JACKSONVILLE JAGUARS (2-3) VS. ST. LOUIS RAMS (0-5)

Sunday, October 18 ■ Jacksonville Municipal Stadium (67,246) ■ 1:00 p.m. EDT

The Jaguars play a second consecutive game against a NFC West foe as they return home to face the St. Louis Rams on Sunday, October 18. Kickoff is set for 1:00 EDT. The Rams are the only NFL team that has never played a regular season game in Jacksonville.

The Jaguars fell to 2-3 with a 41-0 loss last Sunday at Seattle. The Jaguars were shut out for only the third time in franchise history. WR Torry Holt finished with a season-high seven receptions for 95 yards. With starting LB Justin Durant out with a hip injury and LB Clint Ingram seeing limited time with an ankle injury, rookie Russell Allen and fourth-year pro Brian Iwuh tied for the team-lead with 12 tackles.

The Jaguars have 27 new faces on the roster including four rookies in the starting lineup. CB Derek Cox and DT Terrance Knighton have started all five games while OT Eben Britton has started four of five games. First-round pick OT Eugene Monroe was inactive in week four with an illness and saw limited action against the Seahawks.

The Jaguars are tied for second in the AFC with nine takeaways in the opening five games and rank tied for third with a plus-two turnover differential. Cox leads the club with three takeaways including two interceptions and LB Daryl Smith has a team-high 51 tackles. RB Maurice Jones-Drew leads the team with 330 rushing yards and is tied for fourth in the NFL with five touchdowns.

TELEVISION: The game will be broadcast regionally on FOX, locally on WAWS (Ch. 30 cable) if not blacked out. **Ron Pitts** will handle play-by-play duties with **John Lynch** providing analysis.

RADIO: Sunday's game will be broadcast on the Jaguars Radio Network which extends to 11 affiliates in Florida and Georgia. The Jaguars' flagship stations are WOKV AM & FM (690, 106.5). **Brian Sexton** (play-by-play) and former Jaguars defensive end **Jeff Lageman** (analyst) are in their seventh season together calling Jaguars games.

HOLT FACES FORMER TEAM: Jaguars WR **Torry Holt** played 10 seasons for the St. Louis Rams after being selected with the sixth overall pick in the 1999 draft. Holt played in 158 games for the club over 10 seasons and totaled 869 receptions for 12,660 yards and 74 touchdowns. He ranked second in Rams history for receptions, receiving yards, yards from scrimmage (12,717) and all-purpose yards (12,732). During his tenure, he started 10 postseason games and was a member of the 1999 Super Bowl XXXIV Championship team. He ranked second in Rams postseason history with 47 receptions for 630 yards. He holds six of the top seven single-season marks for receptions and two of the top three for receiving yards. He holds the career record for 100-yard receiving games (46).

JAGUARS LOOK FOR VICTORY BEFORE BYE WEEK: The Jaguars will observe their bye on Sunday, October 25. The Jaguars own a 9-5 mark in the game before the open date in 14 seasons, including a 4-2 mark under head coach Jack Del Rio. The Jaguars have won four consecutive games before the open date including a 24-17 win at Denver in 2008.

NEXT UP: The Jaguars will observe their bye week on October 25. It marks the fourth time in the last seven seasons the open date is in October.

NEW CROP OF JAGUARS: Of the Jaguars' 53 roster players, 27 are new to the team. Only 11 of the 22 players who started on opening day in 2008 are back. In addition, the Jaguars have added 12 players, 10 on the active roster, since training camp began.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- A Jaguars win would improve their record to 3-3, the sixth time in seven seasons under head coach Jack Del Rio the club would be .500 or above after six games.
- A Jaguars win would improve their record to 10-5 in games before the bye week including a 5-2 mark under Del Rio.
- WR Torry Holt needs one reception to extend his streak fo consecutive games with a reception to 159 games.
- Holt needs 34 receiving yards to become the third-fastest player in NFL history with 13,000 career receiving yards. Sunday will be his 164th career game.
- RB Maurice Jones-Drew needs 89 rushing yards to move into second place in team history, surpassing James Stewart (2,951).
- Jones-Drew needs 43 all-purpose yards to move into third place in team history, surpassing Keenan McCardell (6,495).

INSIDE THE NUMBERS

- The Jaguars have won 10 of the last 13 games when they score 20-plus points including a 2-0 mark this season.
- The Jaguars rank tied for ninth in the NFL with three scoring drives of four plays or less.
- The Jaguars have scored first in three of five games this season and are 36-10 under head coach Jack Del Rio when they score first.
- The Jaguars own a 35-6 record since 2003 when they score 20-plus points **and** control the ball for 30 minutes or more including two consecutive wins.
- The Jaguars have 51 rushes of four-plus yards, 16 of 10-plus yards, five of 20-plus yards and one of 50-plus yards.
- The Jaguars have 65 plays of 10-plus yards (T-10th in NFL) and 17 plays of 20-plus yards (T-10th in NFL).
- The Jaguars have nine 10-play drives which have resulted in 43 points.
- The Jaguars have scored on 12 of 15 trips to the red zone through five games (8 TDs, 4 FGs).

HEAD COACH STEVE SPAGNUOLO: Steve Spagnuolo was named the 25th head coach in franchise history on January 19, 2009. Spagnuolo was defensive coordinator of the New York Giants from 2007-08. In 2007, the Giants' defense ranked seventh in the NFL in yards allowed and led the league with 53 quarterback sacks. The Giants beat the undefeated New England Patriots in Super Bowl XLII. Prior to joining the Giants, Spagnuolo spent eight seasons (1999-2006) with the Philadelphia Eagles, serving as defensive assistant/safeties from 1999-2000, defensive backs coach from 2001-03 and linebackers coach from 2004-06. He served as defensive line/special teams coach with the Barcelona Dragons of the WFLA in 1992 and was defensive coordinator/linebackers coach for NFL Europe's Frankfurt Galaxy in 1998. He started his pro career as a pro personnel intern with the Washington Redskins in 1983 and was a scout with the San Diego Chargers in 1993. He spent time on the collegiate level with Massachusetts (1982-83), Lafayette (1984-86), Connecticut (1987-91), Maine (1993-94), Rutgers (1994-95) and Bowling Green (1996-97).

FLORIDA CONNECTIONS ON RAMS ROSTER: The Rams have two players with ties to Florida: LT Alex Barron (Florida State) and DT Leger Douzable (Tampa, Alonzo High, Central Florida).

MISSOURI CONNECTIONS ON JAGUARS ROSTER: The Jaguars have two players with ties to Missouri: DT Atiyah Ellison (St. Louis, Parkway South, Missouri) and CB Scott Starks (St. Louis, Hazelwood East) ... Defensive line coach Ted Monachino was a three-year letterman as a defensive lineman at Missouri and graduated in 1990. He was born in Council Bluffs and started his coaching career at Hannibal High (1990, 1994-95) and Pacific High (1991-93) ... Offensive coordinator Dirk Koetter served in the same capacity at Missouri from 1989-93 ... Assistant defensive backs coach Thom Kaumeyer was a sixth round pick of the Rams in 1989.

