THIS WEEK

The Rams travel to the Georgia Dome this week to face the Atlanta Falcons in the 2008 regular season finale for both teams.

The Rams have played the Falcons 74 times, leading the all-time series 47-25-2. The Rams have faced only San Francisco (119), Green Bay (90), Chicago (88) and Detroit (80) more than the Falcons.

The Rams have had success against the Falcons. The 47 wins against the Falcons are the third-most against one franchise in Rams' history behind San Francisco (60) and Chicago (48). The Rams have shut out the Falcons six times.

The Rams and the Falcons met twice each year from 1967-69 as members of the Coastal Division of the Western Conference and then from 1970-2001 as members of the NFC West. After division re-alignment in 2002, the Rams and Falcons have met only four times, with the series tied at two games.

A WIN OVER THE FALCONS WOULD...

- Give the Rams a 3-13 record in the 2008 season.
- Give the Rams a 117-111-2 record in the month of December.
- Give the Rams a 46-66 road record since moving to St. Louis in 1995.
- Improve the Rams all-time record vs. the Atlanta Falcons to 48-25-2.
- Give the Rams a 12-7 record vs. Atlanta since the Rams moved to St. Louis in 1995.
- Give Rams head coach Jim Haslett a 48-60 record as a head coach.
- Give Rams head coach Jim Haslett a 7-6 career record vs. Atlanta.
- Give the Rams franchise 504 regular season victories.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK

- With a catch this week, **WR Torry Holt** will have a reception in 153 consecutive games, the fourth-longest streak among active NFL players and the 11th all-time.
- **DT La'Roi Glover** will play in his 191st consecutive game, sixth-longest streak among active players.
- **WR Donnie Avery** needs seven receptions to break Eddie Kennison's Rams rookie record for most receptions in a season (54), set in 1996.
- **S Oshiomogho Atogwe** needs one interception to tie Isaiah Robertson (18) for 18th on the Rams all-time interceptions list.
- **RB Steven Jackson** needs 119 rushing yards to reach 1,000 for the season. With 1,000 yards this season, Jackson will be the first Rams' running back to have four consecutive 1,000-yard rushing seasons since Eric Dickerson (1983-86).
- With five points, **RB Steven Jackson** will pass Wendell Tyler (258) for 17th on the Rams all-time scoring list. With 11 points Jackson will pass Dan Towler (264) for 16th.
- **RB Steven Jackson** needs one receiving yard to pass Jon Arnett (1,911) for sole possession of 22nd place on the Rams all-time receiving yards list. With 53 receiving yards, Jackson will pass Billy Waddy (1,963) for 21st and with 60 yards Jackson will pass Les Josephson (1,970) for 20th.

THE LAST TIME

Edward Jones Dome, December 2, 2007 (62,051) - In their first matchup since the 2004 NFC Divisional Playoff game, the Rams defeated the Atlanta Flacons to notch their first home win of the 2007 season. QB Gus Frerotte started in place of the injured Marc Bulger, recording the 100th touchdown pass of his career while totaling 311 passing yards and three touchdowns on the day. WR Isaac Bruce caught four passes for 31 yards to pass Cris Carter for fifth place on the NFL's all-time receiving yards list with 13,911 yards. S O.J. Atogwe's fourth quarter interception made him the first Ram since Anthony Newman (1991-'92) to record an interception in four straight games. The Rams jumped out to a 21-0 lead, thanks in large part to WR Torry Holt's first quarter performance, which included three catches, 92 receiving yards and a touchdown. Atlanta K Morten Andersen got the Falcons on the board with a 41-yard field goal before halftime. After three quarters without a touchdown, Atlanta coach Bobby Petrino opted to replace starting quarterback Joey Harrington with Chris Redman, who directed two fourth quarter scoring drives to cut the score to 21-16. After Atogwe's interception put the ball back in the Rams' hands, RB Steven Jackson put the game out of reach with a 5-yard touchdown run with just 1:57 remaining, bringing the final score to 28-16.

RON'S WORLD



CB Ron Bartell tied his career high with two interceptions last week vs. San Francisco. The game marked Bartell's second career multi-interception contest, previously accomplished Dec. 31, 2006 at Minnesota. Bartell has recorded three interceptions this season, equaling his career-high recorded in 2006.

Bartell also recorded two passes defended vs. San Francisco, giving him 18 passes defended this season. The 18 passes defended are a career high and stand as the most passes defended by a Ram since Jerametrious Butler recorded 22 in 2004.

REMEMBERING GEORGIA



For the 2008 season, the Rams are one of two teams in the NFL wearing patches on their uniforms in memory of their owners. The Rams wear a special commemorative patch on their jerseys for their late owner Georgia Frontiere. The simple and classic patch design is a blue football that features Georgia's distinguished signature written in gold. It is strategically affixed on the left chest of each jersey.

Georgia, a native to St. Louis, was recognized as one of America's most accomplished business-women and an exemplary humanitarian. She led the Rams for 29 seasons continually sharing her courage, passion and commitment to the team on and off the field. The Rams Foundation, a dream of Georgia's from the moment she announced the franchise was relocating, has donated more than \$6 million in grants, merchandise and tickets to charities in the St. Louis area since the foundation was created in 1997.

