Mason have been two of the most productive receivers in the NFL. Holt leads all receivers since 2003 with 434 receptions, while Mason is third during that time period with 389 catches. Holt also ranks first since 2003, with 5,938 receiving yards. Mason is seventh in the NFL in receiving yards since 2003, with 4,666 yards.

Leonard has seen action in all five games this season, rushing 38 times for 181 yards, while ranking fourth on the team with 12 catches for 75 yards.

The performance marks the first time Frerotte has thrown three touchdowns in one game since he threw for four touchdowns against San Francisco while with Minnesota (9/28/03).

Two-time Pro Bowler Marc Bulger starts at QB for the Rams. In 2007, Bulger has completed 74-of-133 passing attempts for 765 yards with two touchdowns and four interceptions for a 64.9 passer rating. In Week 2 vs. San Francisco 9/16, Bulger totaled 368 passing yards, which stands as the fifth-highest passing yardage total in the NFL in the young season. Backing up Bulger, is 14-year veteran **Gus Frerotte**. Frerotte provides valuable experience and is familiar with coach Scott Linehan's offensive system, after spending time with Linehan while he was the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Minnesota (2003-04) and Miami (2005). Frerotte started in Week 5 vs. Arizona 10/7 in place of Bulger who has been banged up this season. In his first start, Frerotte completed 24-of-43 passes for 262 yards with three touchdowns and three interceptions. Pro Bowler **Steven Jackson** serves as the Rams feature back. In Week 3 vs. Tampa Bay 9/23 Jackson posted his first 100-yard rushing performance of the year, rushing 30 times for 115 yards. Jackson leads the Rams in 2007, with 233 rushing yards on 69 carries. Jackson will miss his third consecutive game after suffering a groin injury vs. Tampa Bay. Rams 2007 second-round draft pick **Brian Leonard**, replaces Jackson in the starting lineup. In his second start of his young NFL career in Week 5 vs. Arizona 10/7, Leonard rushed for 102 yards on 18 carries, the first 100-yard rushing performance of his career.

Leonard also made five receptions for 33 yards. In his first NFL start in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, Leonard rushed 16 times for 58 yards. The former All-America honoree from Rutgers has made contributions in 2007 as a rusher and as a receiver out of the backfield, rushing 38 times for 181 yards and gaining 75 yards on 12 receptions. **Travis Minor** joined the Rams in the offseason after spending the previous six seasons with Miami. Minor provides added depth and valuable contributions on special teams. Minor received his first carry of the season in Week 2 vs. San Francisco 9/16, gaining four yards. Minor made three tackles on special teams vs. Arizona is tied for second on the squad with six special teams tackles. Rookie Antonio Pittman, joined the Rams on a waiver claim 9/2 after being waived by the New Orleans Saints during final roster cuts. Pittman made his NFL debut vs Arizona, playing on special teams. Pittman, a fourth-round draft choice of the Saints out of Ohio State, ranks eighth on the Buckeyes' all-time rushing list despite playing only three seasons. **FB Richard Owens** joined the Rams after being signed as a free agent 9/12. Owens, a four-year veteran, was waived by Minnesota during final roster cuts and saw his first action as a Ram at Tampa Bay.

WIDE RECEIVERS (6) – Henry Ellard

Drew Bennett (7), Isaac Bruce (14), Marques Hagans (1), Dante Hall (8), Torry Holt (9), Dane Looker (7)

