THIS WEEK

After falling to the Carolina Panthers to start the 2007 season, the Rams will look rebound as they play their second-consecutive home game, hosting long-time NFC West rival, the San Francisco 49ers.

This week's matchup with the 49ers will feature two of the marquee backs in the NFL, as the Rams' Steven Jackson faces off against the 49ers' Frank Gore. In 2006, Gore and Jackson were both named to the Pro Bowl as members of the NFC squad. Jackson's 2,334 total yards from scrimmage last season led the NFL while Gore finished fourth in the league in yards from scrimmage with 2,180 total yards.

This game will be the 116th meeting all-time between the franchises. The history between the Rams and 49ers dates to 1950, San Francisco's first year in the NFL. The Rams lead the all-time series 59-54-2. The teams have met twice each year since the series inception, including three meetings in 1989, the third being the NFC Championship game.

The series began on Oct. 1, 1950, and was the beginning of legendary battles in the series that has featured many streaks. The Rams opened by winning five of the first six games. In the 1951 and 1952 seasons, the teams played in back-to-back weeks. From 1968-1980, the Rams won 22 times, losing just four, with one tie, with separate winning streaks of nine and 10 games. From 1981 until the first meeting in 1990, San Francisco won 13 of 20 meetings, including the 1989 NFC Championship game, 30-3. The 49ers won 17 consecutive games from 1990-98. The Rams ended the streak in 1999 en route to sweeping the 49ers for the first time since 1980. The Rams are 11-5 in the past six seasons against San Francisco, with season sweeps from 1999-2001, and in 2004.

LAST WEEK

Edward Jones Dome, September 9, 2007 (65,307) –

The Rams lost the season opener, falling 27-13 to the Carolina Panthers. After Carolina QB Jake Delhomme found WR Drew Carter in the end zone on the game's opening drive, QB Marc Bulger connected with WR Torry Holt on a 3-yard touchdown strike, evening the score at seven. Late in the second quarter, T Orlando Pace left the game and was lost for the season with a torn labrum and rotator cuff in his right shoulder. K Jeff Wilkins gave the Rams a 10-7 halftime lead, converting a 42-yard field goal attempt as time expired in the second quarter. WR Dante Hall's 84-yard kickoff return to open the second half put Wilkins in position for his second field goal of the day, extending the Rams lead to 13-7. Carolina regained the lead after Delhomme found WR Steve Smith for a 68-yard touchdown, bringing the score to 14-13. A fumble by RB Steven Jackson again gave Carolina possession, with the Panthers continuing to move the ball effectively before LB Brandon Chillar forced and recovered a fumble inside the Rams 5-yard line. The combination of a third Delhomme touchdown pass and a pair of successful field goal attempts by K John Kasay put the Panthers on top for good by a final score of 27-13.

THE HEAD COACHES

SCOTT LINEHAN (2nd season as head coach, 2nd with Rams; Career Record: 8-9) – Named twenty-second head coach in franchise history by Owner/Chairman Georgia Frontiere on January 19, 2006. Linehan rallied the Rams to an 8-8 finish in his first season. Quarterback Marc Bulger enjoyed the best season of his career, including 4,301 yards passing and 24 touchdowns. Balancing the offensive attack, Linehan guided Steven Jackson to lead the league with 2,334 combined yards, and set a Rams running back record with 90 catches. Prior to joining the Rams, Linehan was the offensive coordinator of the Miami Dolphins; the Dolphins improved from 29th in 2004 to 14th in total offensive in 2005. Linehan spent three seasons (2002-2004) as offensive coordinator for the Minnesota Vikings. In 2004, Daunte Culpepper posted the fourth-highest single season passer rating in NFL history (110.9). A college quarterback, Linehan was a free agent signee with the Dallas Cowboys before a shoulder injury ended his active career.