The Kansas City Chiefs also wear a patch to pay tribute to their late owner, Lamar Hunt.

LIKE A GLOVE(R)



Last week vs. San Francisco, DT La'Roi Glover played in his 190th consecutive game, the sixth-longest streak among active players in the NFL. Ironically, the 13-year veteran began the streak against the St. Louis Rams in 1998 while playing for the New Orleans Saints (11/15). That game, Glover made eight tackles (seven solo), 3.0 sacks and one forced fumble.

Glover is in his third year with the Rams and is one of the NFL's active sack leaders. He ranks fifth among active players, first among defensive tackles, with 83.0 career sacks. In 2007, Glover ranked second on the Rams with 6.0 sacks, his highest single-season total since posting 7.0 sacks in 2004 while he played for Dallas.

Glover led the NFL with 17.0 sacks in 2000, the second-highest mark in NFL history among defensive tackles, trailing only Minnesota's Keith Millard's 18.0 sacks in 1989.

LAST GAME

Edward Jones Dome, December 21, 2008 (54,948) - In Week 16, the Rams took on division rivals the San Francisco 49ers at the Edward Jones Dome in their second meeting of the season, falling 17-16. WR Torry Holt recorded four receptions giving him at least one reception in his last 152 games, improving his fourth place streak among active NFL players and passing Jimmy Smith (862) for 11th on the all-time list. DT La'Roi Glover played in his 190th consecutive game, sixth-longest streak among active players. S Oshiomogho Atogwe recorded one interception to tie Dick (Night Train) Lane, Jack Pardee and Monte Jackson (17) for 19th on the Rams all-time interceptions list. CB Ron Bartell had his second multi-interception game, tying his career-high of two interceptions. LB Pisa Tinoisamoa recorded a career-high two sacks, in addition to leading the team for the third consecutive week with eight tackles, seven solo. The 49ers opened the scoring in the first quarter with a K Joe Nedney field goal, but the Rams quickly answered back in the second quarter with a field goal by K Josh Brown. The following 49er drive was ended abruptly when Atogwe forced and recovered a fumble. Then, on the Rams next defensive possession, Atogwe ended another 49er drive with an interception of QB Shaun Hill. After the two-minute warning of the first half, QB Marc Bulger connected with rookie WR Keenan Burton for a 30-yard touchdown pass, giving Burton his first NFL score. The 49ers were stopped again when Bartell made his first interception of the game, putting the Rams in field goal position and increasing their lead to 13-3. After a scoreless third quarter, the Rams kicked a third field goal, but the 49ers managed to get into the endzone two times, giving them a one-point lead for a final score, 17-16.

STARRING DARBY



First-year RB Ken Darby has seen his role in the offense expand in the last few weeks. In a backup role last week vs. San Francisco, Darby led the team with five receptions for 57 yards and rushed five times for 15 yards. He also returned three kickoffs for a 25-yard return average.

Earlier this season at San Francisco in Week 11, Darby rushed a career-high seven times for 26 yards and caught a career-high eight passes for 83 yards.

THE HEAD COACHES

Jim Haslett was appointed head coach on Sept. 29, 2008, replacing Scott Linehan, who was dismissed.

Haslett joined the Rams in 2006, serving as defensive coordinator until his appointment as head coach. In 2007, the Rams rushing defense ranked 20th in the NFL (115.3 yards per game), jumping 11 spots after finishing 2006 ranked 31st in the league. The Rams also nabbed 18 interceptions, the most since 2003.

Prior to joining the Rams, Haslett was head coach of the New Orleans Saints for six seasons. His 45-win total was second in team history. Haslett earned *Associated Press* Coach-of-the-Year honors in 2000 after leading the Saints to the only postseason victory in franchise history.

Haslett coordinated defense for the Pittsburgh Steelers from 1997-99. Haslett came to the Steelers from the Saints, for whom he was linebackers coach in 1995 and defensive coordinator in 1996.

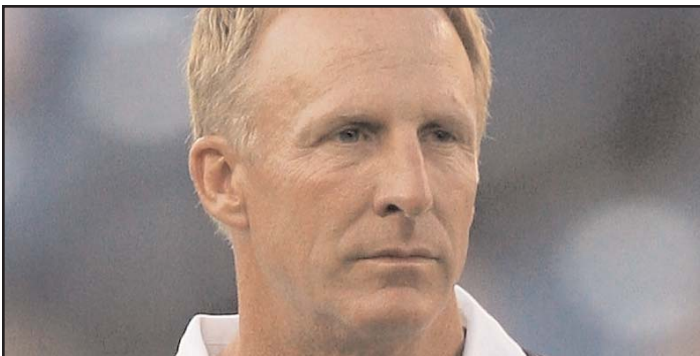
Haslett has also had coaching stints with the Los Angeles Raiders, the Sacramento Surge of the World League of American Football and the University of Buffalo.

Haslett played eight seasons with the Buffalo Bills, earning *Associated Press* NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year honors in 1979 and All-Pro honors in 1981. He finished his playing career in 1987 with the New York Jets.

A four-time All-America selection at Indiana University in Pennsylvania, Haslett was recognized with induction into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2001.

Mike Smith was named the 14th head coach in Atlanta Falcons franchise history on Jan. 23, 2008.