The Rams' receiving corps is led by **Torry Holt** and **Isaac Bruce**, two of the best wide receivers in the NFL. Holt and Bruce are one of only five pairs of wide receivers who have played together for nine or more seasons in the Super Bowl era. The pair has totaled 1,330 receptions and 19,942 receiving yards with 118 touchdowns since their first season together in 1999. Holt leads the Rams this season with 28 receptions and 351 yards with three touchdowns. With a 26-yard reception on a Gus Frerotte pass in the fourth quarter of the Week 5 matchup vs. Arizona 10/7, Holt surpassed 11,000 career receiving yards, becoming the fastest player in NFL history to reach the milestone, accomplishing the feat in 131 games. Bruce has added 15 receptions for 203 yards, including

posting eight receptions for 145 yards in Week 2 vs. San Francisco 9/16. With his three receptions in Week 3 at Tampa Bay 9/23, Bruce surpassed 900 receptions during his career and reached the milestone in only 186 games, becoming the third-fastest player to reach the mark in NFL history. After spending the past six seasons with the Tennessee Titans, **Drew Bennett** joins the Rams after signing as a free agent in the offseason. Bennett made his first start as a Ram vs. Arizona, catching two passes for 32 yards including a 16-yard touchdown pass. Bennett made his debut for the Rams in Week 2 vs. San Francisco, posting three catches for 42 yards. Bennett was deactivated for the season opening contest vs. Carolina 9/9 after suffering a thigh injury in practice. Joining Bennett as a new addition to the Rams receiving corps is former Kansas City Chief **Dante Hall**. One of the most dynamic return men in NFL history, Hall entered 2007 with 11 return touchdowns, good for third in NFL history. Hall proved his worth quickly in the 2007, returning the opening kickoff of the second half vs. Carolina for 84 yards. Hall produced his first kick return touchdown as a Ram in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, taking a Mat McBriar punt back 85 yards for a touchdown. Hall is tied for second in NFL history with 12 total kick return touchdowns (six kickoff returns, six punt returns). **Dane Looker** is in his fifth year with the Rams and is an important backup at the receiver position and critical on special teams, serving as the holder for K Jeff Wilkins. Looker saw action on offense vs. Carolina 9/9, catching two passes for 10 yards. Second-year receiver **Marques Hagans** joined the Rams' 53-man roster this season after spending the 2006 campaign as a member of the practice squad. Hagans, selected by the Rams in the fifth round of the 2006 NFL Draft, is a former college quarterback and also serves as the team's emergency signal-caller. Hagans made his NFL debut vs. Arizona, entering the game in place of Dante Hall who left the game with an ankle injury. Hagans returned one kickoff for 20 yards and also caught one pass for 11 yards.

TIGHT ENDS (4) – Judd Garrett

Dominique Byrd (2), Joe Klopfenstein (2), Randy McMichael (6), Aaron Walker (5)

Randy McMichael starts at tight end for the Rams, after joining the team as a free agent in the offseason from Miami. McMichael spent five seasons with the Dolphins, one of which was spent under the tutelage of then Dolphins offensive coordinator Scott Linehan. McMichael is a receiving threat and an effective blocker from the tight end position. In Week 5 vs. Arizona 10/7, McMichael scored his first touchdown as a Ram on a 29-yard reception in the fourth quarter. In 2007, McMichael has made 12 receptions for 146 yards and one touchdown. A pair of second-year tight ends, **Joe Klopfenstein** and **Dominique Byrd**, join fifth-year player, **Aaron Walker**, to provide

depth at the position. Klopfenstein has made four starts this season, as the Rams have opened many contests in two-tight end sets. Walker made his first start of the season vs. Arizona.

OFFENSIVE LINE (9) – Paul Boudreau, Jim Chaney

Alex Barron (3), Milford Brown (6), Brandon Gorin (7), Richie Incognito (3), Nick Leckey (4), Andy McCollum (14), Jeremy Parquet (3), Brett Romberg (4), Claude Terrell (3)