MIKE NOLAN (3rd season as head coach, 3rd with 49ers; Career Record: 12-21) – Named the fifteenth head coach in 49ers history on January 19, 2005. Nolan joins San Francisco after an impressive stint as defensive coordinator of the Baltimore Ravens. In Baltimore, Nolan's defense was among the NFL's best, finishing third overall. Baltimore ranked first in the AFC with 17 fumble recoveries and led the NFL in sacks (47) and tied for first in the AFC and second in the NFL with 41 takeaways. Nolan joined the Ravens after a one-year stay as the New York Jets defensive coordinator in 2000. Under Nolan's tutelage, the Jets defense rebounded to tenth overall (tied with the Philadelphia Eagles) in the league – an improvement of 11 spots from the previous year. From 1997-99 Nolan was the defensive coordinator of the Washington Redskins. He also spent four seasons as defensive coordinator under then-head coach Dan Reeves for the New York Giants (1993-96). In his first season, the Giants' defense allowed the fewest points in the NFL (205). Nolan also worked on Reeves' staff from 1987-1992 with the Denver Broncos as linebackers coach and as special teams coach/defensive assistant.

THE LAST TIME

Edward Jones Dome, November 26, 2006 (65,517) –

The Rams posted a 20-17 victory over conference rivals the San Francisco 49ers. WR Torry Holt had four receptions for 30 yards, totaling 10,282 for his career, overtaking WR Jerry Rice (10,273) as the player with the most receiving yards in his first eight years in NFL history.

With the first quarter scoreless, the Rams got on top in the second quarter with a 24-yard field goal by K Jeff Wilkins. A 49ers fumble allowed the Rams to regain possession and extend their lead to 10-0 with a 36-yard touchdown run by RB Steven Jackson. A touchdown late in the second quarter brought the 49ers to within three (10-7), but a 51-yard field goal by Wilkins gave the Rams a 13-7 lead at the half. San Francisco took a 14-13 lead with a third quarter touchdown. In the fourth quarter, Rams LBs Brandon Chillar and Raonall Smith stopped the 49ers on a critical third-and-one at the St. Louis 7-yard line, forcing them to kick a field goal (17-13). With 27 seconds remaining, QB Marc Bulger connected with WR Kevin Curtis for a 5-yard touchdown pass to take a 20-17 lead, culminating a 90-yard drive. An interception by S Oshiomogho Atogwe on the final play of the game sealed the win.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK

JACKSON vs. GORE

Last season, RBs Steven Jackson and Frank Gore distinguished themselves as two of the best rushers in the NFL. Both Gore and Jackson were named to the NFC's Pro Bowl squad for the first time in their careers.

Jackson's 2,334 yards from scrimmage led the NFL in 2006, were the most in Rams history and were the fifth-most for a single-season in NFL history. His 90 receptions led all running backs in 2006.

Gore finished third in the NFL in rushing with 1,695 yards and set 49ers franchise records for rushing attempts, rushing yards and scrimmage yards.

LINES FROM LINEHAN

(On LT Orlando Pace's injury):

"Orlando (Pace) is out for the year. He has a torn labrum and rotator cuff in his right shoulder. I feel real bad for Orlando. He worked very, very hard to get himself back from his triceps injury a year ago. He probably is in the best shape he's been in a number of years. He really worked his butt off to get back to what I thought was his best condition, at least since I've been here. He had a real unfortunate injury. We'll have to pick up the pieces for him as far as our personnel goes in our line. Next Sunday we'll have our best five out there. Right now we'll be working on a couple different scenarios. We feel very badly for Orlando, but the team will pick up the slack from that loss.

(On how G Adam Goldberg performed in place of Pace):

"He did fine. It was very similar to what he had to do against Seattle, last year, when he came in. That's why he's here. He has the ability to swing the tackle spots and play guard if needed. That's why he was up in this particular game. We went with Milford (Brown) at guard because he would be the swing tackle. He came in and performed very well under the circumstances."

(On the Rams' performance against Carolina):

"We had our opportunities and we did not take advantage of it. Carolina had theirs and they took advantage of them and executed what they had to do in the second half. The bottom line is you have to play your best football in tight games, in the second half, third and fourth quarters. As always you have to credit them for doing what we weren't able to do. The biggest key is how we respond to a tough loss. It's early in the year. We can't do anything about it now other than learn from it, pick up the pieces, move on and correct the things that need to be corrected, as always. We need to be very, very positive, yet very, very critical of ourselves and what we need to do better and move on. It's very, very simple."

(On DT Adam Carriker first regular season game):

"I thought it was a very good start. It wasn't perfect, but he player very stout in there with great effort. He did a pretty good job most of the night when he was playing on the center of playing in their backfield, so it was a very good start for him."