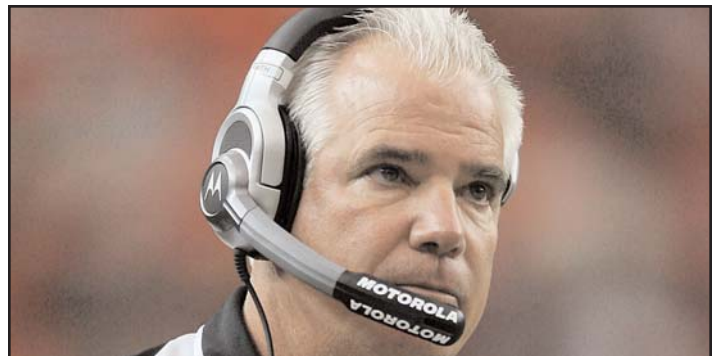
From 2003-07, Smith served as defensive coordinator for the Jacksonville Jaguars and led a defensive unit which ranked fourth in overall defense (296.6), third in offensive points allowed (16.1) and fifth in rushing defense (99.3) from 2003-06. Last year, the Jaguars' defense ranked twelfth. During Smith's five seasons in Jacksonville, three defensive players earned six Pro Bowl selections.

Prior to joining the Jaguars' defense, Smith spent four seasons with the Baltimore Ravens and was the defensive assistant/defensive line coach from 1999-2001, which included the team's 2000 Super Bowl season. The Ravens defense set an NFL 16-game record by allowing only 165 points en route to the team's first championship.

In 2002, Smith served as the Ravens' linebackers coach. Before joining the NFL ranks, Smith coached at San Diego State (1982-85), Morehead State (1986), and Tennessee Tech (1987-1998).

NEW COACHING FACES

The Rams have added some new faces to the coaching staff in 2008:



Al Saunders, Offensive Coordinator

Saunders brought one of the most innovative offenses in the NFL back to St. Louis as offensive coordinator. Saunders is in his second stint with the Rams, after spending the past two seasons with the Washington Redskins as associate head coach/offense.

Saunders served as associated head coach/wide receivers coach from 1999-2000, helping the Rams to a Super Bowl title in 2000.

Prior to joining the Redskins, Saunders spent 2001-2005 with the Kansas City Chiefs as assistant head coach/offensive coordinator under Head Coach Dick Vermeil. He previously served a 10-year stint with the Chiefs as assistant head coach/wide receivers coach under then head coach Marty Schottenheimer from '89-98.

In his first stint with the Rams, the team paced the NFL in 1999 with 6,412 yards of total offense, good for a remarkable 400.8 ypg average. St. Louis also led the league in passing offense with 272.1 yards per game and topped the NFL in scoring by averaging 32.9 points per contest. The 526 total points amassed by the '99 squad ranked as the fourth-highest tally in NFL annals.

In 2000, Saunders was part of a St. Louis coaching staff which helped the Rams score 540 points (33.8 ppg), the third-highest single-season total in NFL history. The club also led the league with an NFL-record 442.2 yards of total offense per game and paced the NFL in passing offense (327.0 ypg) for the second straight season, setting another league record in the process. St. Louis amassed 7,075 yards of total offense and 5,232 passing yards, breaking the previous marks established by the '84 Miami Dolphins.



Art Valero, Assistant Head Coach/Running Backs

Art Valero is in his first season with the Rams, serving as assistant head coach/running backs coach, after spending the last six seasons with Tampa Bay. Valero inherits a backfield that features one of the best running backs in the NFL, Steven Jackson, who accrued his third consecutive 1,000-yard rushing season in 2007.

Prior coming to St. Louis, Valero was the assistant head coach/running backs coach for the Buccaneers from 2006-2007. He also spent two seasons (2004-2005) as running backs coach and two seasons (2002-2003) as the tight ends coach. In 2002, he earned a World Championship with the Buccaneers.

In 2007, under Valero's watch, Tampa Bay rushed for 1,872 yards, the most rushing yards for the Bucs since

2000. The team's 15 rushing touchdowns are the most since they scored 17 touchdowns in 2001. With injuries to Carnell Williams, Mike Alstott and Michael Pittman, Valero helped guide RB Earnest Graham to the best statistical seasons of his career, leading the team with 898 rushing yards with a team-high 10 rushing touchdowns despite sitting out the final two regular season games.

In 2005, Valero coached rookie sensation RB Carnell "Cadillac" Williams, who set a Buccaneer rookie record rushing for 1,178 yards and was named NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.



Steve Loney, Offensive Line

Loney entered his first year with the Rams, bringing 30 years of coaching experience at the professional and collegiate levels to the offensive line. Prior to coming to St. Louis, Loney served as interim head coach for Drake University.

Before going to Drake, Loney was in the NFL ranks, coaching the offensive line with Arizona in 2006, and coaching Minnesota's offensive line from 2002-2004, before adding the offensive coordinator duties in 2005. While with Minnesota, the Vikings led the NFL in total offense in 2003, and set a team record for yardage in 2004. The Vikings led the NFL in rushing in 2002, and in 2004 QB Daunte Culpepper broke virtually every Vikings' passing record and posted the fourth-best passer rating in NFL history.