Due to injuries, the Rams' offensive line has undergone shuffling throughout the first three games of the 2007 season. Starting **RG Richie Incognito** missed the first four games of the season due to an ankle injury, before returning to action in Week 5 vs. Arizona 10/7. Starting **LT Orlando Pace**, starting **LG Mark Setterstrom** and **Adam Goldberg**, who had been serving as the Rams' starting RT in the last two games, have all been lost for the season. Pace suffered a shoulder injury in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9 and Setterstrom injured his knee during the Rams' Week 3 matchup at Tampa Bay 9/23. **Pace**, a former No. 1 overall pick, had his streak of seven consecutive Pro Bowls snapped last year after his season was derailed by a torn triceps. After four games, the Rams have used eight different offensive line combinations. **Alex Barron**, a third-year veteran, moves to the left side of the line and serves as the team's starting left tackle in place of the injured Pace. Barron, returns to the position for his most extensive action since he was a senior at Florida State University. **Brett Romberg** serves as the Rams' starting center after winning the job in training camp, the first time in his career that he has been named a full-time starter. **Milford Brown** joined the Rams in training camp to provide depth, but was pushed into service in Week 1 vs. Carolina after Incognito was unable to play. Brown switched positions again after the loss of Pace. With Barron moving to left tackle, Brown took Barron's place on the right side of the line in Week 2 vs. San Francisco. At Tampa Bay, Brown served as a reserve, but was called upon at LG after the injury to Setterstrom. Brown returned to the starting lineup at RT in Week 5 vs. Dallas 10/7. Veteran center **Andy McCollum** returns for his 14th NFL season and after serving as a valuable backup in the beginning of the year, McCollum has moved into the starting lineup at LG, a position he hasn't played extensively since the 2003 season. **Claude Terrell** provides added depth at the guard position, and started at right guard for the Rams vs. San Francisco and at Tampa Bay in place of Incognito and started at left guard at Dallas after the loss of Setterstrom. **T Jeremy Parquet** was signed by the Rams 9/26 and was with the Rams during the 2007 training camp. **C Nick Leckey**, who has also played G, was signed 10/6.

DEFENSE / SPECIAL TEAMS

DEFENSIVE LINE (7) – Brian Baker, Mike Cox

Victor Adeyanju (2), Adam Carriker (R), La'Roi Glover (12), James Hall (8), Trevor Johnson (4), Leonard Little (10), Clifton Ryan (R).

DE Leonard Little, the Rams' all-time leader in sacks since the statistic was made official in 1982, starts at left defensive end. Little ranks 11th among active players with 74.0 sacks. This season Little has totaled 19 tackles and six quarterback pressures, including four pressures in the Week 5 game vs. Arizona 10/7. **DE James Hall** starts at right end for the Rams after joining the Rams in the offseason in a trade with Detroit. In his first game as a Ram in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9, Hall notched four total tackles, including one tackle for loss. Hall produced four tackles and three quarterback pressures vs. Arizona. Hall leads Rams' defensive linemen with 22 takedowns. **DT La'Roi Glover** and **DT Adam Carriker** start along the inside of the Rams' defensive line. Glover, who is in his 12th season, stands 10th among active players with 77 sacks. Glover has 17 tackles through the first five games of the 2007 season. Carriker, the Rams' 2007 first-round draft pick is playing nose tackle and at the 'three-technique' after a standout career at defensive end for Nebraska. In his debut vs. Carolina, Carriker notched three assisted tackles and has four total tackles on the year. Carriker made two tackles and had two quarterback pressures vs. Arizona. **DT Clifton Ryan** has been called upon to give the Rams' significant playing time after second-year player DT Claude Wroten was suspended for four games. Ryan proved to be ready to contribute as he saw increased action in the Week 2 matchup vs. San Francisco. Ryan, led the Rams' defensive lineman with eight total tackles including two sacks and also caused a fumble by 49ers QB Alex Smith, which he recovered himself. Ryan became the first Rams' rookie since Sean Gilber in 1992 to record two sacks in a game. Ryan's 2.0 sacks rank third among NFL rookies. **Wroten** returns this week at Baltimore 10/14, and figures to see playing time, particularly in passing downs. **DE Victor Adeyanju** had a promising rookie season in 2006, and provides important depth on the defensive line. Adeyanju was unable to get onto the field in the season opener vs. Carolina, being declared inactive after suffering an ankle injury in practice, but has returned to see action. **DE Trevor Johnson** also provides depth at the defensive end position for the Rams. Johnson, who has made six tackles in 2007, joined the Rams in the offseason after splitting time between the New York Jets and New Orleans in 2006. In Week 3 at Tampa Bay, Johnson recorded his first sack of the season, dropping Tampa QB Jeff Garcia for an 11-yard loss.