(On TE Randy McMichael):

"His role will be extremely important to our team. He should expect to improve each week and hopefully be nominated each week for player of the game and know that he's going to match up better with defensive ends like we had yesterday. It will be better and better each week. He had his first catch in a game yesterday at the end of the game – I know it was garbage time and all that stuff. It does take a while to build that rapport with your quarterback when he has guys he's been playing a lot of games with. Those plays will continue to be developed for him. He's involved with the offense just like everybody else. It's one of those things which will be improved on and soon."

FOR THE LONGEST TIME

Since the Super Bowl era only five wide receiver tandems have been together for nine or more seasons. Rams' WRs Isaac Bruce and Torry Holt (1999-present) represent one pair, joining Pittsburgh's Lynn Swann and John Stallworth (1974-82), Miami's Mark Clayton and Mark Duper (1983-92), San Francisco's Jerry Rice and John Taylor (1987-95) and Denver's Rod Smith and Ed McCaffrey (1995-2003).

The tandem of Bruce and Holt has proven to be one of the most effective long-term wide receiver pairs in NFL history, as Bruce and Holt have more receptions (1,798) and receiving yards (19,181) than any of the other four pairings.

SACK ARTISTS

DT La'Roi Glover and DE Leonard Little have been among the best in the NFL at sacking the quarterback. Glover is in his 12th season in the NFL this season, after finishing second on the team with 5.5 sacks in 2006. Little is in his 10th season, and led the team in sacks with 13.0 last season. Glover and Little rank eighth and 10th, respectively, on the NFL's career active sack leaders list. The Rams are the only team with two players in the top 10.

- ...**WR Drew Bennett** appeared on the ABC game show, *The Big Moment*, while in college, and he and several roommates answered questions about the movie *Ghost* to win thousands of dollars in prizes.
- ...**TE Dominique Byrd** earned *Student Sports Grid-Hoops* third-team All-America honors in basketball as a high school junior at The Breck School in Minneapolis, Minn., averaging 17.3 points per game.
- ...**G Mark Setterstrom** was a four-year letterwinner as a heavyweight wrestler in high school, compiling a 38-3 record as a senior.

A STRONG LEG

In 2006, Wilkins continued his strong performance on the field, leading the Rams in scoring for a team-record eighth consecutive season and finishing the year ranked third in the NFL in scoring with 131 points (35/35 PATs, 32/37 FGs).

In Week 1 of the 2007 season, Wilkins totaled seven points after he was successful on each of his two field goal attempts and converted his only PAT attempt. With the successful PAT attempt, Wilkins continued his streak of 347 consecutive PATs, which stands as a Rams' franchise-record and ranks second in NFL history behind Jason Elam's streak of 371 consecutive extra point conversions from 1993-2002.

Wilkins has converted 285 career field goals, which stands as the Rams' all-time mark and his 1,134 points make him the Rams' all-time scoring leader. Wilkins has shown a knack for hitting long-distance field goals, as he currently owns a Rams' record with 23 made field goals from at least 50 yards. The 23 field goals from at least 50 yards rank fourth among active players. Wilkins has made 32 of 42 field goal attempts from at least 49 yards.

Wilkins currently ranks fifth among active NFL players in points scored, and his .825 field goal percentage is also fifth among active players.

NEW FACES JOIN RAMS STAFF

Mike Cox (Defensive Quality Control/Assistant Defensive Line) – Cox joins the Rams after spending nearly 20 years at the collegiate level, including 17 seasons under the tutelage of former collegiate head coach John L. Smith. A four-time letterman at Idaho and a three-year starter at linebacker, Cox landed his first coaching position with his alma mater, where he spent eight seasons (1987-1994) as linebackers coach. Upon Smith's departure following the 1994 season, Cox followed his mentor to his next three stops, including a three season stint with Utah State (1995-1997), five seasons with Louisville (1998-2002) and five seasons with Michigan State (2002-2006), handling the linebackers at each spot while also serving as recruiting coordinator at Michigan State. In 2000, Louisville forced an NCAA-best 37 turnovers and in 2002 Louisville ranked among the NCAA leaders in rushing defense. As a player at Idaho, Cox recorded 252 tackles, which still ranks among the Vandals' all-time leaders.

