## **RAMS FACE BUCCANEERS IN FIRST ROAD CONTEST OF 2007**

### **THIS WEEK**

The Rams travel to Raymond James Stadium in Tampa, Fla. this week to take on the Tampa Bay Buccaneers who have started the season fast at 2-0. The game will be the first road contest for the Rams in 2007.

The contest will feature two of the most tenured wide receivers in the NFL in Tampa Bay's Joey Galloway and the Rams' Isaac Bruce. Galloway is playing in his 13th season after entering the NFL in 1995 out of Ohio State and Bruce is in his 14th season, entering the league in 1994 out of Memphis. Bruce ranks second among active receivers with 898 receptions and Galloway ranks 11th with 621 receptions. Bruce ranks second among active players with 13,541 receiving yards, while Galloway stands sixth with 9,765 receiving yards. Bruce and Galloway rank fourth and fifth in career touchdown passes among active players, as Bruce has 80 touchdowns and Galloway has 73.

The Rams lead the all-time series against Tampa Bay, 11-6, including an 11-6 victory in the 1999 NFC Championship that sent the Rams to Super Bowl XXXIV where the team defeated the Tennessee Titans, 23-16. The last time the Rams and Buccaneers played was during the 2004 season, when the Rams defeated the Bucs, 28-21 in St. Louis.

### **A WIN OVER THE BUCS WOULD:**

- Give the Rams a 1-2 record in the 2007 season.
- Give Rams' coach Scott Linehan a 1-0 career record against San Francisco.
- Improve the Rams' all-time record vs. Tampa Bay to 12-6.
- Give the Rams' franchise 499 regular season victories.

### **LAST WEEK**

**Edward Jones Dome, September 16, 2007 (65,295) –**

The Rams suffered their second loss of the season, falling 17-16 to division rival San Francisco. After LS Chris Massey recovered a muffed punt following the Rams first possession, QB Marc Bulger found WR Torry Holt on a 12 yard touchdown strike, making it the second consecutive week the pair opened the scoring. 49ers RB Frank Gore plunged into the end zone from one yard out on the first play of the second quarter to tie the score at seven before two successful field goal attempts by Rams K Jeff Wilkins brought the score to 13-7 at the half. The Rams moved the ball deep into San Francisco territory early in the third quarter before a costly turnover resulted in a nine-play, 80-yard 49er drive, capped by a 43-yard touchdown run by Gore. Wilkins converted his third field goal attempt of the day early in the fourth quarter, splitting the uprights from a season-long 53 yards to put the Rams on top 16-14. On the following possession, the Rams kept the 49er offense from crossing mid-field before a muffed punt gave San Francisco a second chance, which they capitalized on when K Joe Nedney converted a 40-yard field goal attempt to put the Niners up by one, 17-16. With just 2:35 remaining, the Rams defense forced a three-and-out, providing the offense with one final drive. Bulger led the Rams 42 yards in just 49 seconds, but Wilkins 56-yard field goal attempt came up just short, as San Francisco prevailed by a final score of 17-16.

## **THE HEAD COACHES**

**SCOTT LINEHAN** (2nd season as head coach, 2nd with Rams; Career Record: 8-10) – Named twenty-second head coach in franchise history by Owner/Chairman Georgia Frontiere on January 19, 2006. Linehan rallied the Rams to an 8-8 finish in his first season. Quarterback Marc Bulger enjoyed the best season of his career, including 4,301 yards passing and 24 touchdowns. Balancing the offensive attack, Linehan guided Steven Jackson to lead the league with 2,334 combined yards, and set a Rams running back record with 90 catches. Prior to joining the Rams, Linehan was the offensive coordinator of the Miami Dolphins; the Dolphins improved from 29th in 2004 to 14th in total offensive in 2005. Linehan spent three seasons (2002-2004) as offensive coordinator for the Minnesota Vikings. In 2004, Daunte Culpepper posted the fourth-highest single season passer rating in NFL history (110.9). A college quarterback, Linehan was a free agent signee with the Dallas Cowboys before a shoulder injury ended his active career.