Terry Shea, Quarterbacks

Shea is in his first season tutoring quarterback for the Rams after spending 2007 with Miami in the same capacity.

Prior to Miami, Shea was the quarterbacks coach with the Kansas City Chiefs the last two years, his second stint with the club.

Under Shea's tutelage, quarterback Trent Green earned the second Pro Bowl berth of his career in 2005 as he threw for more than 4,000 yards and compiled a passer rating of over 90.0. In 2006, Damon Huard, who played in 10 games, starting eight of them in place of the injured Green, amassed a career-best 98.0 passer rating, the second-best mark in the NFL.

Before joining the Chiefs, Shea was the offensive coordinator with the Chicago Bears in 2004. Shea's first three seasons as Kansas City's quarterbacks coach (2001-03) coincided with the three most productive seasons of Green's career to that point. He started all 16 games each of those three seasons, and in 2003, tossed for more than 4,000 yards for the first time in his career and was selected to his initial Pro Bowl berth.

OFFENSE:

WR – Torry Holt: Seven-time Pro Bowl selection leads the NFL in receiving yards and receptions since 2000. Became the fastest player in NFL history to 11,000 receiving yards, accomplishing the feat in 131 games.

LT – Orlando Pace: Has played in 13 games with 13 starts at left tackle this season. Named to seven consecutive Pro Bowls from 1995-2005.

LG – Jacob Bell: Free-agent addition joined the Rams after spending first four seasons of his career with Tennessee. Bell has made 13 starts this season.

C – Brett Romberg: Fifth-year NFL veteran has started the last five contests after Nick Leckey was placed on reserve/injured with a foot injury. Romberg started nine games last season with the Rams.

RG – Richie Incognito: Veteran offensive lineman in his fourth NFL season. Has seen action at center and guard during his career. Has started all 15 contests in 2008 at right guard.

RT – Alex Barron: Has started 57 of 59 games he has played in during his career. Starter at right tackle in 14 of 15 contests this season.

TE – Joe Klopfenstein: Has played in all 15 contests with nine starts in 2008. Named the starting tight end prior to Week 6 contest at Washington, replacing Randy McMichael who was placed on the reserve/injured list.

WR – Donnie Avery: 2008 second-round draft choice (33rd overall), has made 11 starts this season. Ranks second on the Rams with 634 receiving yards on 48 catches with two touchdowns. 163 receiving yards in Week 8 at New England stand as the third-highest single-game total among rookie wide receivers in team history.

QB – Marc Bulger: Two-time Pro Bowl selection ranks in the top five in Rams history in passing yards (third), completion percentage (second), passer rating (second), completions (third), attempts (third) and touchdown passes (fourth). Recorded his first 300-yard passing game of the season in Week 8 at New England.

TE – Anthony Becht: Former first-round draft choice in 2000 has played in all 15 games for the Rams with 10 starts this season.

RB – Steven Jackson: Fifth-year player stands fifth on the Rams all-time rushing list with 5,130 yards. Jackson is only the fifth Rams running back to surpass 5,000 career rushing yards. 2,334 yards from scrimmage in 2006 rank fifth in NFL history in a single-season.

SPECIALISTS:

LS – Chris Massey: In his seventh season in the NFL, all with the Rams. Has made clean snaps on 830 of 831 attempts, including a string of 528 consecutive clean snaps from 2002-06.

K – Josh Brown: Free agent addition joined the Rams after five seasons with NFC West rival Seattle. Kicked 49-yard game-winning field goal as time expired at Washington in Week 6. Has seven career game-winning field goals.

P – Donnie Jones: Ranks first in the NFL in 2008 with a 50.1-yard average and broke his own single-game punting average record with a 56.2-yard average in Week 4 vs. Buffalo. Joined the Rams in 2007 from the Miami Dolphins and in his first season with the Rams, Jones set a team mark for single-season punting average (47.2-yards).

DEFENSE:

LDE – Leonard Little: Rams all-time sack leader since the statistic became official in 1982 with 81.0 career sacks. Leads the Rams with 6.0 sacks this season.

UT – La’Roi Glover: Thirteen-year veteran has played in 190 consecutive games dating to the 1998 season. Ranks fifth among active players with 83 career sacks.

NT – Clifton Ryan: Second-year player earned the first start of his career in Week 4 vs. Buffalo and has started 11 games this season. Played in all 16 games in 2007, totaling 48 tackles including 2.0 sacks.

RDE – Chris Long: No. 2-overall selection in the 2008 NFL Draft is tied for the team lead with 15 quarterback pressures and is tied for first among NFC rookies with 4.0 sacks this season.

SLB – Quinton Culberson: Second-year player has played in all 15 games this season with nine starts. Fifty-six tackles this season rank third among Rams linebackers. Only undrafted rookie to make the Rams opening day roster in 2007, playing in 14 games with one start.

MLB – Will Witherspoon: Eighty-eight tackles in 2008 rank fourth on the team. Led the Rams with 132 tackles and seven sacks in 2007, becoming the first linebacker to lead the Rams in sacks since Kevin Greene had 10 sacks in 1992.