COACHING CONNECTIONS: Jaguars head coach Jack Del Rio served as defensive coordinator at Carolina in 2002 while Rams LB Will Witherspoon played there ... Jaguars wide receivers coach Todd Monken was on the staff at Oklahoma State while Rams TE Billy Bajema played there ... Jaguars quarterbacks coach Mike Shula served as head coach at Alabama while Rams RB Kenneth Darby played there ... Rams T Adam Goldberg played at Minnesota from 2004-05 while Jaguars assistant head coach/tight ends Mike Tice was the head coach ... Tice, Rams offensive line coach Steve Loney, and Rams wide receivers coach Charlie Baggett were on the same staff together at Minnesota ... Jaguars offensive coordinator Dirk Koetter was head coach at Arizona State from 2001-03 while Rams FB Mike Karney played there ... Jaguars running backs coach Kennedy Pola was on the staff at Southern California while Rams DT LaJuan Ramsey played there ... Jaguars defensive line coach Ted Monachino played at Missouri while Rams defensive coordinator Ken Flajole was on the coaching staff in 1989 ... Jaguars defensive coordinator Mel Tucker, Rams wide receivers coach Charlie Baggett and Rams offensive coordinator Pat Shurmur shared the same sideline at Michigan State in 1997 ... Jaguars linebackers coach Mark Duffner and Rams running backs coach Sylvester Croom were on the staff together at Green Bay in 2003 ... Croom was on the staff at Alabama from 1984-86 while Jaguars quarterbacks coach Mike Shula played there ... Rams defensive backs/cornerbacks coach Clayton Lopez was on the staff at Detroit in 2008 while Jaguars S Gerald Alexander played there.

THE LAST TIME - JAGUARS/RAMS

- The Jaguars snapped a two-game win streak with a 24-21 road loss to the St. Louis Rams on October 30, 2005.
- The Rams jumped out to a quick 7-0 lead after Drew Wahlroos blocked Chris Hanson's punt on the Jaguars opening possession and Brandon Chillar returned it 29 yards for the score. The Jaguars responded on the second play of the ensuing drive with a 71-yard touchdown run by Fred Taylor, who finished with a season-high 165 rushing yards.
- On the third play of the first offensive drive for St. Louis, Jamie Martin hit Kevin Curtis on a 83-yard touchdown pass, which was the longest touchdown pass against the Jaguars in team history. The Jaguars went scoreless in their next four drives which ended with a fumble, a failed fourth-and-one try, a punt and the first of two missed field goal attempts by Josh Scobee. The Rams also struggled while punting twice and Martin was intercepted twice by Rashean Mathis.
- The Jaguars put together a seven-play, 63-yard drive off the second interception which was capped off with a 20-yard touchdown pass from Byron Leftwich to Ernest Wilford. Wilford finished the day with six receptions for 145 yards, both career highs. The Rams responded with an eight-play, 51-yard drive and a 41-yard Jeff Wilkins field goal as the half ended.
- The Jaguars took a 21-17 lead in the third quarter on a 15-yard touchdown pass to Matt Jones, but Leftwich was intercepted by Mike Furrey at the start of the fourth quarter. The Rams scored the eventual game-winning touchdown on a 19-yard touchdown pass from Martin to Steven Jackson.
- The Jaguars failed to tie the score after a 44-yard missed field goal and turned the ball over on downs at the Rams' 45-yard line with 1:21 left in the game. Jackson ran 51-yards on first down to finish with 179 yards rushing on the day and seal the victory.ed the scoring with two more field goals of 29 and 41 yards.

WEEK 5 REVIEW/TORRY HOLT PLAYER NOTES

JAGUARS SNAP TWO-GAME WIN STREAK

- The Jaguars snapped a two-game win streak with a 41-0 loss last Sunday at Seattle. It marked only the third shutout in team history and dropped the club to 2-3 through five games.
- The Jaguars held the Seahawks to six points on their first five possessions but the Seahawks scored touchdowns on four of their next five drives. The Jaguars turned the ball over twice which led to two touchdowns and managed only 199 yards of total offense.
- The Seahawks scored the game's first points on a 47-yard field goal by Olindo Mare midway through the first quarter. The Jaguars responded with a nine-play, 68-yard drive highlighted by a 25-yard pass from David Garrard to Torry Holt. The Jaguars failed to convert a fourth-and-one at the Seahawks two-yard line.
- Mare increased the lead to 6-0 with a 27-yard field goal early in the second quarter. The Jaguars had two consecutive three-and-outs and the Seahawks countered with touchdowns. Matt Hasselbeck found T.J. Houshmandzadeh for a 34-yard touchdown and Nate Burleson for a 44-yard score on back-to-back possessions to take a 20-0 halftime lead.
- The Jaguars moved the ball inside Seahawks territory on their opening drive of the second half but Garrard fumbled on a first down play and the Seahawks recovered. Three plays later, Hasselbeck hooked up with Houshmandzadeh for a 13-yard score.
- Following a three-and-out by the Jaguars, Burleson scored on a five-yard reception with 5:59 left in the third quarter. On the ensuing possession, the Jaguars moved the ball to the Seahawks eight-yard line but Garrard was sacked and fumbled. Nick Reed picked it up and raced 79 yards for the game's final points.
- Garrard finished 18 of 31 for 188 yards and was sacked four times. He has 30 or more attempts in 15 of the last 18 games. Maurice Jones-Drew had 12 carries for 34 yards and five receptions for 23 yards. Torry Holt produced a season-high seven receptions for 95 yards.
- The following players were inactive: WR Mike Sims-Walker, LB Justin Durant, CB Scott Starks, S Sean Considine, LB Adam Seward, G Kynan Forney, OT Jordan Black and DT Greg Peterson.
- Tra Thomas made his second consecutive start at left tackle. LB Brian Iwuh made his second career start and rookie LB Russell Allen started his first career game.
- DT Derek Landri recorded his third career sack, stopping Hasselbeck for a five-yard loss in the second quarter.
- RB Montell Owens had a team-high four special teams tackles while rookie Courtney Greene finished with three tackles.
- P Adam Podlesh had eight punts for a 45.5 net including two downed inside the 20. The eight punts tied for the second-most of his career.

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL: The Jaguars are tied for the NFL-lead with only one interception thrown through the first five weeks, joining Denver and Green Bay. The Jaguars rank tied for 13th in the NFL with seven turnovers (6 fumbles, 1 interception).

TORRY AND THE BOYS: Youth is definitely being served with the Jaguars group of wide receivers. Of the five receivers on the roster, only veteran **Torry Holt** has more than three years of experience. **Mike Sims-Walker** is in his third season and has played in 13 career games including four this season. Rookies **Mike Thomas**, **Jarett Dillard** and **Tiquan Underwood** round out the group. Holt has played in 163 career games.

HOLT LEADS WIDE RECEIVER CORPS: Seven-time Pro Bowl selection **Torry Holt** signed with the Jaguars on April 20. Holt, who is in his 11th NFL season, ranks 10th in NFL history with 891 receptions and 12th with 12,966 receiving yards with 74 touchdowns. He ranks first in NFL history with 79.5 average receiving yards per game. Additional notes on Holt:

- Surpassed Keenan McCardell for 10th place in NFL history for receptions in week four against Tennessee.
- Moved into 12th place in NFL history for receiving yards in week three at Houston, surpassing Irving Fryar (12,785).
- Recorded 46 career 100-yard receiving games.
- Recorded 80-plus receptions in eight of 10 seasons and 90-plus receptions in six seasons.
- Started 10 postseason games and was a member of the Rams; 1999 Super Bowl XXXIV Championship team.
- Reached 12,000 career receiving yards in his 146th career game, the second-fastest player in NFL history to accomplish the feat.
- Needs 694 more receiving yards in 2009 to become only the sixth player in NFL history to record nine consecutive seasons with 1,000-plus receiving yards.

LOOKING FOR 13,000: **Torry Holt** has played in 163 games and needs 34 receiving yards on Sunday to become the third-fastest player in NFL history to reach 13,000 career receiving yards. Holt reached 11,000 career receiving yards faster than any player (131 games) and was the second-fastest to reach 12,000 career receiving yards as he did it his 146th career game.