**JON GRUDEN** (10th season as head coach, 6th with Buccaneers; Career Record: 83-73) – Gruden was named the seventh head coach in Buccaneers history on February 18, 2002, when he signed a five-year contract. Gruden led Tampa Bay to its first Super Bowl title in his first season as head coach in 2002. Gruden set two NFL records – he became the youngest head coach (39) to win a Super Bowl, and was the first veteran head coach to lead his team to the Super Bowl in his first season with a new team. In 2005, the Buccaneers won the NFC South for the second time in four seasons. Prior to joining the Buccaneers, Gruden guided the Oakland Raiders to division titles in each of his final two seasons. He steered the Raiders to a 40-28 mark in four seasons (1998-2001), with postseason appearances in 2000 and in 2001 lost a divisional playoff game to eventual Super Bowl champion New England. Prior to his four seasons in Oakland, Gruden spent 1995-97 as offensive coordinator for the Philadelphia Eagles and three years (1992-94) as wide receivers coach for the Green Bay Packers. He worked as an offensive assistant for the San Francisco 49ers in 1990.

## **THE LAST TIME**

**Edward Jones Dome, October 18, 2004 (66,040)** – The Rams defeated Tampa Bay 28-21, improving their record to 4-2, moving into sole possession of first place in the NFC West. RB Marshall Faulk became the sixth player in NFL history with 100 rushing touchdowns after scoring a one-yard touchdown. QB Marc Bulger gave the Rams an early lead, engineering a five-play, 71-yard drive that resulted in a 52-yard Bulger to Holt touchdown reception to give the Rams a 7-0 lead. Tampa Bay responded the following possession with a six-play, 43-yard drive capped off by a RB Mike Alstott one-yard touchdown run to tie the score, 7-7. The Buccaneers pulled ahead at the start of the second quarter after QB Brian Griese completed a 44-yard pass to WR Michael Clayton that set up a five-yard RB Michael Pittman touchdown to take the lead, 14-7. The Rams tied it up going into halftime after DE Leonard Little recovered a bad snap resulting in a fumble on Tampa Bay's seven-yard line. Four plays later, Faulk punched in a one-yard touchdown tying the score, 14-14. Midway through the third quarter S Adam Archuleta forced and recovered a fumble by Pittman and returned it 93 yards for a touchdown to take the lead, 21-14. The Buccaneers took advantage of a Bulger fumble on the Rams' 25-yard line with a Griese one-yard touchdown pass to TE Will Heller to once again tie the game, 21-21. The Rams offense quickly responded with an eight-play, 77-yard drive which included a key third-down Bulger to RB Steven Jackson 28-yard reception and resulted in Holt's second touchdown of the game, a 36-yard Bulger pass, giving the Rams the lead, 28-21. On the following drive CB Jerametrious Butler intercepted a Griese pass intended for Clayton in the end zone. With under a minute left to go in the game, S Aeneas Williams caused WR Tim Brown to fumble on the Rams' 15-yard line, which was recovered by Butler, giving him his second turnover of the game, resulting in the final margin.

**RAMS** – **Dick Daniels**, college scout, was the Buccaneers head scout in 1975...**Brad Holmes**, college scout, is a native of Tampa, Fla. where he was named first-team all-county and all-conference at defensive tackle for Chamberlain High in 1997...Assistant strength and conditioning coach **Brad Roll** made his NFL debut with the Buccaneers from 1993-95 as their head strength coach...Director of Marketing and Sponsorship services, **Adam Jacobs**, is a graduate of the University of Florida and was inducted into the UF Hall of Fame in 1998 which honors those who have consistently demonstrated an outstanding commitment to improving the University of Florida through campus and community involvement, participation in organized campus activities, and scholastic achievement...**WR Isaac Bruce** was born in Ft. Lauderdale, Fla. and attended Dillard High, which he led to the 1989 Florida 5A Championship and was All-City...**S Jerome Carter** is a native of Lake City, Fla. where he was a three-time All-State first-team selection and the Class 5A Player of the Year as a senior at Columbia High before attending Florida State University...**S Todd Johnson** was a first-team All-State (6A) player at Riverview High in Sarasota, Fla. before earning All-SEC honors at the University of Florida...**TE Aaron Walker** attended the University of Florida and is a native of Titusville, Fla.

**BUCCANEERS** – General manager **Bruce Allen's** father is Hall of Fame member George Allen, who was the head coach of the Los Angeles Rams from 1966-70...Head Coach **Jon Gruden** spent the 1988 season as the passing game coordinator at Southeast Missouri State (Cape Girardeau, Mo.)...**Todd Wash**, defensive quality control coach, was the defensive coordinator/linebackers coach at Missouri Southern (Joplin, Mo.) in 2004...College scout **Seth Turner** resides in Columbia, Missouri...**Shannon Merrick**, director of rehabilitation, earned a master's degree in physical therapy from the Washington University School of Medicine (St. Louis, Mo.) in 1992...**DE Kevin Carter** was a first-round draft pick (6th overall) and the first ever draft pick of the St. Louis Rams in 1995, playing for the team from 1995-2000...**OL Matt Lehr**, had a brief stint with the Rams after being claimed off of waivers near the end of the 2004 season.