Keith Murphy (Offensive Quality Control) – Murphy comes to the Rams after eight seasons coaching wide receivers and special teams at Eastern Washington University. A former wide receiver at the University of Washington, Murphy worked with receivers, quarterbacks and special teams as a graduate assistant with his alma mater under Scott Linehan for three seasons (1997-1999) after spending the 1996 campaign working with the running backs and special teams as a Huskies student assistant. During his five-year career as a player, Murphy was part of two Pac-10 Conference champion teams, as well as five bowl teams.

Al Roberts (Special Teams) – After spending the past four years coaching and teaching on the high school level, Al Roberts joins the Rams as special teams coach, bringing with him 17 years of NFL experience. After playing college football at the University of Washington and the University of Puget Sound, Roberts began a coaching career that took him to a variety of stops on both the collegiate and professional levels. Roberts returned to the University of Washington in 1977 as running backs coach, where he spent six years (1977-1982) before moving to the USFL. Roberts served as both running backs and special teams coach for the Los Angeles Express in 1983 and 1984, then moved to the Houston Oilers (1984-1995), Purdue University (1986) and University of Wyoming (1987). Roberts returned to the NFL in 1988, making stops as special teams coach with the Philadelphia Eagles (1988-1990), New York Jets (1991-1993) and Arizona Cardinals (1994-1995). In 1996 Roberts returned to the University of Washington, coaching running backs and special teams for one year before again moving to the NFL as special teams coach with the Cincinnati Bengals (1997-2002). In 1999 the Bengals finished third in the NFL in both kickoff and punt returns, while Tremain Mack became the first Bengal to lead the AFC (27.1 avg.) in kickoff returns, as well as the first Cincinnati player to be named to the Pro Bowl as a kick return specialist.

NEW RAMS IN BLUE

In the offseason, the Rams addressed offensive, defensive and special teams needs by adding several new faces to the team, including **WR Drew Bennett**, **WR/KR Dante Hall**, **DE James Hall** and **TE Randy McMichael**, all projected to make immediate impacts in 2007.

Bennett, who entered the NFL as an undrafted free agent, spent the previous six seasons with Tennessee where he led the team in receptions for the past two seasons, and in receiving yards for the past three seasons. In 2006, he nabbed 46 receptions for 737 yards. His career-high 16.0-yards-per-catch average ranked third in the AFC (seventh in the NFL) among receivers with at least 45 catches. He ranks eighth in Titans' franchise history with 4,033 receiving yards and ninth with 273 receptions. Bennett, along with Pro Bowl receivers Torry Holt and Isaac Bruce, could help form one of the more dynamic receiving units in the NFL.

Dante Hall is a two-time Pro Bowler who spent the past seven seasons in Kansas City. One of the most prolific kick returners in NFL history, Hall holds Chiefs records for career kickoff returns (360), kickoff return yards (8,644), special teams scores (11), kickoff return touchdowns (6), combined net yards (12,356) and career punt returns for touchdowns (5). His six kickoff returns for touchdowns are tied for first in NFL history and his 8,644 career kickoff return yards rank sixth in NFL history. In addition to his return talents, he also will fit into the Rams' receiving corps this season.

James Hall will add a boost to the pass defense. Hall comes to the Rams after playing for Detroit where he was signed as an undrafted free agent in 2000. In 2006, Hall was a team captain and tallied 5.0 sacks in seven games before being placed on the reserved/injured list with a shoulder injury. He earned NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors in Week 6 vs. Buffalo 10/15 with a season-high 3.0 sacks, eight tackles (five solo), and one forced fumble, the fifth career multiple-sack game of his career. Hall will team with Pro Bowl defensive end Leonard Little.

McMichael will add veteran leadership to a young and talented group of tight ends. After spending five years with Miami, he is the all-time leader among Miami tight ends with 283 receptions and 3,096 yards. He has started all 80 games in his NFL career, the third-longest streak by a Dolphin to open a career and second-longest in NFL history for a tight end behind Ozzie Newsome's 95 games. McMichael ranks fifth among active tight ends with 283 receptions going into 2007. Last season, he finished fifth among AFC tight ends in receptions (62) and sixth in receiving yards (640). McMichael led the Dolphins in receptions five times and receiving yards four times.