■ The NFL approved the request for him to go by his legal name in 2009. His jersey, which previously just read Walker, reflects the change. Sims-Walker's father died of colon cancer in 2008.

END ZONE ASSAULT

Maurice Jones-Drew is tied for third in the NFL with five touchdowns including four in the last two games. Jones-Drew has four touchdowns in the last three games. Additional notes include:

■ He ranks third in franchise history with 45 career touchdowns (39 rushing, 4 receiving, 2 kickoff returns) in only 52 games.

■ Recorded multiple touchdowns in nine career games and the Jaguars own a 7-2 record in those games.

■ Tied his career-high with three rushing touchdowns in week three at Houston including a 61-yard touchdown run, the second-longest of his career (74t, 12/24/06 vs. New England). It was the longest play for the Jaguars since 12/23/07 against Oakland when Fred Taylor had a 62-yard rushing touchdown, a span of 19 games.

■ Ranked second in franchise history with 39 career rushing touchdowns in 52 games.

■ In 2008, he finished tied for sixth in the NFL, third in the AFC, with 14 touchdowns (12 rushing, 2 receiving).

■ First player in franchise history to have at least nine rushing touchdowns in three consecutive seasons.

■ Ranked first in franchise history with 5.3 average points per game.

OFFENSE THRIVES UNDER DIRK KOETTER

The Jaguars rank in the top five among NFL offenses the last three seasons under offensive coordinator **Dirk Koetter**. A former head coach at Arizona State, Koetter joined the Jaguars in 2007.

In his first season with the Jaguars, Koetter directed a record-breaking season by the offense. The Jaguars set a franchise single-season record for points (411, 25.7 avg.), touchdowns (50), touchdown passes (28) and yards per play (5.6).

The Jaguars rank fifth in the AFC from 2007-09 with an average of 336.9 yards per game, fifth with 89 total offensive touchdowns and seventh with only 52 turnovers.

TWO-WEEK BLITZ: The Jaguars won two straight games behind an explosive offense, outscoring Houston 31-24 and Tennessee 37-17 in consecutive weeks. The Jaguars scored 30-plus points in back-to-back games for the first time since 2006 and scored four-plus touchdowns in consecutive games for the first time since the end of the 2007 season. The Jaguars averaged 420.5 yards in the two games, the fourth-highest mark in the NFL, and tied for second with eight touchdowns during that span.

JACKSONVILLE JAGUARS TEAM NOTES

COX MAKES QUICK IMPACT: Third-round pick **Derek Cox** has wasted little time making an impact on the club's defense through five games. Cox leads all rookies and ranks tied for fourth in the NFL with three takeaways (2 interceptions, 1 fumble recovery) and tied for ninth with two interceptions. Cox recorded two takeaways on the first two possessions of his NFL career at Indianapolis in the season-opener. After the Colts moved the ball to the Jaguars four-yard line on their opening drive, Cox intercepted Peyton Manning in the end zone. On the ensuing drive, Cox recovered a Joseph Addai fumble caused by Quentin Groves. Additional notes include:

- Second-highest drafted player in William & Mary history with only current New Orleans Saints safety Darren Sharper taken higher (2nd, 1997, Green Bay).
- Cox, Sharper and Arizona's long snapper Mike Leach are the only current NFL players from William & Mary.
- Jaguars traded with New England to move up to select Cox.
- Finished with a seven tackles (six solo) with an interception and one pass defended in week four against Tennessee and followed with a career-high eight tackles last Sunday at Seattle.

SEASONED TRIO OF LINEBACKERS

Perhaps the strongest position on defense for the Jaguars is at linebacker. The club returns three seasoned players in **Justin Durant**, **Clint Ingram** and **Daryl Smith** who have made a combined 141 career starts. Here's a closer look at the starters:

■ **Daryl Smith** - Leads the team with 51 tackles and career-high three forced fumbles through five games including a team-high 12 tackles in week four against Tennessee. He forced a fumble of Texans RB Chris Brown on the goal line in week three at Houston and recovered the ball in the end zone to seal the win. He has started 79 of 81 games since being selected in the second round of the 2004 draft. He has missed only three games in six seasons due to injuries and has started on the outside and in the middle. He has recorded 663 tackles, 13 sacks, three interceptions, six forced fumbles and four fumble recoveries. He has a streak of four straight seasons with 100-plus tackles.

■ **Justin Durant** - Third-year pro moved to the middle in 2009 and is second on the team with 48 tackles along with one forced fumble. He was inactive last Sunday at Seattle with a hip injury. He has started 24 of 31 games and recorded 231 tackles, one sack, two forced fumbles and one interception since being selected in the second round of the 2007 draft. He led the team in 2008 with seven tackles for loss and ranked third on the club with 113 tackles. In 2007, he led the team with 31 postseason tackles in two games.

■ **Clint Ingram** - A third round pick in 2006, Ingram has started 38 of 48 games including a career-high 12 starts in 2008. He has recorded 282 career tackles with 5.5 sacks and two interceptions. He registered his first sack of the season in week three at Houston and finished with eight tackles.

MARCEDES LEWIS BECOMING DOWN FIELD THREAT: Tight end **Mercedes Lewis** had a plan heading into the 2009 offseason; no more coast to coast trips to California. The former 2006 first-round pick stayed in Jacksonville in the offseason, getting extra work with quarterback David Garrard and working out under the direction of first-year strength and conditioning coach Luke Richesson. The hard work is paying off as Lewis has 14 receptions for 192 yards (13.7 avg.) with two touchdowns through five games. He is tied with **Torry Holt** for the team-lead with three receptions of 25-plus yards. He finished with a career-high 76 yards on four receptions in week four at Tennessee with a career-long 33-yard touchdown. Additional notes on Lewis include:

- Had his most productive season as a pro in 2008, finishing with a career-high 41 receptions for 489 yards and two touchdowns.
- Totaled 105 career receptions for 1,198 yards with seven touchdowns.
- Became only the 12th player in franchise history with 100 receptions last Sunday against Tennessee and only the third tight end (Kyle Brady, 241; Pete Mitchell, 191).
- Finished with three receptions for 62 yards with a 25-yard touchdown catch in week two against Arizona.
- Has dropped eight pounds since last season.
- In 2008, he was the first Jaguars tight end since Kyle Brady (43, 2002) to have 40-plus receptions in a season and had the most receiving yards by a tight end since 2000 (Brady, 729).

JACKSONVILLE JAGUARS HEAD COACH JACK DEL RIO

DEL RIO IN SEVENTH SEASON AS HEAD COACH: Jack Del Rio is in his seventh season as the Jaguars' head coach with a regular season record of 52-49. Del Rio was named to the post on January 17, 2003, becoming the second head coach in Jaguars history.

He is one of just eleven current NFL head coaches to earn 50 wins. In 2007, the Jaguars posted an 11-5 regular season record to earn the second playoff berth in three years, in addition to the franchise's first playoff win since the 1999 season. The Jaguars are one of only seven teams to rank in the top 13 in both offense and defense since 2003.

Del Rio is now in his 24th year in the NFL, his 13th as a coach. Del Rio spent 11 years as an NFL linebacker and had a standout college career at the University of Southern California. He previously coached in New Orleans (1997-98), Baltimore (1999-2001), and Carolina (2002). He was the Panthers' defensive coordinator, and in his only season with the club the defense improved from last in the NFL to second, the biggest one-season defensive improvement in NFL history. Del Rio was the linebackers coach for three seasons in Baltimore, where the Ravens' defense also ranked second each season. He helped the team win Super Bowl XXXV over the New York Giants and coached the Ravens' talented linebackers, overseeing the development of Peter Boulware, Jamie Sharper and Ray Lewis, the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year in 2000 and the MVP of Super Bowl XXXV. Prior to coaching, Del Rio played 11 seasons in the NFL, with New Orleans (1985-86), Kansas City (1987-88), Dallas (1989-1991) and Minnesota (1992-95), playing in the Pro Bowl following the 1994 season.