## **BARTELL'S CORNER**

CB Ron Bartell has started both games at corner this season and has tallied 12 tackles (11 solo), two passes defensed and 1.0 sack. Bartell made his first career sack last week against San Francisco. In the second quarter with the 49ers facing third-and-4 on the Rams 32-yard line, Bartell brought down QB Alex Smith for a 13-yard loss, forcing San Francisco to punt.

Bartell's six tackles against San Francisco ranked second among defensive backs, and his 12 tackles this season marks the first time he has had that many tackles over a two-game period since his rookie season (five at Houston, seven vs. Washington in 2005).

## **WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK**

- **WR Isaac Bruce** (79) needs two receiving touchdowns to pass Art Powell for 17th place on the NFL's all-time touchdown receptions list.
- **WR Isaac Bruce** (13,692) needs 6 yards from scrimmage to pass Andre Reed for 22nd place on the NFL's all-time scrimmage yards list.
- **QB Marc Bulger** (96) needs three touchdown passes to pass Bob Waterfield for fifth place on the Rams' all-time career touchdown completions list.
- **K Jeff Wilkins** (348) extending his streak of consecutive PAT, second longest streak in NFL history.
- **WR Torry Holt** (10,822) needs 34 yards to pass Gary Clark for 20th place on the NFL's all-time receiving yards list.
- **RB Steven Jackson** (3,365) needs 43 rushing yards to pass Les Josephson (3,407) for sixth place on the Rams all-time rushing list, while 129 yards would put him ahead of Dan Towler (3,493) and into fifth place.

## **BRUCE vs. GALLOWAY**

WR Isaac Bruce is in his 14th season and ranks among the best in NFL history in receptions and receiving yards. Bruce is tied for seventh in the NFC with 11 receptions, and ranks sixth in the conference with 165 receiving yards.

Veteran Joey Galloway began his 13th year this season out of Ohio State and has been a factor in stretching defenses early this season. In two games, Galloway is tied for 17th in the NFC with 9 receptions and ranks second in the NFC with 207 receiving yards with two touchdowns.

## **LINES FROM LINEHAN**

### **(On the game vs. San Francisco)**

"It's a similar story to the week before. We entered halftime with a lead. We came out of the blocks with the ball and we weren't able to add to a six-point lead eventually. We had opportunities two weeks in a row to make it a two-score game, twice. Both times we turned it over. That will always come back to haunt you. I don't know if it's a lesson learned. We haven't learned it yet. If we're going to win these kinds of football games we're going to have to take care of the ball better and we're going to have to play better in the second half."

### **(On T Alex Barron's play at left tackle)**

"For his first time, it wasn't a bad game. It was new and he had been pretty darn solid for us over on the right side but for the most part held his own."

### **(On the play of the defense, particularly against the run)**

"I thought it was a really, really solid effort defensively. We really had two series that weren't very good defensively. Other than that, I think our defense really, really played extremely well in this game."

### **(On the secondary's performance without starting CB Tye Hill)**

"I thought they played extremely well. I think we matched up well, stayed very close in coverage. We had some individual plays that were made in man where the bottom line is you have a guy you have to cover and not allow him to make a catch. I think when we were challenged they were able to hold up."

## **SAFETY NET**

Ss Oshiomogho Atogwe and Corey Chavous have had solid performances in the first two weeks of the season. In Week 1 against Carolina, Atogwe led the team in tackles with 10 tackles (nine solo) with one pass defense, while Chavous tied for second on the team with eight tackles (five solo) and a forced fumble. Chavous stripped RB DeAngelo Williams after a 13-yard reception. The fumble was recovered LB Will Witherspoon to give the Rams possession. Last week against San Francisco, Chavous finished second on the team with eight tackles (three solo) and Atogwe was third among defensive backs with four tackles (two solo). Chavous is second on the team with 16 tackles (eight solo) and Atogwe is third with 14 tackles (11 solo).

## **FOR THE LONGEST TIME**

Since the Super Bowl era only five wide receiver tandems have been together for nine or more seasons. Rams' WRs Isaac Bruce and Torry Holt (1999-present) represent one pair, joining Pittsburgh's Lynn Swann and John Stallworth (1974-82), Miami's Mark Clayton and Mark Duper (1983-92), San Francisco's Jerry Rice and John Taylor (1987-95) and Denver's Rod Smith and Ed McCaffrey (1995-2003).