LINEBACKERS (7) – Rick Venturi

Brandon Chillar (4), Quinton Culberson (R), Chris Draft (9), Tim McGarigle (1), Raonall Smith (6), Pisa Tinoisamoa (5), Will Witherspoon (6)

Six-year veteran **Will Witherspoon** starts at middle linebacker for the Rams and ranks first on the team with 44 tackles in 2007. Witherspoon started fast this season, totaling eight tackles, one pass defended and one fumble recovery in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9 and added 11 total tackles in Week 2 vs. San Francisco. Witherspoon made 10 tackles, including 1.0 sack in Week 5 vs. Arizona 10/7. Witherspoon has 23 double-digit tackle games in his career, including eight as a Ram. Witherspoon led the team in tackles in 2006, his first season with the team. Starting at strongside linebacker, **Brandon Chillar** had seven tackles, one forced fumble and a fumble recovery in the Rams' season opener vs. Carolina and posted a season-high eight tackles in Week 3 at Tampa Bay 9/23. Chillar's 28 tackles on the year, rank fourth on the team. Chillar also sees action on special teams and ranks third on the team with four special teams tackles. **Pisa Tinoisamoa**, starts at weakside linebacker and has 27 tackles in 2007. Tinoisamoa missed the Week 2 matchup vs. San Francisco and the Week 3 contest at Tampa Bay with an ankle injury, but Tinoisamo returned to action in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, making nine total tackles. Tinoisamo led the Rams with 15 total tackles vs. Arizona, the second-highest total of his career, bettered only by the 18 tackles made at Detroit 12/28/03. The Rams acquired free agent **Chris Draft** in the offseason, and the nine-year veteran from Stanford, is an important backup and special teams player, with the ability to be a starter. Draft has 13 total tackles in 2007 and started at weakside linebacker vs. San Francisco and at Tampa Bay in place of Tinoisamo. Draft made three total tackles on defense and adding one tackle on special teams vs. San Francisco and six tackles at Tampa Bay. **Raonall Smith** is a valuable asset on special teams and provides depth at linebacker. In the 2007 season opener vs. Carolina, Smith notched two special teams tackles and added one special teams tackle vs. San Francisco. He is tied for fourth on the squad with three special teams tackles. Smith missed the contest vs. Arizona with a knee injury. 2006 seventh-round draft choice **Tim McGarigle** spent last season on the Rams' practice squad, but has found a home on the team's active roster this season despite being slowed by a hamstring injury in the pre-season. McGarigle serves as a backup linebacker and is an important special teams player. McGarigle is tied for fourth on the team with three special teams tackles, all of which he notched in the contest vs. Arizona. Undrafted rookie free agent **Quinton Culberson** from Mississippi State rounds out the linebacking corps. Culberson was inactive in the season-opener, but saw his first NFL action in Week 2 vs. San Francisco, notching two special teams tackles and earning Special Teams Player of the Week from the team's

coaches.

SECONDARY (10) – Willy Robinson, Ron Milus

Oshiomogho Atogwe (3), Ron Bartell (3), Fakhir Brown (8) Jerome Carter (3), Corey Chavous (10), Tye Hill (2), Todd Johnson (5), Darius Vinnett (R), Jonathan Wade (R), Lenny Walls (6)