WLB – Pisa Tinoisamoa: Sixth-year veteran leads the Rams defense with 131 tackles in 2008. This season marks the first time since 2005 that Tinoisamoa has tallied 100-plus tackles in a season.

LCB – Ron Bartell: Leads the Rams defense with 18 passes defended, surpassing his previous career-high of 10 posted in 2007. Tied his career-high with two interceptions last week vs. San Francisco.

RCB – Fakhir Brown: Veteran in his ninth NFL season and third with the Rams. Has tallied 39 tackles, 10 passes defended and one interception in 13 games. 16 passes defended in 2007 led the Rams defense.

FS – Oshiomogho Atogwe: Recorded a 75-yard fumble return for a touchdown in Week 6 at Washington and has added five interceptions this season. Has five interceptions, seven forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries in the past 12 games. Led the NFC and ranked second in the NFL with eight interceptions in 2007.

SS – Todd Johnson: Six-year NFL veteran has been a solid contributor on defense and special teams throughout his career. Made his first start of the season in Week 15 vs. Seattle, tallying four tackles on defense. Has 13 special teams stops this season after making 23 tackles in 2007.



PUNTING GREAT IN '08



P Donnie Jones is league's best punter in 2008, ranking first in the NFL with a 50.1-yard average and first in the NFC, second in the NFL with a 40.9-yard net average. Jones has posted four of the top seven single-game punting performances in the NFL this season, including punting five times for a 54.6-yard average with a net average of 45.6 yards in Week 15 vs. Seattle. Jones has had nine games this season where he has at least a 50-yard punting average.

MAKING HISTORY

Donnie Jones leads the NFL with a 50.1-yard punting average. If he finishes the season with a 50.0-punting average, he will be only the second player in NFL history, first since 1940, to average 50 punting yards in a single season. Sammy Baugh averaged 51.4 punting yards in 1940 with the Washington Redskins (35 punts for 1,799 yards).

In his second year with the Rams, Jones is rewriting the record books in the punting category. Jones owns three of the top five single-game punting performances in Rams' history, as well as the highest single-season punting average and the third-longest punt in team history. Jones' 56.2-yard average against Buffalo in Week 4 ranks as the best single-game average in Rams' history, eclipsing his 56.0-yard average set last season versus Arizona (10/7/07). His 55.7-yard average against the New York Giants this season is fourth in team history, one-tenth of a yard behind Jack Jacobs' 55.8-yard average at Detroit (9/27/42).

Last season, Jones punted 78 times for a 47.2-yard average, the best in team history, including an 80-yard punt at Seattle (10/21), third-longest in team history and the longest since Bob Waterfield made a team-record 88-yard punt at Green Bay in 1948 (10/17).

K Josh Brown leads the team with 103 points this season. Since 2003, Brown has scored 674 points, fifth-most among kickers in the NFL during that time.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?



Brown is 29-for-34 in field goal attempts and 16-for-16 on extra points this season. He leads the team in scoring with 103 points. Last week vs. San Francisco, Brown converted all three of his field goal attempts from 43, 38 and 22 yards.

In Week 13 vs. Miami, Brown converted four field goals attempts, from 23, 51, 33, and 38 yards. The game marked the most field goals in one game by Brown since he made four field goals at Washington in Week 6.

Brown was named NFC Special Teams Player of the Month for October. Brown converted nine of 10 field goal attempts and all six PATs in October as the Rams posted a 2-1 record. Brown scored 33 points and averaged 11.0 points per game, the most during the month among NFL kickers. His nine field goals tied for the most in October. In Week 6 against Washington (10/12), Brown converted all four field-goal attempts, including the game-winner from 49 yards out as time expired to give the Rams their first victory of the season. The four made field goals are tied for the most field goals in one game in Brown's career, as well as tied for the third most in Rams history. Brown kicked two field goals in Week 7 versus Dallas (10/19) and was a perfect three-for-three in Week 8 at New England (10/26). Brown scored at least 10 points in all three games during the month.

In Week 2 against the New York Giants, Brown made two 54-yard field goals. The kicks also mark the longest by a Ram since Jeff Wilkins hit a 54-yarder against New Orleans in 2001 (10/28). The last time the Rams hit two 50-yard field goals in one game was against San Francisco in 2005 (12/24).

Since his rookie season in 2003, Brown has made 145 field goals, seventh among active kickers.

DOWNTOWN BROWN

This season, Brown has made six field goals from 50 yards or more.

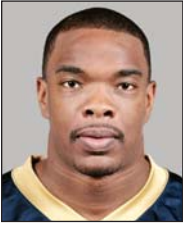
With two more 50-yard field goals this season, Brown will tie the record for most 50-yard field goals in a season set by Morten Andersen (eight in 1995, Atlanta) and tied by Detroit's Jason Hanson this season (eight through 14 games).

Last week vs. San Francisco, DE Leonard Little nabbed his 81st career sack, eighth-most among active players. In the third quarter, Little brought down QB Shaun Hill for a 7-yard loss. Hill is the 43rd different QB Little has sacked in his career. Little leads the team with 6.0 sacks this season.

In Week 7 against Dallas, Little led the defensive line with six tackles (five solo) and 1.5 sacks. Little sacked QB Brad Johnson in the second quarter for a 3-yard loss, forcing Dallas to punt. Little reached Johnson again when he and DE James Hall sacked Johnson for a 7-yard loss.