The tandem of Bruce and Holt has proven to be one of the most effective long-term wide receiver pairs in NFL history, as Bruce and Holt have more receptions (1,311) and receiving yards (19,700) than any of the other four pairings.

## **SACK ARTISTS**

DT La'Roi Glover and DE Leonard Little have been among the best in the NFL at sacking the quarterback. Glover is in his 12th season in the NFL this season, after finishing second on the team with 5.5 sacks in 2006. Little is in his 10th season, and led the team in sacks with 13.0 last season. Glover and Little rank 10th and 11th, respectively, on the NFL's career active sack leaders list. The Rams are the only team with two players in the top 11.

## **GIVE ME THE BALL**

## **A STRONG LEG**

K Jeff Wilkins continues to be on of the top place-kickers in the NFL. Wilkins has converted on five-of-six field goal attempts this season, his only miss coming on a 56-yarder. Wilkins has been successful on both of his PAT attempts this season and continues his streak of 348 consecutive PATs, which stands as a Rams' franchise-record and ranks second in NFL history behind Jason Elam's streak of 371 consecutive extra point conversions from 1993-2002.

Wilkins has converted 288 career field goals, which stands as the Rams' all-time mark and his 1,144 points make him the Rams' all-time scoring leader. Wilkins has shown a knack for hitting long-distance field goals, as he currently owns a Rams' record with 24 made field goals from at least 50 yards. The 24 field goals from at least 50 yards rank fourth among active players. Wilkins has made 33 of 45 field goal attempts from at least 49 yards.

Wilkins currently ranks sixth among active NFL players in points scored, and his .825 field goal percentage is tied for third among active players.

### **WHERE THERE'S A WILL...**

LB Will Witherspoon led the team with 11 tackles (nine solo) against San Francisco last week.

The performance marked his 22nd career double-digit tackle game, as well as the most tackles by Witherspoon in one game since he had a career-high 13 at San Diego last season (10/29).

Witherspoon led the team in tackles last season with 136 tackles (104 solo), and he is picking up where he left off this season, leading the team after two games with 19 tackles (14 solo).

### **BIG GAME T. HOLT**

WR Torry Holt is tied for fourth in the NFC in receptions (13) and ninth in the conference in receiving yards (147) after two games this season. Holt made five receptions for 74 yards and scored the team's only touchdown against San Francisco, a week after leading the team with eight receptions for 73 yards and one touchdown against Carolina. In the first quarter, Holt caught a 12-yard pass in the endzone, capping a six-play, 25-yard drive to give the Rams a 7-0 early lead.

Holt looks to have big numbers at Tampa Bay this week. In his four career games against the Bucs, Holt averages nearly nine catches and 142 yards per game. Holt has had more 100-yard receiving games against Tampa Bay (4) than any other team outside the NFC West division.

Holt continues to be among the leaders in the NFL in receiving. Since 2000, he leads the NFL in receiving yards with 10,034. Holt has 10,822 career receiving yards, ranking him 21st all-time on the NFL's receiving yards list.

The recovery led to a 53-yard field goal by K Jeff Wilkins to give the Rams a 16-14 lead.

## **NEW FACES JOIN RAMS STAFF**

**Mike Cox (Defensive Quality Control/Assistant Defensive Line)** – Cox joins the Rams after spending nearly 20 years at the collegiate level, including 17 seasons under the tutelage of former collegiate head coach John L. Smith. A four-time letterman at Idaho and a three-year starter at linebacker, Cox landed his first coaching position with his alma mater, where he spent eight seasons (1987-1994) as linebackers coach. Upon Smith's departure following the 1994 season, Cox followed his mentor to his next three stops, including a three season stint with Utah State (1995-1997), five seasons with Louisville (1998-2002) and five seasons with Michigan State (2002-2006), handling the linebackers at each spot while also serving as recruiting coordinator at Michigan State. In 2000, Louisville forced an NCAA-best 37 turnovers and in 2002 Louisville ranked among the NCAA leaders in rushing defense. As a player at Idaho, Cox recorded 252 tackles, which still ranks among the Vandals' all-time leaders.