Del Rio was a starter at linebacker for Southern California (1981-84), where he earned All-America honors, was a runner-up for the Lombardi Award and co-MVP of the 1985 Rose Bowl. Del Rio is one of three NFL head coaches (Jeff Fisher, Mike Holmgren) who graduated from USC. Del Rio has learned from some of the best coaches in all of football. He was recruited to USC and played for John Robinson, and in the NFL he played under Bum Phillips, Jim Mora, Jimmy Johnson and Dennis Green. As an assistant coach, he has worked for Hall of Famer Mike Ditka and Super Bowl winner Brian Billick, as well as Super Bowl participant John Fox. Among other notable coaches Del Rio has worked with are Dom Capers, Tony Dungy, Dave Wannstedt, Monte Kiffin, Mike Tice, Tom Moore, Norv Turner and Butch Davis. Drafted by baseball's Toronto Blue Jays, Del Rio batted .340 while playing catcher on USC's baseball team in 1983 and 1984 with future stars Randy Johnson and Mark McGwire. He was a third-round choice by the New Orleans Saints in 1985 and was named to the NFL's All-Rookie team.

GENE SMITH IN 1ST SEASON AS GENERAL MANAGER

Jacksonville Jaguars owner **Wayne Weaver** promoted **Gene Smith** to general manager and senior vice president, player personnel on January 12, 2009.

Smith, 45, has served in several roles in the Jaguars' personnel department since 1994. One of 14 current staff members who joined the organization in its first year, Smith came to Jacksonville as the team's scouting representative for the BLESTO scouting organization. He became a Jaguars college scout in 1996, and was promoted in 2000 to director of college scouting. In 2008, Smith was promoted to the position of executive director/college and pro personnel.

The personnel department includes: **Terry McDonough** (Director, Player Personnel), **Louis Clark** (Assistant Director, Pro Personnel), and **Tim Minge** (Assistant Director, College Personnel).

JAGUARS 2009 DRAFT CLASS: The Jaguars selected nine players in the 2009 NFL Draft including seven players on Sunday in the final five rounds. **All nine players are on the active roster and two have started the first five games.** Seven offensive players and two defensive players were selected. The seven offensive players tied for the most taken by the club in franchise history (1995).

OT Eugene Monroe (Round 1, 8th overall, Virginia)

■ Started at left tackle in first three games and missed week four with an illness. Saw limited action last Sunday at Seattle in a reserve role. Four-year letterman and three-year starter at Virginia. One of six offensive linemen taken in the first round and third overall (behind Jason Smith and Andre Smith).

OT Eben Britton (Round 2, 39th overall, Arizona)

■ Started first three games at right tackle and was inactive in week four with a knee injury. Returned to starting lineup last Sunday at Seattle. First offensive lineman taken in the second round and seventh overall. Can play both left and right tackle as well as guard.

DT Terrance Knighton (Round 3, 72nd overall, Temple)

■ Started first five games. Four-year letterman and three-year starter. Played in 46 games and finished with 26 tackles for loss.

CB Derek Cox (Round 3, 73rd overall, William & Mary)

■ Started first five games and had two interceptions and a fumble recovery. Jaguars traded up with New England to select him. Three-year starter and second-highest drafted player in school history (Darren Sharper, 2nd, 1997). Had nine interceptions in college.

WR Mike Thomas (Round 4, 107th overall, Arizona)

■ Has played the last three games and started two at receiver and return specialist. Pac-10's all-time leader in receptions with 259. Scored touchdowns three different ways as a senior (4 receiving, 2 punt returns, 1 kick return).

WR Jarett Dillard (Round 5, 144th overall, Rice)

■ Saw action the last three weeks and totaled three receptions for 43 yards. Set NCAA record with 60 career touchdown receptions.

TE Zach Miller (Round 6, 180th overall, Nebraska-Omaha)

■ Former college quarterback rushed for a school-record 50 touchdowns as a senior.

RB Rashad Jennings (Round 7, 250th overall, Liberty)

■ Led Jaguars with nine carries for 53 yards in week four against Tennessee. Rushed for 4,044 yards and 43 touchdowns. Spent freshman season at Pittsburgh before transferring to Liberty.

WR Tiquan Underwood (Round 7, 253rd overall, Rutgers)

■ Saw first NFL action on 9/27 at Houston and returned two kicks for 19.0 average. Four-year letterman was selected with one of two compensatory picks. Had 132 receptions for 16 touchdowns in college.

BUILDING THE LOCKERROOM: The Jaguars have 13 rookies on their 53-man roster but they don't lack veteran leadership. General manager Gene Smith and head coach Jack Del Rio brought in several veterans in the offseason led by wide receiver Torry Holt, tackle Tra Thomas and safety Sean Considine.

Del Rio remembers entering the NFL in 1985 as a third round pick of the New Orleans Saints and players like Glen Redd, Rickey Jackson and Scott Pelluer serving as a mentor for him. "These guys are great human beings that are consummate pros, that are going to be good citizens in our community," said Del Rio. "They're going to come in, they're going to bust their butt every day for us on the practice field, in the locker room. They know what it takes to win."

RUNNING BACK MAURICE JONES-DREW

JONES-DREW IN STARRING ROLE: RB Maurice Jones-Drew serves as the lead running back in 2009 after sharing time with former RB Fred Taylor the previous three seasons. Jones-Drew, a second-round pick in 2006, has 605 career rushes for 2,863 yards and 39 touchdowns, 169 receptions for 1,528 yards and four touchdowns and 75 kickoff returns for 26.0 average and two touchdowns.

JONES-DREW PRODUCES IN STARTING ROLE: Maurice Jones-Drew has started the first five games and averaged 90.0 yards from scrimmage, leading the team in rushing yards (330) and touchdowns (5). He scored his fifth touchdown of the season in week four against Tennessee with a nine-yard run in the first quarter. Additional notes:

■ Rushed for 119 yards on 9/27 at Houston and tied his career-high with three touchdowns (11/9/08 at Detroit). Jones-Drew scored on a 61-yard run in the second quarter, a one-yard rush in the third quarter and an eight-yard run up the middle in the fourth quarter.

AWARDED FOR THE EFFORT: Maurice Jones-Drew was named FedEx Ground Player of the Week and earned his first AFC Offensive Player of the Week Award following his performance at Houston in week three. Jones-Drew rushed for 119 yards and tied his career-high with three rushing touchdowns including a 61-yard run.

ROOKIE JENNINGS LEARNING THE WAY: Seventh-round pick Rashad Jennings shares the same agent with Maurice Jones-Drew and the players spent quality time in the offseason training together. Prior to the NFL Combine in February, the players trained at Perfect Competition in Miami and they returned throughout the offseason after becoming teammates. Jennings led the Jaguars in rushing in week four against Tennessee with 53 yards on nine carries against the Titans including a 14-yard run.

Jennings started his career at Pittsburgh in 2005 before transferring to Liberty. He played in 31 games with Liberty and rushed for a Big South Conference record 3,633 yards on 633 attempts (5.7 avg.) with 42 touchdowns. He set a conference-record with 22 career 100-yard rushing games including 10 as a senior.

DE LA SALLE WELL-REPRESENTED: RB Maurice Jones-Drew and DT Derek Landri are two of five current NFL players that played at De La Salle High School in Concord, California. Landri played both offense and defensive line while Jones-Drew starred at running back and defensive back. The duo never lost a high school game, winning a national high school record 125 consecutive games. Other NFL players from De La Salle include QB Matt Gutierrez (Kansas City), LB D.J. Williams (Denver) and WR Demetrius Williams (Baltimore).