Little tallied his third sack of the season in Week 6 at Washington. On third-and-three, Little sacked QB Jason Campbell forcing him to fumble. The sack also marked the first time Little has sacked Campbell, making him the 44th different quarterback Little has sacked in his career.

In Week 4 against Buffalo, Little notched his 18th career multi-sack game. Little sacked QB Trent Edwards twice in the second quarter, first for a 6-yard loss forcing Buffalo to punt, then for a 7-yard loss on second down.

Little is the Rams career leader with 81.0 career sacks, the most in franchise history since the NFL made the statistic official in 1982. Since 2000, Little's 80.5 sacks are fifth-most in the NFL.

DE Victor Adeyanju leads all defensive linemen and is fifth on the team with a career-high 69 tackles (32 solo) and 2.0 sacks on the season. Last week vs. San Francisco, Adeyanju led all defensive linemen with four tackles (two solo).

Adeyanju led Rams defensive linemen with seven tackles (four solo) in Week 13 vs. Miami, a week after he tied for the team lead with a career-high eight tackles (five solo) in Week 12 vs. Chicago.

In Week 10 at the New York Giants, Adeyanju led defensive linemen with seven tackles (three solo). In Week 9 vs. Arizona, he tied for the team lead among defensive linemen with seven tackles (four solo).

In Week 6 at Washington, Adeyanju made five tackles (three solo) and 1.0 sack.

In Week 4 against Buffalo, Adeyanju started at defensive end and tied for the lead among defensive linemen with seven tackles (two solo). In the season home opener against the New York Giants, Adeyanju got his first sack of the season, sacking QB Eli Manning for an 8-yard loss.

S Oshiomogho (O.J.) Atogwe continues to be one of the best in the NFL at causing turnovers, making five interceptions, forcing six fumbles and recovering three fumbles in the last 12 games. On the season, Atogwe's five interceptions lead the team and are second most in the NFL. Atogwe also leads the team with eight forced fumbles three fumble recoveries and ranks second on the team with a career-high 106 tackles (71 solo).

Last week vs. San Francisco, Atogwe led defensive backs and finished second on the team with seven tackles (five solo), one interception, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. In the second quarter, Atogwe stripped TE Vernon Davis and recovered the fumble, giving the Rams possession and negating a 17-yard pass play. On the ensuing San Francisco possession, Atogwe intercepted QB Shaun Hill on first down.

In Week 13 vs. Miami, Atogwe led the team with a career-high 13 tackles and one forced fumble. Against Chicago in Week 12, Atogwe tied for second on the team with seven tackles (four solo), two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. In the second quarter, Atogwe forced RB Matt Forte to fumble and recovered the fumble to give the Rams possession. In the fourth quarter, Atogwe stripped FB Jason McKie and the fumble was recovered by CB Fakhir Brown, giving the Rams possession on their 5-yard line. Atogwe leads the Rams with six forced fumbles.

In Week 11 at San Francisco, RB Frank Gore broke a 37-yard run, but Atogwe punched the football out and CB Jason Craft recovered the fumble.

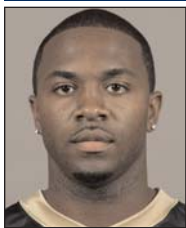
In Week 10 at the New York Jets, Atogwe tied for the team lead with 11 tackles (six solo). The tackle total is his second highest this season, as well as the second highest of his career. In the season opener at Philadelphia, Atogwe set a career high with 12 tackles (nine solo). In Week 9 against Arizona, he tied for third on the team with eight tackles (seven solo).

Atogwe continued his streak of causing turnovers at New England in Week 8. Atogwe made one interception, adding seven tackles (five solo). The two interceptions marked the first time a Ram has had two interceptions in a game since Atogwe had two interceptions against Green Bay last season (12/16/07).

In Week 6 at Washington, Atogwe returned a Redskins fumble 75 yards for a touchdown near the end of the first half to give the Rams a 7-6 lead. The return marked Atogwe's first fumble recovery for a touchdown in his career, and the first fumble recovery returned for a touchdown by the Rams since DE Victor Adeyanju returned a fumble recovery 89 yards for a touchdown at Seattle (12/12/06). Atogwe added seven tackles (three solo) at Washington.

DONNIE'S BIG DAYS



WR Donnie Avery, 2008 second-round draft choice, is second on the team with 48 receptions for 634 yards and two touchdowns. With seven more receptions, Avery will break Eddie Kennison's Rams rookie record for the most receptions in a single season. Kennison caught 54 passes in 1996.

Last week vs. San Francisco, Avery finished second on the team with five receptions for 56 yards.

In Week 15 vs. Seattle, Avery led the team with six receptions for 61 yards.

Avery recorded a career-high and led the team with nine receptions for a team-high 93 yards at San Francisco in Week 11. Avery's nine receptions tied for second most by a rookie in Rams' history, and the most by a Rams' rookie since RB Lamar Gordon caught 10 passes in a game in 2002.