**Keith Murphy (Offensive Quality Control)** – Murphy comes to the Rams after eight seasons coaching wide receivers and special teams at Eastern Washington University. A former wide receiver at the University of Washington, Murphy worked with receivers, quarterbacks and special teams as a graduate assistant with his alma mater under Scott Linehan for three seasons (1997-1999) after spending the 1996 campaign working with the running backs and special teams as a Huskies student assistant. During his five-year career as a player, Murphy was part of two Pac-10 Conference champion teams, as well as five bowl teams.

**Al Roberts (Special Teams)** – After spending the past four years coaching and teaching on the high school level, Al Roberts joins the Rams as special teams coach, bringing with him 17 years of NFL experience. After playing college football at the University of Washington and the University of Puget Sound, Roberts began a coaching career that took him to a variety of stops on both the collegiate and professional levels. Roberts returned to the University of Washington in 1977 as running backs coach, where he spent six years (1977-1982) before moving to the USFL. Roberts served as both running backs and special teams coach for the Los Angeles Express in 1983 and 1984, then moved to the Houston Oilers (1984-1995), Purdue University (1986) and University of Wyoming (1987). Roberts returned to the NFL in 1988, making stops as special teams coach with the Philadelphia Eagles (1988-1990), New York Jets (1991-1993) and Arizona Cardinals (1994-1995). In 1996 Roberts returned to the University of Washington, coaching running backs and special teams for one year before again moving to the NFL as special teams coach with the Cincinnati Bengals (1997-2002). In 1999 the Bengals finished third in the NFL in both kickoff and punt returns, while Tremain Mack became the first Bengal to lead the AFC (27.1 avg.) in kickoff returns, as well as the first Cincinnati player to be named to the Pro Bowl as a kick return specialist.

## **MARC OF SUCCESS**

QB Marc Bulger recorded his 24th career 300-yard passing game (including four 400-yard passing games) against San Francisco last week.

His 368 yards led the NFC in Week 2 and placed him second in the NFL behind Carson Palmer. Completing 24 of 41 passes, Bulger's passing performance ranks seventh among active quarterbacks for career 300-yard passing games. For the second week in a row Bulger connected with WR Torry Holt in the first quarter for a touchdown pass. The score marked the 40th career touchdown pass from Bulger to Holt and ranks second among active quarterback-receiver duos.

Against the 49ers, he hit Holt with a 12-yard touchdown strike, giving the Rams an early 7-0 lead.

## **HALL OF A PLAYER**

First-year Ram DE James Hall collected his first sack of the season last week against the 49ers. Hall brought down QB Alex Smith in the third quarter on third-and-5 for a 5-yard loss, forcing San Francisco to punt. Hall also tallied a season-high seven tackles (four solo), tied for second among defensive lineman, tied for third on the team.

## **BRUCE ALMIGHTY**

WR Isaac Bruce ranks seventh on both the NFL's all-time receptions list (898) and the all-time receiving yards list (13,541) after making eight receptions for 145 yards against San Francisco last week, the seventh highest receiving total in the NFL season thus far. This marks the 43<sup>rd</sup> 100-yard receiving game in Bruce's career. The last time was against the Washington Redskins last December when he made nine catches for 148 yards and one touchdown. Bruce also ranks second among active receivers in both career receptions and receiving yards and fourth in touchdown receptions (80).

The 14-year NFL veteran leads the Rams in receiving yards and heads into this week's contest having faced Tampa Bay four times in his career, tallying 11 catches for 163 yards (14.8 avg.).

#### **OFFENSE**

##### **QUARTERBACKS (2) – Doug Nussmeier**

Marc Bulger (7), Gus Frerotte (14)

Two-time Pro Bowler Marc Bulger starts at QB from the Rams. Bulger comes off of a career-year in 2006 and is the Rams' second-leading passer in team history, totalling over 16,000 yards. In 2007, Bulger has completed 46-of-83 passing attempts for 535 yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions for a 83.2 passer rating. In Week 2 vs. San Francisco 9/16, Bulger totaled 368 passing yards, which stands as the highest passing yardage total in the NFC in the young season. Backing up Bulger, is 14-year veteran **Gus Frerotte**. Frerotte provides valuable experience and is familiar with coach Scott Linehan's offensive system, after spending time with Linehan while he was the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Minnesota (2003-04) and Miami (2005).