QUARTERBACK DAVID GARRARD

DAVID GARRARD TIDBITS

Quarterback David Garrard is in his third season as the starter after starting all 16 games in 2008. Garrard, a fourth-round pick in 2002, has played in 61 games with 51 starts over seven seasons and owns a 26-25 career record. His career totals include 956 of 1,568 passing for 10,801 yards with 56 touchdowns and 30 interceptions for a 85.5 passer rating. Here are additional notes:

■ Recorded career-best passing numbers in 2008 with 335 completions on 535 attempts for 3,620 yards with 15 touchdowns and 13 interceptions. Garrard ranked third on the team with a career-high 73 rushes for 322 yards and two touchdowns. Garrard had a 60-plus completion percentage or higher in 11 of the 16 games including five games with a 70-plus completion percentage.

■ Was the first Jaguars quarterback since Mark Brunell in 2000 to start all 16 games in a season.

■ Led the Jaguars to two comeback wins in 2008. Garrard engineered the offense twice to set up game-winning field goals by Josh Scobee in both games.

■ Garrard led the club to a 9-3 mark in 12 starts in 2007 and helped the club earn its first postseason win since 1999.

■ Has thrown for multiple touchdowns in 16 career games including twice in 2009 with two touchdowns in week two against Arizona this season and he tied his career-high with three touchdowns in week four against Tennessee. The Jaguars own a 12-4 record in those games.

■ Ranked third in franchise history for attempts (535) in a single season, second in completions (335) and third in passing yards (3,620).

■ Has played against 27 different NFL teams and will play St. Louis for the first time on Sunday. The only teams Garrard has never played against are Dallas, New Orleans and Washington.

■ Ranks second in franchise history in completions (956), passing yards (10,801) and touchdown passes (56).

■ Set the franchise single-season record for highest passer rating (102.2) and highest completion percentage (64.0) in 2007.

■ Finished with the second lowest interception percentage in a season in 2007 for any quarterback in NFL history with 300+ attempts at 0.92 (3 interceptions in 325 attempts). The lowest was 0.90 by Steve DeBerg in 1990 (4 interceptions in 444 attempts).

■ Holds the team record at eight consecutive games without throwing an interception.

■ Recorded a 100-plus rating in a career-high seven games in 2007.

GARRARD SURPASSES 10,000 PASSING YARDS: QB David Garrard completed 23 of 43 passes against Arizona in week two for 282 yards with two touchdowns. Garrard joined Mark Brunell (25,698) as the only two quarterbacks in franchise history to throw for 10,000-plus yards.

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL: David Garrard has not thrown an interception in 31 of his 51 career starts. He has thrown two or more interceptions in only six of 61 career games played.

BETTER LATE THAN NEVER: Jaguars quarterback David Garrard is one of 12 starting quarterbacks that was selected No. 90 overall or later in the NFL Draft. Garrard was a fourth round pick of the Jaguars in 2002, the 108th selection overall. PODLESH WINS PUNTER JOB: Adam Podlesh is in his third season as the club's punter after battling veteran Steve Weatherford for the job in the preseason. Podlesh missed the final five games of the 2008 season with a knee injury. He has a 41.7-yard average in five games this season with seven inside the 20 and one touchback on 23 punts. NEW LONG SNAPPER FOR JAGUARS: The Jaguars have a new long snapper in the regular season for the first time since 2001 as third-year pro **Jeremy Cain** outlasted veteran Joe Zelenka in the preseason. Cain has spent time with Chicago, Philadelphia, Tennessee and Washington and appeared in 22 games including five games this season. He played in eight games with Chicago from 2004-05. After not playing in 2006, he was signed by Tennessee in 2007 and played in the final 10 games including the postseason for the Titans.

'MAINE' MAN ON SPECIAL TEAMS: Fourth-year pro **Montell Owens** was a longshot to make the club's roster as a rookie free agent from Maine in 2006. Not only has he been a staple on the club's special teams ever since, he signed a contract extension in the offseason. Owens has played in 51 games and has 54 special teams tackles including a team-high nine through five games this season. He ranked second on the team in 2008 with 18 tackles and had two touchdowns. He made his first career reception on 9/21/08 at Indianapolis, a 10-yard catch that extended the game-winning drive. He scored his first career touchdown on a 41-yard run on 9/28/08 vs. Houston as a result of a fake-punt direct snap. On 11/2/08 at Cincinnati, he recovered a fumble on a kickoff and returned it 18 yards for a score.

PLAYER NOTES

RASHEAN MATHIS LEADS SECONDARY: Jaguars cornerback and team captain **Rashean Mathis** has recorded two takeaways including an interception in week three at Houston in the first quarter. Mathis recovered a fumble in week two against Arizona. Additional notes on Mathis:

- Mathis, who became the first Jaguars cornerback to be voted to the Pro Bowl in 2006, holds the franchise records with 26 career interceptions and three interceptions returned for touchdowns.
- Returned to the starting lineup after missing the final four games in 2008 with a knee injury. Despite missing four games, he tied for the team's lead with four interceptions and returned two of the interceptions for touchdowns.
- Grew up in Jacksonville and attended Englewood High School.
- Has started 95 games since being selected in the second round of the 2003 draft and has led the team in interceptions in four of the last five seasons.
- Picked off Peyton Manning on 9/21/08 at Indianapolis and returned it 61 yards for a touchdown, then intercepted Ben Roethlisberger against Pittsburgh on 10/5/08 on the opening possession and returned it 72 yards for the second-longest return in team history. He has recorded three of the four longest interception returns in franchise history.
- Was one of six NFL players to have two or more interception returns for touchdowns in 2008.
- Has recorded four two-interception games.

ANCHOR OF THE DEFENSE

Ninth-year defensive tackle John Henderson returns to anchor the Jaguars defense. Henderson, a two-time Pro Bowl selection, has played in 114 games with 110 starts since being selected in the first round of the 2002 draft. Additional notes on Henderson:

- Career totals include 523 tackles (392 solo), 26 sacks, four forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries, 42 passes defended and 37 tackles for loss.
- Has missed only three games in his career. He missed a game for the first time in his career at Denver on 9/16/07 with a head injury, snapping a streak of 82 consecutive games played.
- Played major role on defense that ranks seventh in the NFL from 2003-09, allowing 308.9 yards per game, and fifth in points allowed (19.1) during that span.
- Highest-drafted defensive lineman ever by the Jaguars.

HARVEY IN SECOND SEASON: Second-year defensive end **Derrick Harvey** had a full training camp under his belt in 2009, unlike his rookie season when he missed the first three preseason games with a contract holdout after being selected eighth overall. Harvey, 6-5, 281, played in the Jaguars final preseason game in 2008 and started nine of 16 games in the regular season. He led the team with 29 quarterback pressures and finished with 3.5 sacks. His nine starts were the second-most by a Jaguars defensive lineman in franchise history (John Henderson, 13, 2002). He concluded the season with two sacks at Baltimore on 12/28. In 2009, he leads the team with 10 quarterback hits through five games.

EARNING A JOB: Safety **Gerald Alexander** has started at strong safety for the Jaguars the last two weeks. Alexander finished with five tackles, one interception and a forced fumble in his first start in week four against Tennessee. Alexander saw extensive action the first three weeks and was inserted into the lineup with Sean Considine inactive with a groin injury. Alexander, a second-round pick of Detroit in 2007, started 16 games for the Lions as a rookie before missing the majority of the 2008 campaign with a fractured vertebra. He was traded to the Jaguars on June 29. He intercepted Donovan McNabb in the preseason at Philadelphia on 8/27 and returned it 40 yards to set up a touchdown.