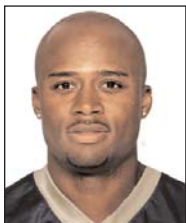
Avery led all receivers with six receptions for a career-high 163 yards and one touchdown in Week 8 at New England. On the second play of the second quarter, Avery caught a career-long 69-yard touchdown pass from QB Marc Bulger to give the Rams a 10-7 lead.

Avery's 163-yard performance is the third-best for a rookie receiver in franchise history behind Eddie Kennison's 226 yards (12/15/96) and Jim Phillips 208 yards (11/16/58).

CRAFT-Y WORK



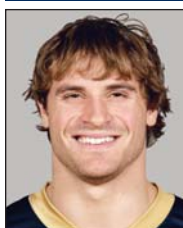
In his 10th NFL season, CB Jason Craft is putting up some of the best numbers of his career. Prior to this season, Craft played in 135 games with Jacksonville and New Orleans, recording only one sack in a game against Carolina in 2005.

In his 12 games with the Rams this season after being picked up in Week 3 of the season, Craft has made three sacks, including one in Week 15 vs. Seattle. In the second quarter, Craft sacked QB Seneca Wallace for an 8-yard loss, forcing Wallace to fumble. The fumble was recovered by LB Will Witherspoon, giving the Rams possession on Seattle's 21-yard line. The Rams took a 17-7 lead on a 36-yard field goal off of the turnover. On the ensuing kickoff, Craft stripped KR Josh Wilson and recovered the fumble.

In Week 11 at San Francisco, Craft recorded two sacks for a 14-yard loss and one fumble recovery.

Seeing most of his action in the nickel package, Craft has 47 tackles (40 solo), 3.0 sacks, five passes defended two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries.

LONG ON TALENT



Rookie DE Chris Long leads the team with 15 quarterback pressures and is tied for first among NFC rookies with 4.0 sacks this season. Long ranks third among Rams defensive lineman with 56 tackles (36 solo).

Long recorded a team-high three quarterback pressures in Week 13 vs. Miami, adding two tackles. The game vs. Miami featured Long, the No. 2-overall choice in the 2008 NFL Draft, matched up against the No.1-overall choice in the Draft, Miami LT Jake Long.

Long made four tackles (three solo) in Week 9 against Arizona, second most on the defensive line. The performance came a week after making two sacks and five tackles (three solo) at New England in Week 8. Long sacked QB Matt Cassel in the fourth quarter for a 7-yard loss, forcing New England to punt. Later in the fourth quarter, Long sacked Cassel again, this time for an 8-yard loss.

In Week 7 against Dallas, Long made three solo tackles, a week after finishing second among defensive linemen with four tackles (three solo) and adding one fumble recovery at Washington in Week 6.

Long tied for a defensive line high with seven tackles (two solo) and 1.0 sack in Week 4 against Buffalo. In the first quarter, Long sacked QB Trent Edwards for an 8-yard loss.

Starting at left defensive end at Seattle in Week 3, Long led the defensive line with a career-high eight tackles (six solo).

With the second overall pick in the 2008 NFL Draft, the St. Louis Rams chose Long from the University of Virginia. Long is the first defensive end drafted by the Rams in the first round since Grant Wistrom in 1998.

As a senior at the University of Virginia, Long started in 13 games and tied for third in the nation with 14.0 sacks as well as ranked 14th in the nation with 19 tackles for losses. Long was a unanimous All-America selection, and named ACC Defensive Player of the Year. He was also the recipient of the Ted Hendricks Award, which is given to the nation's top defensive end each year.

LB Pisa Tinoisamoa leads the team with 131 tackles (86 solo). The tackle total marks the first time Tinoisamoa has eclipsed the 100-tackle mark since he made 134 tackles in 2005.

Last week vs. San Francisco, Tinoisamoa led the team in tackles for the fifth time in six games with eight tackles (seven solo) and tallied his first multi-sack game of his career. In the third quarter, Tinoisamoa sacked QB Shaun Hill for an 8-yard loss. He reached Hill again in the fourth quarter for a 7-yard loss.

In Week 15 vs. Seattle, Tinoisamoa led the team for a second week in a row, nabbing nine tackles (six solo).

In Week 14 at Arizona, Tinoisamoa led the team with 11 tackles (eight solo). The game marked the fifth double-digit tackle game of the season, 19th of his career.

In Week 12 vs. Chicago, he tied for the team lead with eight tackles (seven solo). In Week 10 at the New York Jets, Tinoisamoa made seven tackles (six solo), a week after he led the team against Arizona with 11 tackles (seven solo). The game marked his third double-digit tackle game of the season, 18th of his career.

In Week 8 at New England, Tinoisamoa tied for the lead among linebackers with seven tackles (three solo).

In Week 7 against Dallas, he tied for the lead among linebackers with five tackles (four solo), a week after he tied a season-high with a team-high 13 tackles (eight solo), 1.0 sack and one forced fumble at Washington. Before halftime, Tinoisamoa forced G Pete Kendall to fumble. The fumble was returned for a touchdown to give the Rams a 10-7 lead at halftime. In the fourth quarter, Tinoisamoa sacked QB Jason Campbell for a 5-yard loss. The sack and forced fumble were the first of the season for Tinoisamoa.