Jackson finished at or near the top of the NFL in a variety of statistical categories, including rushing yards (fifth), yards from scrimmage (first), receptions (seventh), first downs (second) and points scored (tied for third). Rams 2007 second-round draft pick **Brian Leonard**, serves as Jackson's backup and has the versatility to play fullback. The former All-America honoree left Rutgers holding school records for career receptions (207), touchdowns (45) and points scored (272). **Travis Minor** joined the Rams in the offseason after spending the previous six seasons with Miami. Minor provides added depth and valuable contributions on special teams. Rookie Antonio Pittman, joined the Rams on a waiver claim 9/2 after being waived by the New Orleans Saints during final roster cuts. Pittman, a fourth-round draft choice of the Saints out of Ohio State, ranks eighth on the Buckeyes' all-time rushing list despite playing only three seasons. **Madison Hedgecock** is the team's only true fullback and has played in all 16 games the past two seasons and is an important contributor as a blocking back and special teams player.

WIDE RECEIVERS (6) – Henry Ellard

Drew Bennett (7), Isaac Bruce (14), Marques Hagans (1), Dante Hall (8), Torry Holt (9), Dane Looker (7)

One of the most consistent wide receivers in NFL history, **Torry Holt** is in his ninth season with the Rams. Holt started fast in the 2007 season, scoring a touchdown on the Rams first drive of the season vs. Carolina 9/9 on a three-yard pass from QB Marc Bulger. Holt led the Rams with 73 yards on eight receptions. En route to being selected to his fourth straight Pro Bowl and fifth overall in 2006, Holt caught 93 balls for 1,188 yards and 10 touchdowns. Holt reached the 10,000 career receiving mark in just 116 games becoming the fastest player in NFL history to reach the milestone. The last remaining player from the Los Angeles Rams, **Isaac Bruce** starts opposite Holt in his 14th season with the franchise. Bruce caught 74 passes for 1,098 yards and three touchdowns in 2006, moving him into eighth place on the NFL's all-time receptions list and seventh place on the all-time receiving yardage list. After spending the past six seasons with the Tennessee Titans, **Drew Bennett** joins the Rams after signing as a free agent in the offseason. After originally starting his career at UCLA as a quarterback, Bennett developed in a reliable receiver and, at 6'5", is a big target for QB Marc Bulger. Bennett was de-activated for the season opening contest vs. Carolina after suffering a thigh injury in practice. Bennett totaled up more than 4,000 receiving yards to go along with 25 touchdowns during his Titans career. Joining Bennett as a new addition to the Rams receiving corps is former Kansas City Chief **Dante Hall**. One of the most dynamic return men in NFL history, Hall proved his worth quickly in the 2007, returning the opening kickoff of the second half vs. Carolina 9/9 for 84 yards. Hall entered

2007 with 11 return touchdowns, good for third in NFL history. **Dane Looker** is in his fifth year with the Rams and is an important backup at the receiver position and critical on special teams, serving as the holder for K Jeff Wilkins. Looker saw action vs. Carolina 9/9, catching two passes for 10 yards. Second-year receiver **Marques Hagans** joined the Rams' 53-man roster this season after spending the 2006 campaign as a member of the practice squad. Hagans, selected by the Rams in the fifth round of the 2006 NFL Draft, is a former college quarterback and can serve as the team's emergency signal-caller.

TIGHT ENDS (4) – Judd Garrett

Dominique Byrd (2), Joe Klopfenstein (2), Randy McMichael (6), Aaron Walker (5)

Newly acquired tight end **Randy McMichael** comes to the Rams after five productive years with the Miami Dolphins, one of which was spent under the tutelage of then Dolphins offensive coordinator Scott Linehan. In Week 1 vs. Carolina, McMichael caught two passes for 24 yards and was a key blocker for the Rams after T Orlando Pace was lost to a right shoulder injury. A pair of second-year tight ends, **Joe Klopfenstein** and **Dominique Byrd**, return to provide depth at the tight end position. Klopfenstein started all 16 games, catching 20 balls for 226 yards and one touchdown. Byrd was inactive for much of the year and finished his rookie season with two catches for 39 yards and a touchdown in five games played. At 6'6", 270, **Aaron Walker** has excellent size and proved to be a valuable blocking tight end, playing in all 16 games and starting five in 2006.