MEESTER KEEPS PLUGGING ALONG

Center **Brad Meester** is the longest-tenured Jaguar on the roster. Meester was a second round pick in the 2000 draft by the Jaguars and joins G/OT **Maurice Williams**, DT **John Henderson** and QB **David Garrard** as the only players on the roster who were drafted by the Jaguars prior to 2003.

Meester ranks third in franchise history with 134 starts and holds the franchise record with 92 consecutive starts from 9/3/00 through 12/4/05. Here's the list of the top 10 most starts in franchise history.

NEW AND IMPROVED MANUWAI BACK IN THE LINEUP:

Vince Manuwai was back in his familiar spot at left guard in the pre-season for the first time since last year's season opener at Tennessee where he suffered a season-ending knee injury. Manuwai, 6-2, 333, lost more than 30 pounds over the past 11 months thanks to a better diet and workouts under Jaguars first-year strength and conditioning coach Luke Richesson.

EAGLES HAVE LANDED: The Jaguars signed two unrestricted free agents in the offseason and both played previously with the Philadelphia Eagles. Safety **Sean Considine** played in 46 games with 17 starts the past four seasons with the Eagles and also started two of five postseason games. Left tackle **Tra Thomas** was a mainstay on the Eagles offensive line for the past 11 seasons after being selected with the 11th overall pick in 1998. Thomas, 6-7, 316, has played in 170 games with 167 starts including the last two weeks and was selected to three Pro Bowls. He ranks tied for third among active NFL players with 17 postseason starts (Jon Runyan, 21; Brian Dawkins, 18).

JAGUARS GO WITH TWO QBs: The Jaguars started the 2009 season with only two quarterbacks (**David Garrard**, **Luke McCown**) on their opening day roster for the third consecutive season and third time overall. The Jaguars were one of eight NFL teams to start the season with only two quarterbacks on their roster, joining Chicago, Green Bay, New England, New Orleans, New York Giants, Philadelphia and Washington).

DEL RIO SELECTS TEAM CAPTAINS: Head coach Jack Del Rio selected the club's team captains prior to the season-opener and each player has a 'C' on his jersey. QB David Garrard, RB Maurice Jones-Drew, CB Rashean Mathis, FB Montell Owens and DE Reggie Hayward were named captains.

ROOKIES TAKE LEADING ROLE

The Jaguars started a franchise-record four rookies in the season-opener at Indianapolis in **OT Eben Britton**, **CB Derek Cox**, **DT Terrance Knighton** and **OT Eugene Monroe**. Cox and Knighton have started all five games while Monroe (illness) and Britton (knee) were inactive in week four against Tennessee. Britton returned to the starting lineup last Sunday at Seattle and Monroe saw limited action. The last rookies to start on opening day for the Jaguars were LB Daryl Smith and WR Reggie Williams on September 12, 2004 at Buffalo. Additional notes include:

- Britton and Monroe were the first pair of rookie tackles to start on opening day in the NFL since 1982 when Luis Sharpe and Tootie Robbins started for the St. Louis Cardinals.
- Knighton was the first rookie to start at defensive tackle on opening day in franchise history.
- Cox was only the second rookie to start at cornerback in franchise history. Fernando Bryant, the club's first-round pick in 1999, started the season-opener against San Francisco. Rashean Mathis started the first six games of his rookie year at safety before moving to cornerback.
- 12 Jaguars have played in their first NFL regular season games in 2009 including 11 rookies (Eugene Monroe, Eben Britton, Terrance Knighton, Derek Cox, Zach Miller, Tiquan Underwood, Russell Allen, Jarett Dillard, Mike Thomas, Rashad Jennings and Julius Williams). Second-year pro Atiyah Ellison saw his first career action at Indianapolis in the season-opener.

2009 DRAFT CLASS CONTINUES TO GROW: The 2009 NFL Draft officially ended with the selection of Mr. Irrelevant on April 26, but the Jaguars have continued to add draft picks to their roster. The Jaguars selected nine players in this year's draft and all nine players are on the 53-man roster. In addition, the club has added three players that were drafted by other teams in DB Don Carey (6th round, Cleveland), S Courtney Greene (7th round, Seattle) and CB William Middleton (5th round, Atlanta). Carey was placed on injured reserve on September 1.

BUILDING THROUGH THE DRAFT: The Jaguars had the highest number of own draft choices to start for any NFL team on Kickoff Weekend. Eighteen of the 22 players who started at Indianapolis were drafted by the Jaguars.

RUNNING BACKS — The Jaguars have four running backs on their roster and three of the four have been with the club since 2006. Seventh-round pick Rashad Jennings is the only newcomer to the group.

TIGHT ENDS — 2006 first round pick Mercedes Lewis is the only tight end that has played for the club since 2006.

WIDE RECEIVERS — Mike Sims-Walker is the only receiver on the roster that played for the Jaguars in 2008. Of the five receivers, three are rookies.

OFFENSIVE LINE — Five of the nine linemen were on the club's roster at the end of last season. The Jaguars have new starters in 2009 at both tackle positions in rookies Eugene Monroe and Eben Britton.

DEFENSIVE LINE — Seven players returned in 2009 including ninth-year pro Reggie Hayward (injured reserve) and eighth-year veteran John Henderson. Hayward was placed on injured reserve after suffering a leg injury in the season-opener. The Jaguars added third-year DT Greg Peterson on Sept. 29.

The three starters in Clint Ingram, Justin Durant and Daryl Smith started 15 games together the last three seasons. The Jaguars signed second-year LB Bryan Smith off the St. Louis Rams practice squad on Sept. 28

■ Signed by the Jaguars on Sept. 8. Eighth-year veteran has played in 113 games with 94 starts for Minnesota, Cleveland, Seattle and the Jaguars. Has started all 16 games five times including the last two seasons with Seattle at free safety.

LB Adam Seward (FA, Indianapolis)

■ Fifth-year pro signed as a free agent on August 24. Has played in 41 games in five seasons, totaling 29 special teams tackles with Carolina.

DT Montavious Stanley (FA, New Orleans)

■ Signed as a veteran free agent on July 23. Has played in 22 games with six starts. Career totals include 43 tackles, one sack, one forced fumble and two fumble recoveries.

OT Tra Thomas (UFA, Philadelphia)

■ Three-time Pro Bowl selection spent the past 11 seasons with Philadelphia. Has missed only eight games due to injuries. Has started 167 of 170 games and made 17 postseason starts.

TE Ernest Wilford (FA, Miami)

■ Sixth-year pro was originally a fourth-round pick of the Jaguars in 2004. Started his career at wide receiver before making switch to tight end with Miami in 2009 offseason. Has played in 75 games and totaled 146 receptions for 2,061 yards and 14 touchdowns.

POSITION-BY-POSITION

Here is a position-by-position breakdown of the 2009 Jaguars:

QUARTERBACKS (2)

■ The Jaguars had two quarterbacks on their opening day roster for the third consecutive season and third time overall. **David Garrard**, a fourth-round pick in 2002, is in his third season as the starter and has played every snap through five games. Garrard owns a 26-25 record as a starter with 56 touchdown passes and an 85.5 career passer rating. In 2009, Garrard has completed 100 of 169 passes for 1,129 yards with five touchdowns and one interception for a 86.6 rating. He threw for 323 yards and tied his career-high with three touchdown passes in week four against Tennessee.