Tinoisamoa led the team with a season-high 13 tackles (seven solo) in Week 4 against Buffalo. The 13 tackles marked the most by any Rams player this season, and the most for Tinoisamoa since he made 15 tackles (eight solo) at Baltimore last season (10/14).

In the season home opener against New York Giants, Tinoisamoa tied for the lead among linebackers with eight tackles (five solo), a week after leading the linebackers with seven tackles (five solo) in the season opener at Philadelphia.

WHERE THERE'S A WILL...



Despite dealing with injuries this season, LB Will Witherspoon has started 12 of 15 games and ranks third on the team with 88 tackles (61 solo).

In Week 12 vs. Chicago, Witherspoon tied for second on the team with seven tackles (five solo). Witherspoon finished second on the team with nine tackles (seven solo) in Week 11 at San Francisco, a week after he made seven tackles (five solo), second among linebackers in Week 10 at the New York Jets. Witherspoon tied for third on the team with eight tackles (five solo) in Week 9 against Arizona. In Week 8 at New England, he tied for the lead among linebackers with seven tackles (four solo), a week after he made his first interception as a Ram against the Dallas Cowboys in Week 7, adding five tackles (three solo). On Dallas' third possession of the game, Witherspoon intercepted QB Brad Johnson. The turnover led to a touchdown run by RB Steven Jackson to give the Rams a 21-7 lead. The interception was the eighth of Witherspoon's career.

At Washington in Week 6, Witherspoon was second among linebackers with seven tackles (five solo). Against Buffalo in Week 4, Witherspoon finished second on the team with eight tackles (six solo).

Witherspoon, who led the team in sacks last season, made his first sack of 2008 in Week 3 at Seattle. Witherspoon led the team with 12 tackles (eight solo) and 1.0 sack.

A week earlier against the New York Giants, he tied for the lead among linebackers with eight tackles (six solo).

Witherspoon has led the team in tackles the past two seasons, posting a career-high 136 tackles (104 solo) in 2006, and 132 tackles (103 solo) in 2007.

A HALL OF A PLAYER



DE James Hall has had one of his most productive seasons in 2008. Hall's 5.5 sacks is second on the team.

In Week 14 vs. Seattle, Hall sacked QB Seneca Wallace for a 6-yard loss. His 5.5 sacks are the most since he had 11.5 sacks in 2004.

In Week 9 against Arizona, Hall tied for the team lead among defensive linemen with seven tackles (four solo) and 1.0 sack. Hall sacked QB Kurt Warner for a 9-yard loss in the third quarter, forcing Arizona to punt.

In Week 7 against Dallas, Hall made four tackles (three solo) and 1.5 sacks, his first multi-sack game as a Ram. Hall and DE Leonard Little sacked QB Brad Johnson for a 7-yard loss in the fourth quarter. On the next play, Hall sacked Johnson again for a 7-yard loss, forcing the Cowboys to punt.

In Week 3 at Seattle, Hall was second among defensive linemen with six tackles (two solo). In the home opener against the New York Giants, he led the defensive line with six tackles (four solo). A week earlier in the season opener at Philadelphia, Hall tallied a career-high 10 tackles (six solo) and one forced fumble. Hall's 10 tackles were the most as a Ram.

MARC BULGER

PRECISION PASSER



QB Marc Bulger's 62.6 completion percentage ranks second in team history and is the ninth-best career completion percentage in the NFL among active QBs. In 2007, Bulger established a single-game career-high with an 81.8 completion percentage (27 of 33 passing) in Week 10 at New Orleans (11/11). Bulger threw for 302 yards and two touchdowns in the contest en route to earning NFC Offensive Player of the Week honors.

Bulger threw for 295 yards in Week 11 at San Francisco to give him 20,293 passing yards for his career. Bulger surpassed 20,000 career passing yards in 81 games becoming the fifth-fastest quarterback to reach the milestone behind Dan Marino (74), Kurt Warner (76), Peyton Manning (78) and Daunte Culpepper (80).

TD MACHINE

This season, Bulger has thrown for 10 touchdown passes, giving him 116 for his career. In 2007, Bulger surpassed Kurt Warner for fourth in Rams history in touchdown passes. Bulger passed Warner's 102 TD passes with a 12-yard scoring strike to WR Isaac Bruce in the second quarter of the Week 16 contest vs. Pittsburgh (12/20). Bulger would go on to throw for three touchdown passes, the highest touchdown total for the QB since he threw for four vs. Washington (12/26/06). Last week vs. San Francisco, QB Marc Bulger caught his second pass of the season. The game marked Bulger's second consecutive contest with a pass reception. In the third quarter, WR Dane Looker took a handoff from RB Steven Jackson, who lined up behind the center in the "Wildcat" offensive formation. After taking the handoff Looker ran to his right before finding Bulger, who was lined up as a wide receiver, for a 6-yard gain.

In Week 15 vs. Seattle, Bulger caught his first pass of the season. In the second quarter, WR Dane Looker passed to Bulger on an 11-yard reception, with Bulger dragging his feet to stay in bounds. The reception was the third reception for Bulger in his career, with the other two being batted passes back to him where he caught the ball.

Bulger is the fifth quarterback this season that has caught a pass, and Bulger is the only quarterback to catch more than one pass this season. He is only the second quarterback to make a catch for positive yards.