##### **RUNNING BACKS (4) – Wayne Moses**

Steven Jackson (4), Brian Leonard (R), Travis Minor (7), Antonio Pittman (R)

Pro Bowler **Steven Jackson** serves as the Rams feature back. In Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9, Jackson rushed 18 times for 58 yards and added one receptions for three yards. In Week 2 vs. San Francisco, Jackson totaled 96 total yards, after rushing for 60 yards on 21 carries and gaining 36 receiving yards on three receptions. Jackson leads the Rams in 2007, with 118 rushing yards on 39 carries. Rams 2007 second-round draft pick **Brian Leonard**, serves as Jackson's backup and has the versatility to play fullback. The former All-America honoree from Rutgers has made most of his contributions in 2007 as a receiver out of the backfield, gaining 35 yards on five receptions. **Travis Minor** joined the Rams in the offseason after spending the previous six seasons with Miami. Minor provides added depth and valuable contributions on special teams. Minor received his first carry of the season vs. San Francisco, gaining four yards. Minor is second on the squad with two special teams tackles after posting one tackle in each of the team's first two games. Rookie Antonio Pittman, joined the Rams on a waiver claim 9/2 afer being waived by the New Orleans Saints during final roster cuts, but has been a gameday inactive in each of the first two weeks of the season. Pittman, a fourth-round draft choice of the Saints out of Ohio State, ranks eighth on the Buckeyes' all-time rushing list despite playing only three seasons.

### **WIDE RECEIVERS (6) – Henry Ellard**

Drew Bennett (7), Isaac Bruce (14), Marques Hagans (1), Dante Hall (8), Torry Holt (9), Dane Looker (7)

The Rams' receiving corps is led by Torry Holt and Isaac Bruce, two of the best wide receivers in the NFL. Holt and Bruce are one of only five pairs of wide receivers who have played together for nine or more seasons in the Super Bowl era. The pair has totaled 1,311 receptions and 19,700 receiving yards with 117 touchdowns since their first season together in 1999. Holt leads the Rams this season with 13 receptions and 147 yards with two touchdowns while Bruce has added 11 receptions for 165 yards, including posting eight receptions for 145 yards in Week 2 vs. San Francisco 9/16. After spending the past six seasons with the Tennessee Titans, **Drew Bennett** joins the Rams after signing as a free agent in the offseason. Bennett made his debut for the Rams in Week 2 vs. San Francisco, posting three catches for 42 yards. Bennett was deactivated for the season opening contest vs. Carolina 9/9 after suffering a thigh injury in practice. Joining Bennett as a new addition to the Rams receiving corps is former Kansas City Chief **Dante Hall**. One of the most dynamic return men in NFL history, Hall entered 2007 with 11 return touchdowns, good for third in NFL history. Hall proved his worth quickly in the 2007, returning the opening kickoff of the second half vs. Carolina for 84 yards. Hall also has two catches for 18 yards. **Dane Looker** is in his fifth year with the Rams and is an important backup at the receiver position and critical on special teams, serving as the holder for K Jeff Wilkins. Looker saw action vs. Carolina 9/9, catching two passes for 10 yards. Second-year receiver **Marques Hagans** joined the Rams' 53-man roster this season after spending the 2006 campaign as a member of the practice squad. Hagans, selected by the Rams in the fifth round of the 2006 NFL Draft, is a former college quarterback and also serves as the team's emergency signal-caller.

### **TIGHT ENDS (4) – Judd Garrett**

Dominique Byrd (2), Joe Klopfenstein (2), Randy McMichael (6), Aaron Walker (5)

**Randy McMichael** starts at tight end for the Rams, after joining the team as a free agent in the offseason from Miami. McMichael spent five seasons with the Dolphins, one of which was spent under the tutelage of then Dolphins offensive coordinator Scott Linehan. McMichael is a receiving threat and an effective blocker from the tight end position. In 2007, McMichael has made four receptions for 64 yards, including a two-catch 40-yard performance in Week 2 vs. San Francisco 9/16. A pair of second-year tight ends, **Joe Klopfenstein** and **Dominique Byrd**, join fifth-year player, **Aaron Walker**, to provide depth at

the position. Richard Owens joined the Rams after being signed as a free agent 9/12. Owens, a four-year veteran, was waived by Minnesota during final roster cuts and was inactive for the Rams' Week 2 contest vs. San Francisco.