■ Sixth-year veteran **Luke McCown** was acquired via trade from Tampa Bay on Sept. 6 and he backs up Garrard. McCown, fourth round pick of Cleveland in 2004, has played in 13 career games with seven starts including last Sunday at Seattle. He was acquired via trade by Tampa Bay in 2005. His career totals include 143 of 239 passing for 1,619 yards with nine touchdowns and 10 interceptions for a 75.3 rating.

RUNNING BACKS (4)

■ Four running backs are on the roster led by fourth-year pro **Maurice Jones-Drew**. Jones-Drew ranks second in the NFL with 45 touchdowns (39 rushing, 4 receiving, 2 returns) the past four seasons. Jones-Drew leads the team in rushing yards (330) and touchdowns (5) through five games. He opened the 2009 season with 123 yards from scrimmage at Indianapolis (97 rushing, 26 receiving) with a rushing touchdown. He rushed for 119 yards and three touchdowns on 9/27 at Houston including a 61-yard run.

■ Fullback **Greg Jones** returns for his sixth season and has career totals of 260 rushes for 889 yards and nine touchdowns. **Montell Owens** backs up Jones and excels on special teams. Owens, who didn't play in the preseason, leads the team with nine special teams tackles through five games.

■ Seventh-round pick **Rashad Jennings** earned a roster spot and backs up Jones-Drew and also sees time as a kick returner. Jennings led the Jaguars with 53 rushing yards on nine carries in week four against Tennessee. Jennings rushed for 3,633 yards and 42 touchdowns at Liberty with 22 100-yard rushing games.

WIDE RECEIVERS (5)

■ The Jaguars receiving corps was upgraded in the offseason with the addition of a seven-time Pro Bowler and three players through the draft. The club added **Torry Holt** through free agency and he is in his 11th NFL season, ranking 10th in NFL history in receptions (891) and 12th in receiving yards (12,966). He has played in 163 games with 150 starts and ranks first in NFL history with 79.4 average receiving yards per game.

■ **Mike Sims-Walker**, a 2007 third-round pick, ranks third on the team with 19 receptions for 278 yards and three touchdowns. Sims-Walker finished with a career-high two touchdowns in week four against Tennessee on seven receptions and was inactive last Sunday at Seattle for violation of team rules.

■ The Jaguars added three wideouts in the draft with **Mike Thomas** (4th round), **Jarett Dillard** (5th round) and **Tiquan Underwood** (7th round). Thomas finished as the Pac-10's all-time leader in receptions with 259 at Arizona. Dillard set a NCAA record with 60 career touchdown receptions. Underwood finished with 132 receptions and 16 touchdowns in four seasons for the Scarlet Knights.

TIGHT ENDS (3)

■ Former first-round pick **Mercedes Lewis** has emerged as a threat in the passing game as he ranked fourth on the team in 2008 with a career-high 41 receptions for 489 yards and two touchdowns. Lewis, the 28th overall pick in 2006, has 105 career receptions for 1,198 yards and seven touchdowns including a 33-yard touchdown in week four against Tennessee.

■ Sixth-round pick **Zach Miller** showed his athleticism in training camp as he makes the transition from college quarterback to tight end. Miller missed the final three preseason games and first two reg-

ular season games with a knee injury. He has seen extensive action the last three weeks and registered four receptions for 16 yards.

■ Former fourth round pick **Ernest Wilford** rejoined the Jaguars on August 25 after spending the 2008 season with Miami. Wilford has played in 75 career games with 37 starts and totaled 146 receptions for 2,061 yards and 14 touchdowns.

OFFENSIVE LINE (9)

■ The Jaguars offensive line has a different look in 2009 as several players return from injuries and the club added two players in the draft. Center **Brad Meester**, who ranks third in franchise history with 134 starts, starts at center in his 10th NFL season.

■ **Vince Manuwai** is entrenched as the left guard as he returns to the lineup. Ninth-year veteran **Maurice Williams** has started 100 of 106 games and has started at right tackle and right guard through five games. Williams started in week four against Tennessee at right tackle. Both Manuwai (knee) and Williams (biceps) suffered season-ending injuries in the 2008 season-opener at Tennessee and were placed on injured reserve. Third-year pro **Uche Nwaneri** was inserted into the lineup in 2008 and has started 17 of 30 career games including last Sunday at Seattle at right guard. Nwaneri has the ability to play both guard and center and has seen time at both this season.

■ The club selected tackles **Eugene Monroe** (1st round) and **Eben Britton** (2nd round) in the draft and they became the first rookies to start at tackle on opening day in franchise history. Both players were inactive in week four against Tennessee, Monroe with an illness and Britton with a knee injury. Britton returned to the starting lineup last Sunday at Seattle while Monroe saw limited action as a reserve. Monroe, a left tackle, was the eighth overall pick after starting for three seasons at Virginia. Britton was the seventh offensive lineman taken overall and has the ability to play right and left tackle as well as guard.

■ The club added veteran **Tra Thomas** in free agency and he backs up Monroe at left tackle and sees action in short-yardage situations. Thomas, a three-time Pro Bowl selection, has started 167 of 170 games including starts the last two weeks.

■ Veteran **Kynan Forney** was signed on Sept. 8 and he adds depth at guard. Forney has started 88 games at right guard the last nine seasons. **Jordan Black** has played in 57 games with 29 starts over six seasons and he can play multiple positions along the line.

DEFENSIVE LINE (9)

■ The Jaguars have a mix of veterans and youth along the defensive line. Two-time Pro Bowl selection **John Henderson** is in his eighth season with the club and he anchors the Jaguars defense.

Henderson has 26 career sacks in 114 games. Third-round pick **Terrance Knighton** started three seasons at Temple and he starts beside Henderson at tackle.

■ The group suffered a blow in the season-opener when ninth-year veteran **Reggie Hayward** was lost for the season with a leg injury. Hayward registered 39.5 career sacks.

■ The Jaguars added speed off the edge in the 2008 draft with first-round pick **Derrick Harvey** and second-round pick **Quentin Groves**. Harvey, the eighth overall pick, finished with 3.5 sacks as a rookie and a team-high 29 quarterback pressures. Groves, who recorded 26 career sacks at Auburn, finished with 2.5 sacks and 11 quarterback pressures in 2008.

■ **Derek Landri** added 20 pounds in the offseason and adds depth at tackle after playing in 33 games his first three seasons. Landri recorded his third career sack last Sunday at Seattle. Second-year pro **Atiyah Ellison** was signed by the Jaguars off San Francisco's practice squad on December 10.

■ The Jaguars added tackle **Montavious Stanley** in training camp and he has played in 22 games with six starts in three seasons. He recorded his first career sack in week three at Houston. Rookie defensive end **Julius Williams** was one of only two undrafted free agents to make the 53-man opening day roster. The Jaguars added third-year tackle **Greg Peterson** on Sept. 29.

POSITION-BY-POSITION

LINEBACKERS (7)

■ The Jaguars have three experienced players to head up the linebacker position. The outside is manned by sixth-year pro **Daryl Smith** and fourth-year pro **Clint Ingram**. Smith has started 79 of 81 career games and surpassed 100 tackles in four consecutive seasons. He leads the team through five games with 51 tackles. He leads the team with two forced fumbles including one in week three at Houston that he recovered in the end zone to seal the victory. Ingram has made 38 career starts including a career-high 12 in 2008.

■ Third-year pro **Justin Durant** starts in the middle after posting a career-high 113 tackles a year ago and he led the team with seven tackles for loss. He was inactive last Sunday at Seattle with a hip injury. He led the team in tackles in three of the first four games, with 14 at Indianapolis, 15 against Arizona and 10 at Houston. Fourth-year pro **Brian Iwuh** excels on special teams and adds depth in the middle. Iwuh has 46 special teams tackles in four seasons. He made his second career start last Sunday at Seattle and tied for the team-lead with 12 tackles as played every snap.