OFFENSIVE LINE (9) – Paul Boudreau, Jim Chaney

Alex Barron (3), Milford Brown (6), Adam Goldberg (5), Richie Incognito (3), Andy McCollum (14), Orlando Pace (11), Brett Romberg (4), Mark Setterstrom (2), Claude Terrell (3)

The Rams' offensive line suffered a tough blow in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9 when starting left tackle Orlando Pace suffered his second season-ending injury in as many seasons, when he suffered a shoulder injury in the second quarter. **Pace**, a former No. 1 overall pick, had his streak of seven consecutive Pro Bowls snapped last year after his season was derailed by a torn triceps. **Richie Incognito**, a third-year veteran and a starting guard, has been sidelined with an ankle sprain that kept him out of the team's opener vs. Carolina. **Alex Barron**, also a third-year veteran, serves as the Rams starting right tackle. Following a strong 2006 season which saw him start the final three games of the season, **Brett Romberg** picks up where he left off, serving as the Rams' starting center, the first time in his career that he has been named a full-time starter. **Mark Setterstrom**, starts at guard for the Rams after he was called upon to start the final six games

at left guard. After a knee injury in the first game of 2006 cost him the remainder of the season, veteran center **Andy McCollum** returns for his 14th NFL season and is a valuable backup. **Adam Goldberg** returns to the Rams for the 2007 campaign after providing valuable versatility as a backup lineman during the 2006 season. Goldberg served as the Rams' left tackle vs. Carolina after Pace left the game due to injury. **Claude Terrell** and **Milford Brown** will provide added depth at the guard position, with Brown likely seeing some work at tackle, as well. Brown replaced Incognito in the starting lineup vs. Carolina.

DEFENSE / SPECIAL TEAMS

DEFENSIVE LINE (9) – Brian Baker, Mike Cox

Victor Adeyanju (2), Adam Carriker (R), La'Roi Glover (12), James Hall (8), Trevor Johnson (4), Leonard Little (10), Eric Moore (3), Clifton Ryan (R), Claude Wroten (2)

DE Leonard Little the Rams' starting left defensive end, led all defensive linemen in tackles in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9 with five stops. Little led the Rams in 2006 with 13.5 sacks. Little has shown he is one of the league's premier pass rushers, ranking 10th in the NFL in sacks among active players. Little is paired with DE James Hall, the team's right defensive end. Hall, who was acquired in an offseason trade with Detroit, will be key in the Rams' pass defense. In his first game as a Ram, Hall notched four total tackles, including one tackle for loss. Hall tallied 5.0 sacks in seven games for Detroit in 2006 before being placed on reserved/injured due to a shoulder injury. **DT La'Roi Glover** starts for the Rams and adds veteran leadership to the defensive line after tallying 52 tackles (34 solo) in 2006. After a college career at Nebraska that saw him star as a defensive end, 2007 first-round draft pick **DT Adam Carriker** moves to nose tackle and will start for the Rams in his rookie season. In his debut vs. Carolina, Carriker notched three assisted tackles. Carriker was one of the Big 12 Conference's most dominant defensive players while at Nebraska and saw significant action in his first NFL preseason. **DE Victor Adeyanju** had a promising rookie season in 2006, starting nine games and finishing with 42 tackles (30 solo), 1.0 sack, one quarterback pressure and two fumble recoveries. Adeyanju was unable to get onto the field in the season opener vs. Carolina, being declared inactive after suffering an ankle injury in practice. Second-year **DT Claude Wroten** and rookie **DT Clifton Ryan**, a fifth-round choice from Michigan State, will be called on to perform as a key backups. Wroten showed promise in his rookie season in 2006, notching 15 tackles (nine solo), 1.0 sack, seven quarterback pressures and one forced fumble. **DEs Eric Moore** and **Trevor Johnson** will provide depth at the defensive end position for the Rams. Moore joined the Rams in November last season and he saw action in three games and Moore joined the Rams in the offseason after splitting time between the New York Jets and New Orleans

in 2006.

LINEBACKERS (7) – Rick Venturi

Brandon Chillar (4), Quinton Culberson (R), Chris Draft (9), Tim McGarigle (1), Raonall Smith (6), Pisa Tinoisamoa (5), Will Witherspoon (6)