The Rams' offensive line suffered a tough blow in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9 when starting left tackle Orlando Pace suffered his second season-ending injury in as many seasons, when he suffered a shoulder injury in the second quarter. **Pace**, a former No. 1 overall pick, had his streak of seven consecutive Pro Bowls snapped last year after his season was derailed by a torn triceps. **Alex Barron**, a third-year veteran, moves to the left side of the line and serves as the team's starting left tackle in place of the injured Pace. Barron, returns to the position for his most extensive action since he was a senior at Florida State University. **Richie Incognito**, also a third-year veteran is the Rams' starting right guard, but has been sidelined with an ankle sprain that kept him out of the team's opener vs. Carolina and the Week 2 matchup vs. San Francisco. **Brett Romberg** serves as the Rams' starting center after winning the job in training camp, the first time in his career that he has been named a full-time starter. **Mark Setterstrom**, starts at left guard for the Rams after he was called upon to start the final six games at left guard. **Milford Brown** joined the Rams in training camp to provide depth, but was pushed into service in Week 1 vs. Carolina after Incognito was unable to play. Brown switched positions again after the loss of Pace. With Barron moving to left tackle, Brown took Barron's place on the right side of the line and will serve as the team's starting right tackle. Veteran center **Andy McCollum** returns for his 14th NFL season and is a valuable backup. **Adam Goldberg** provides valuable versatility as a backup lineman during the 2006 season. Goldberg served as the Rams' left tackle vs. Carolina after Pace left the game due to injury and saw some action vs. San Francisco after Claude Terrell missed brief time with a thigh bruise. **Terrell** provides added depth at the guard position, and started at right guard for the Rams vs. San Francisco in place of Incognitor.

## ***DEFENSE / SPECIAL TEAMS***

### **DEFENSIVE LINE (8) – Brian Baker, Mike Cox**

Victor Adeyanju (2), Adam Carriker (R), La'Roi Glover (12), James Hall (8), Trevor Johnson (4), Louis Leonard (R), Leonard Little (10), Clifton Ryan (R).

**DE Leonard Little**, the Rams' all-time leader in sacks since

the statistic was made official in 1982, starts at right defensive end. Little ranks 11th among active players with 74.0 sacks. This season Little has totaled 11 tackles, tied for the team lead among defensive linemen. In Week 2 vs. San Francisco 9/16 Little notched six tackles. **DE James Hall** starts at left end for the Rams after joining the Rams in the offseason in a trade with Detroit. In his first game as a Ram in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9, Hall notched four total tackles, including one tackle for loss. Hall is tied with Little for the most tackles among Rams' defensive linemen with 11 take-downs. and notched seven tackles in Week 2 vs. San Francisco. **DT La'Roi Glover** and **DT Adam Carriker** start along the inside of the Rams' defensive line. Glover, who is in his 12th season, stands 10th among active players with 77 sacks. Glover has 10 tackles through the first two games of the 2007 season. Carriker, the Rams' 2007 first-round draft pick is playing nose tackle after a standout career at defensive end for Nebraska. In his debut vs. Carolina, Carriker notched three assisted tackles and has four total tackles on the year. DT Clifton Ryan has been called upon to give the Rams' significant playing time after second-year player DT Claude Wroten was suspended for four games and will be unable to play until the Rams' contest at Baltimore 10/14. Ryan proved to be ready to contribute as he saw increased action in the Week 2 matchup vs. San Francisco. Ryan, the Rams' defensive lineman with eight total tackles including two sacks and also caused a fumble by 49ers QB Alex Smith, which he recovered himself. **DE Victor Adeyanju** had a promising rookie season in 2006, and provides important depth on the defensive line. Adeyanju was unable to get onto the field in the season opener vs. Carolina, being declared inactive after suffering an ankle injury in practice, but returned to see action in Week 2 vs. San Francisco. **DE Trevor Johnson** also provides depth at the defensive end position for the Rams. Johnson, who has made two tackles in 2007, joined the Rams in the offseason after splitting time between the New York Jets and New Orleans in 2006. **DT Louis Leonard**, a rookie from Fresno State, was added to the Rams active roster from San Diego's practice squad 9/12.

#### **LINEBACKERS (7) – Rick Venturi**

Brandon Chillar (4), Quinton Culberson (R), Chris Draft (9), Tim McGarigle (1), Raonall Smith (6), Pisa Tinoisamoa (5), Will Witherspoon (6)