■ Fifth-year pro **Adam Seward** was signed on Aug. 24 after spending the past four seasons with Carolina. **Russell Allen** was one of two undrafted free agents to make the roster and he sees extensive action on special teams. Allen made his first career start last Sunday at Seattle and tied for the team-lead with 12 tackles. The Jaguars signed second-year pro **Bryan Smith** on Sept. 28 off the St. Louis Rams practice squad.

DEFENSIVE BACKS (11)

■ The secondary is led by seventh-year pro **Rashean Mathis**, regarded as one of the NFL's top cornerbacks. Mathis holds the franchise record with 26 career interceptions including one in week three at Houston. Mathis returned two interceptions for touchdowns in 2008.

■ The Jaguars moved up to select **Derek Cox** in the third round of this year's draft and he starts opposite Mathis. Cox has two interceptions and a fumble recovery through five games. He was a three-year starter at William & Mary, recording nine career interceptions. He recorded an interception off Peyton Manning in the season-opener on the Colts first drive and then recovered a fumble on their ensuing possession.

■ Second-year pro **Tyron Brackenridge** competes for time at cornerback after playing in 14 games with Kansas City the last two seasons. **Brian Witherspoon** earned a roster spot as a rookie free agent in 2008 when he served as the club's return specialist and saw limited action at cornerback. Fifth-year pro **Scott Starks** is also in the mix at cornerback and played 26 snaps in week two against Arizona.

■ The club has four experienced players at safety. 2007 first-round pick **Reggie Nelson** has recorded seven interceptions in 34 games at free safety. The Jaguars added fifth-year pro **Sean Considine** in free agency and he started the first three games at strong safety until missing the last two weeks with a groin injury. Considine spent the past four seasons with Philadelphia where he played in 46 games with 17 starts. **Gerald Alexander**, a second-round pick of Detroit in 2007, made has started the last two weeks. In his first start as a Jaguar, he responded with an interception and forced fumble and did not miss a snap against Tennessee. Alexander played in 21 games with 17 starts with the Lions and was acquired via trade in June.

■ The Jaguars signed veteran safety **Brian Russell** on September 8 after he was released by Seattle on final cuts. Russell has played in 113 games with 94 starts for Minnesota, Cleveland, Seattle and the Jaguars. He started all 16 games the last two seasons with the Seahawks.

■ Rookie cornerback **William Middleton** was signed off Atlanta's practice squad on Sept. 21. Middleton was a fifth-round pick of the Falcons in this year's draft, the 138th selection overall. He had two special teams tackles last Sunday at Seattle. Rookie safety **Courtney Greene** was added to the 53-man roster on Sept. 21 after being released on final cuts by Seattle. He was a seventh-round pick of the Seahawks in this year's draft and posted three special teams tackles against his former team last Sunday.

KICKERS/SPECIALISTS (3)

■ Russ Purnell, a 37-year coaching veteran, is in his first season as the club's special teams coordinator after spending the past seven seasons with Indianapolis. **Josh Scobee**, a fifth-round pick by the Jaguars in 2004, is in his sixth season as the placekicker. Scobee has led the team in points the last five seasons and ranks second in team history with 502 points. In addition, Scobee holds the team-record with 82 career touchbacks including a franchise-record five in week four against Tennessee.

■ 2007 fourth-round pick **Adam Podlesh** won the punting competition in the preseason with veteran Steve Weatherford. Podlesh, who missed the final five games of last season with a knee injury, has a 42.2 career average in 32 games.

■ Third-year pro **Jeremy Cain** won the long snapper job in the preseason. Cain has played in 22 career games since entering the NFL in 2004.

GOAL IS POSTSEASON: The Jaguars look to return to postseason play in 2009 and can look no further than last year for inspiration. Seven teams made the playoffs in 2008 that were not in the postseason the year before. It marked the 13th consecutive season in which at least five teams (out of 12) accomplished the feat. Here are the teams that made the postseason the past 13 years and were not in the year before:

WILLIAM & MARY WELL-REPRESENTED: Jaguars third-round pick Derek Cox has moved on to the NFL but he doesn't have to entirely leave his days at William & Mary behind. Jaguars linebackers coach Mark Duffner played football at William & Mary and was inducted into the school's Hall of Fame in 1990. The two first met on Cox's visit to Jacksonville prior to the draft. Besides Duffner's football accomplishments, Cox said he is more popular for something else.

"He is the weightlifting champion," Cox said.

Duffner holds the school record at 1,170 pounds (385 bench press; 285 powerclean; 500 deadlift).

PRIDE OF ALBANY: The city of Albany sits in the southwestern part of Georgia with a population of a little over 160,000. There are four current NFL players that grew up in Albany with two on the Jaguars roster in linebacker Daryl Smith and defensive tackle Montavious Stanley. Smith attended Dougherty High School while Stanley played at nearby Westover High School. Former Super Bowl MVP and current Seattle Seahawks wide receiver Deion Branch and Green Bay Packers running back Kregg Lumpkin are from the area.

GOLF FOR FUN, KICK FOR DOUGH: Sixth-year pro Josh Scobee is an avid golfer and had quite an offseason away from the football field. Scobee started his journey by scoring tickets to the Masters in April where he had the opportunity to get up close and personal with the world's best golfers. He took it one step further in May when served as a marshal escort for The Players at TPC Sawgrass in Ponte Vedra. His duties included walking with Tiger Woods for all four of his rounds.

LINEBACKERS JOIN FORCES: Several of the club's linebackers established a program in the offseason in conjunction with Wolfson Children's Hospital. Daryl Smith, Clint Ingram, Justin Durant and Brian Iwuh made two visits a month to the hospital in the offseason and will begin again in September. The players stopped by rooms, signed autographs and distributed gifts to the patients on their visits.

WORKING VACATION: Running back Maurice Jones-Drew was one of 24 current or former NFL players that attended the NFL Broadcast Boot Camp on June 22-25 at NFL Films in Mt. Laurel, New Jersey. The camp was organized by the NFL Broadcasting Department and covered a wide range of topics with instructors from all of the NFL's broadcasting partners - CBS, ESPN, FOX, NBC, NFL Network, Sirius Satellite Radio, Westwood One Radio, plus local radio and TV stations.

JAGUARS TRAINER FINISHES TRIATHLON IN AUSTRIA:

Jaguars head athletic trainer/physical therapist Mike Ryan participated in the Karnten Ironman Triathlon Austria during the offseason in Klagenfurt. Ryan crossed the finish line in 10:36:47, ranking 489th out of 2,400 participants. An Ironman Triathlon is 140 miles worth of swimming, biking and running. Athletes from 49 nations took part in the Austria event. Ryan started the race with a four-mile swim in 1:09:51 before biking 112 miles in 5:29:02 and concluded the race with a 26.2 mile run in 3:48:23. The 22-year NFL veteran has completed six Ironman Triathlons. Along with Austria, he has competed in Hawaii (1994), New Zealand (1996), Canary Island (1998), Brazil (2000) and Idaho (2004). - S Reggie Nelson's mother, Mary Lakes, lost her battle with breast cancer in 2006. Nelson hosted the inaugural Mary Lakes Invitational Bowl Against Breast Cancer in 2009 to benefit the North Florida Susan G. Komen For the Cure.
- FB Montell Owens is an accomplished trumpet player and teamed up with 12 area high school students in 2009 to form the St. Johns River City High School Jazz All-Starts and the group performed at the Jazz Festival in downtown Jacksonville.
- K Josh Scobee attended Longview High School in Texas, the same school that produced actor Matthew McConaughey.