S Corey Chavous, a 10-year veteran, starts at strong safety for the Rams and provides valuable leadership for a secondary that features only three other players with five or more years of experience. Chavous ranks second on the team with 36 total tackles and notched eight total tackles in each of the Rams first two games. Chavous missed the Rams Week 5 game vs. Arizona 10/7 with a pectoral injury. In Week 3 at Tampa Bay 9/23 Chavous led the team with 10 tackles including six solo stops. Chavous posted his second consecutive game with 10 tackles in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, leading the team. Starting free safety **S Oshiomogho Atogwe** got off to a fast start in 2007, leading the team in tackles with 10 in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9. Atogwe's 34 tackles are third on the team in 2007. Atogwe, who has shown a propensity for making big plays, recorded his first forced fumble and fumble recovery of the season at Tampa Bay. He continued his strong play at Dallas, notching eight tackles and intercepting a Tony Romo pass, returning it 31 yards. **CB Ron Bartell**, has started at cornerback in the Rams first five games with the absence of Fakhir Brown for four games due to suspension and the recent injury to regular starter Tye Hill. Bartell has impressed notching 27 tackles including 1.0 sack in 2007. **Brown** returned from his four-game suspension last week vs. Arizona and made an immediate impact as a starter. Brown made his presence known immediately and had arguably the best game of his career, leading the secondary with eight solo tackles, two interceptions and a career-high four passes defended. Brown recorded a career-high two interceptions for 12 yards. His two picks led the NFL in Week 5 and marked the first time a Ram had multiple interceptions in a game since CB Ron Bartell tallied two against Minnesota (12/31/06). **CB Tye Hill**, a second-year player out of Clemson, is a Rams regular starter at cornerback, but has missed the last four games due to a back injury that was suffered in practice prior to the Week 2 contest vs. San Francisco. Hill made six tackles in the Rams season-opener vs. Carolina. **CB Lenny Walls** started in Hill's place vs. San Francisco, at Tampa Bay and at Dallas. Walls has nine tackles and three passes defended in 2007. **S Jerome Carter** began the season serving as a backup safety and seeing action on special teams. Vs. Arizona, Carter entered the starting lineup for an injured Chavous at SS, making two tackles before injuring his foot. **S Todd Johnson**, aquired in the offseason as a free agent, provides valuable experience and is a standout on special teams. In Week 1 vs. Carolina, Johnson shared the Rams' special teams Player of the

Week honors with LB Brandon Chillar after Johnson notched two special teams tackles. Johnson's seven special teams tackles rank first on the team. 2007 third-round pick **CB Jonathan Wade** out of Tennessee, where *Associated Press* All-Southeastern Conference honors, contributes as a backup in the secondary this season and is a gunner on the Rams' punt coverage teams. Wade has seen extensive action in the last four weeks vs. San Francisco, at Tampa Bay, at Dallas and vs. Arizona, as the team's nickelback. Wade has made two tackles on special teams this season and has nine tackles on defense. **CB Darius Vinnett** was added to the roster 9/15 from the practice squad and has played in four games, seeing action on special teams. The rookie from Arkansas has two tackles on defense and three special teams tackles.

SPECIAL TEAMS (3) – Al Roberts, Todd Downing

Donnie Jones (4), Chris Massey (6), Jeff Wilkins (14)

K Jeff Wilkins, a 14-year veteran, has converted on nine-of-13 field goal attempts this season. Wilkins has been successful on all five of his PAT attempts this season and continues his streak of 351 consecutive PAT, which stands as a Rams' franchise-record and ranks second in NFL history behind Jason Elam's streak of 371 consecutive extra point conversions from 1993-2002. Wilkins has converted 292 career field goals, which stands as the Rams' all-time mark and his 1,158 points make him the Rams' all-time scoring leader. **LS Chris Massey**, one of the most consistent players at his position, continues long snapping duties, while **P Donnie Jones** plays his first season with the Rams after spending 2006 in Miami. Jones has been one of the best punters in the league this season. Jones leads the NFL after five games with a 50.6 punting average. In Week 5 vs. Arizona 10/7, Jones notched four punts for a 56.0 average with a long of 60. His 56.0 gross average was the best in franchise history, eclipsing his mark that he set a week earlier where he punted eight times for a then career-high 55.3-yard average with a career long of 66 yards, two touchbacks and four kicks inside the 20-yard line in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30. Jones also ranks second in the NFC, third in the NFL with a 41.9 net punting average. His eight kicks inside the 20-yard line are tied for sixth most in the NFL.