Six-year veteran **Will Witherspoon** starts at middle linebacker for the Rams and leads the team with 19 tackles in 2007. Witherspoon started fast this season, totaling eight tackles, one pass defended and one fumble recovery in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9 and added 11 total tackles in Week 2 vs. San Francisco. Witherspoon led the team in tackles in 2006, his first season with the team. Starting at strongside linebacker, **Brandon Chillar** had seven tackles, one forced fumble and a fumble recovery in the Rams' season opener

vs. Carolina and six tackles in Week 2 vs. San Francisco. Chillar also sees action on special teams and is tied for second place on the team with two special teams tackles. **Pisa Tinoisamoa**, starts at weakside linebacker and has three tackles in 2007, all of which he notched in the season-opener vs. Carolina. Tinoisamoa missed the Week 2 matchup vs. San Francisco with an ankle injury. The Rams acquired free agent **Chris Draft** in the offseason, and the nine-year veteran from Stanford, is an important backup and special teams player, with the ability to be a starter. Draft has five total tackles in 2007 and started at weakside linebacker in Week 2 vs. San Francisco in place of Tinoisamo, making three total tackles on defense and adding one tackle on special teams. **Raonall Smith** is a valuable asset on special teams and provides depth at linebacker. In the 2007 season opener vs. Carolina, Smith notched two special teams tackles and added one special teams tackle vs. San Francisco, tying him for the team lead with three special teams tackles. 2006 seventh-round draft choice **Tim McGarigle** spent last season on the Rams' practice squad, but has found a home on the team's active roster this season despite being slowed by a hamstring injury in the preseason. McGarigle serves as a backup linebacker and is an important special teams player. Undrafted rookie free agent **Quinton Culberson** from Mississippi State rounds out the linebacking corps. Culberson was inactive in the season-opener, but saw his first NFL action in Week 2 vs. San Francisco, notching two special teams tackles and earning Special Teams Player of the Week from the team's coaches.

#### **SECONDARY (9) – Willy Robinson, Ron Milus**

Oshiomogho Atogwe (3), Ron Bartell (3), Jerome Carter (3), Corey Chavous (10), Tye Hill (2), Todd Johnson (5), Darius Vinnett (R), Jonathan Wade (R), Lenny Walls (6)

**S Corey Chavous**, a 10-year veteran, starts at strong safety for the Rams and provides valuable leadership for a secondary that features only two other players with five or more years of experience. Chavous stands second on the team with 16 total tackles and notched eight total tackles in each of the Rams first two games. Starting free safety **S Oshiomogho Atogwe** got off to a fast start in 2007, leading the team in tackles with 10 in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9. Atogwe's 14 tackles are third on the team in 2007. **CB Ron Bartell**, starts at cornerback in place of Fakhir Brown, who is serving a four-game suspension. Bartell has impressed notching 12 tackles including 1.0 sack in 2007 and has been an important part of a Rams' defense that ranks fourth in the NFL in pass defense. **CB Tye Hill**, a second-year player out of Clemson, starts opposite of Bartell. Hill made six tackles in the Rams season-opener vs. Carolina, but will miss some time due to a back injury that was suffered in practice prior to the Week 2 contest vs. San Francisco. CB Lenny Walls started in Hill's place vs. San Francisco and had a solid per-

formance with three tackles and one pass defended. Walls serves as the team's nickelback, but will start while Hill is out. **S Jerome Carter** serves as a backup safety and sees action on special teams. Carter posted his first special teams tackle of the year vs. San Francisco. **S Todd Johnson**, aquired in the offseason as a free agent, provides valuable experience and is a standout on special teams. In Week 1 vs. Carolina, Johnson shared the Rams' special teams Player of the Week honors with LB Brandon Chillar after Johnson notched two special teams tackles. 2007 third-round pick **CB Jonathan Wade** out of Tennessee contributes as a backup in the secondary this season and is a gunner on the Rams' punt coverage teams. Wade saw extensive action in Week 2 vs. San Francisco as the team's nickelback after the injury to Hill moved Walls into the starting lineup. Wade earned *Associated Press* All-Southeastern Conference honors.

**K Jeff Wilkins** continues to be one of the best kickers in the NFL. Wilkins has converted on five-of-six field goal attempts this season, his only miss coming on a 56-yarder. Wilkins has been successful on both of his PAT attempts this season and continues his streak of 348 consecutive PATs, which stands as a Rams' franchise-record and ranks second in NFL history behind Jason Elam's streak of 371 consecutive extra point conversions from 1993-2002. Wilkins has converted 288 career field goals, which stands as the Rams' all-time mark and his 1,144 points make him the Rams' all-time scoring leader. **LS Chris Massey**, one of the most consistent players at his position, continues long snapping duties, while **P Donnie Jones** plays his first season with the Rams after spending 2006 in Miami. Jones has punted nine times this season for 396 yards, posting a 44-yard average and a 40.3-yard net average with three punts inside the 20.