Six-year veteran **Will Witherspoon** returns to start at middle linebacker for the Rams, and made an impact in the first game of 2007, totaling eight tackles, one pass defended and one fumble recovery vs. Carolina 9/9. Witherspoon led the team in tackles in 2006, his first season with the team. Starting strongside linebacker, **Brandon Chillar** had seven tackles, one forced fumble and a fumble recovery in the Rams' season opener vs. Carolina. Chillar is coming off of his best season as a Ram in 2006, finishing fourth on the team with a career-high 77 tackles (54 solo), 2.0 sacks, one pass defended, and five quarterback pressures. **Pisa Tinoisamoa**, the Rams' starting weakside linebacker, is healthy entering the 2007 season. Last season, Tinoisamoa finished with 47 tackles (27 solo) 2.0 sacks one pass defended and one fumble recovery in 11 games before being placed on the reserve/injured list due to a shoulder injury. The Rams acquired free agent **Chris Draft** in the off-season, and the nine-year veteran from Stanford, will be an important backup and special teams player. Draft has the versatility to backup multiple linebacker positions. Draft posted 111 tackles and a career-high 5.5 sacks last season as Carolina's starting middle linebacker. **Raonall Smith** saw action in all 16 games in 2006, his first season as a Ram. Smith is a valuable asset on special teams and led the team with 13 special teams tackles. In the 2007 season opener vs. Carolina, Smith notched two special teams tackles. 2006 seventh-round draft choice **Tim McGarigle** spent last season on the Rams' practice squad, but has found a home on the team's active roster this season despite being slowed by a hamstring injury in the preseason. McGarigle serves as a backup linebacker and is an important special teams player. Undrafted rookie free agent **Quinton Culberson** from Mississippi State rounds out the linebacking corps after a strong preseason that saw him finish third on the team in tackles.

SECONDARY (8) – Willy Robinson, Ron Milus

Oshiomogho Atogwe (3), Ron Bartell (3), Jerome Carter (3), Corey Chavous (10), Tye Hill (2), Todd Johnson (5), Jonathan Wade (R), Lenny Walls (6)

S Corey Chavous, starts at strong safety for the Rams in 2007, after finishing second on the team in 2006 with 118 tackles (82 solo) 1.0 sack, one interception, six passes defended, nine quarterback pressures, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. Starting free safety **S Oshiomogho Atogwe** got off to a fast start in 2007, leading the team in tackles with 10 vs. Carolina 9/9. Atogwe had a career year in 2006 when he finished third on the team with

91 tackles (62 solo), tied for a team-high three interceptions, and tied for a team-high six forced fumbles. **CB Ron Bartell**, starts at cornerback in place of Fakhir Brown, who is serving a four-game suspension. Bartell made a career-high three interceptions in 2006 while playing in all 16 games. **CB Tye Hill** enters his sophomore season as a starting CB, after tying for team lead with three interceptions in 2006, the most interceptions by a rookie since Pisa Tinoisamoa had three in 2003. Bartell and Hill posted six tackles each in the Rams season-opening game vs. Carolina. **S Jerome Carter** serves as a backup safety and saw action in 14 games in 2006 and tallied 20 tackles (14 solo), two interceptions, one pass defended and three quarterback pressures. The Rams get added help in the secondary from **CB Lenny Walls** and **S Todd Johnson**, both acquired as free agents in the offseason. Johnson provides valuable experience and is a standout on special teams. In Week 1 vs. Carolina, Johnson shared the Rams' special teams Player of the Week honors with LB Brandon Chillar after Johnson notched two special teams tackles. 2007 third-round pick **CB Jonathan Wade** out of Tennessee will contribute as a backup in the secondary this season and is

a gunner on the Rams' punt coverage teams. Wade earned *Associated Press* All-Southeastern Conference honors.

SPECIAL TEAMS (3) – AI Roberts, Todd Downing

Donnie Jones (4), Chris Massey (6), Jeff Wilkins (14)

K Jeff Wilkins continues to be one of the best kickers in the NFL. In 2006, Wilkins finished second in the NFC (third in the NFL) in scoring (131 points – 35/35 PATs, 32/37 FGs). In Week 1 of the 2007 season vs. Carolina 9/9, Wilkins totaled seven points after he was successful on each of his two field goal attempts and converted his only PAT attempt. With the successful PAT attempt, Wilkins continued his streak of 347 consecutive PATs, which stands as a Rams' franchise-record and ranks second in NFL history behind Jason Elam's streak of 371 consecutive extra point conversions from 1993-2002. **LS Chris Massey**, one of the most consistent players at his position, continues long snapping duties, while **P Donnie Jones** plays his first season with the Rams after spending 2006 in Miami. Jones punted five times in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9, totaling 236 yards for a 47.2 yard average and a 43-yard net average.
