THE ANATOMY OF A RIVALRY

The Rams head to the Pacific Northwest to take on NFC rival Seattle Seahawks for the first of two meetings this season. Both teams are coming off losses in Week 6, with the Rams losing 22-3 at Baltimore, and Seattle falling to New Orleans 28-17 on Sunday Night Football.

The Rams lead the all-time series against the Seahawks 10-8, dating to a 45-6 victory in Seattle's inaugural season in 1976. Since the Seahawks joined the NFC West due to realignment in 2002, the Seahawks hold a 6-4 advantage in the regular season, while the Rams have won the only post-season game between the teams, a 27-20 victory in the NFC Wildcard Playoff game in 2004.

Since Seattle joined the NFC West, the teams have had close games. In 11 meetings, seven have been decided by a touchdowns or less.

Sept. 21, 2003 – Seahawks Stadium Seattle 24, Rams 23

The Rams took a 23-10 lead into the fourth quarter. Seattle QB Matt Hasselbeck hit WR Darrell Jackson for a touchdown score, and with 1:03 left, connected with WR Koren Robinson on a 3-yard touchdown pass to give Seattle the victory.

Dec. 14, 2003 – Edward Jones Dome Rams 27, Seattle 22

Seattle cut the Rams lead to 24-22 on a 2-yard touchdown run by RB Shaun with 10 minutes left in the game. After a 10-play, 57-yard drive, K Jeff Wilkins hit a 46-yard field goal to give the Rams 27-22 lead with only 1:37 left in the game.

Oct. 10, 2004 – Qwest Field Rams 33, Seattle 27 (OT)

The Rams' 17-point fourth quarter comeback marked the second-largest comeback with less than six minutes left to play in NFL history. In the fourth quarter, QB Marc Bulger

connected with TE Brandon Manumaleuna and WR Kevin Curtis for touchdowns and Wilkins hit a 36-yard field goal to force the game into overtime. In overtime, Bulger hit WR Shaun McDonald for a 52-yard touchdown strike for the win.

Jan. 8, 2005 – Qwest Field Rams 27, Seattle 20 NFC Wildcard Game

With 5:42 to play, Bulger led a seven-play, 76-yard drive that was capped with a touchdown pass to TE Cam Cameron to give the Rams a 27-20 lead. Hasselbeck led the Seahawks downfield, and on fourth-and-1 from the Rams' 5-yard line with 27 seconds left, Hasselbeck threw an incomplete pass to WR Bobby Engram in the endzone for the final margin.

Oct. 9, 2005 – Edward Jones Dome Seattle 37, Rams 31

The Rams cut Seattle's lead to 37-31 with less than four minutes to play. After forcing Seattle into fourth-and-11, Shaun McDonald fumbled the punt return and Seattle recovers to run out the clock.

Oct. 15, 2006 – Edward Jones Dome Seattle 30, Rams 28

With 1:44 to play, Bulger connected with Holt for a 67-yard touchdown reception to give the Rams a 28-27 lead. With four seconds left, Seattle's K Josh Brown hit a 54-yard field goal for the win.

Nov. 11, 2006 – Qwest Field Seattle 24, Rams 22

The Rams took a 22-21 lead on a 14-yard touchdown run by Steven Jackson with 2:37 left. Seattle marched down field and with 13 seconds left on the clock, Brown made a 38-yard field goal, giving the Seahawks a 24-22 victory.

LAST WEEK

M&T Bank Stadium, October 14, 2007 (71,175) – The Rams traveled to Baltimore in Week 6 to take on the Ravens for just the fourth time in franchise history, falling by a final score of 22-3. WR Torry Holt caught four passes for 33 yards, moving into 24th on the NFL's all-time receptions list with 744. Second-year WR Marques Hagans totaled 74 receiving yards on five receptions, both team highs, in his second regular season NFL game. LB Pisa Tinoisamoa made 15 total tackles for the second consecutive week while also adding his first interception since 2005. DE Leonard Little recorded his first sack and forced fumble of the 2007 season, bringing down Ravens QB Kyle Boller before DE Victor Adeyanju returned the fumble deep into Baltimore territory. A St. Louis native and graduate of Hazelwood East High School, WR Brandon Williams made his Rams debut five days after signing with the team. Williams, who served as the primary kick return specialist of the San Francisco 49ers in 2006, returned five kickoffs for 112 yards, both career highs, in addition to returning two punts for 22 yards. K Jeff Wilkins connected on a 32-yard field goal attempt midway through the third quarter to give the Rams their only points, as a career-high five field goals from Ravens K Matt Stover proved to be enough to secure the victory for Baltimore.

THE HEAD COACHES

SCOTT LINEHAN (2nd season as head coach, 2nd with Rams; Career Record: 8-14) – Named twenty-second head coach in franchise history by Owner/Chairman Georgia Frontiere on January 19, 2006. Linehan rallied the Rams to an 8-8 finish in his first season. Quarterback Marc Bulger enjoyed the best season of his career, including 4,301 yards passing and 24 touchdowns. Balancing the offensive attack, Linehan guided Steven Jackson to lead the league with 2,334 combined yards, and set a Rams running back record with 90 catches. Prior to joining the Rams, Linehan was the offensive coordinator of the Miami Dolphins; the Dolphins improved from 29th in 2004 to 14th in total offensive in 2005. Linehan spent three seasons (2002-2004) as offensive coordinator for the Minnesota Vikings. In 2004, Daunte Culpepper posted the fourth-highest single season passer rating in NFL history (110.9). A college quarterback, Linehan was a free agent signee with the Dallas Cowboys before a shoulder injury ended his active career.

MIKE HOLMGREN (16th season as head coach, 9th with Seattle; Career Record: 162-106) – Named as the Seahawks' sixth head coach on January 8, 1999. In 2006, the Seahawks won their third consecutive NFC West crown and fifth-ever division title. In 2005, led them to a franchise-best record 13-3 finish, and their first-ever Super Bowl berth. In 2003, the Seahawks posted their first double-digit victory total since 1986. Holmgren joined Seattle after serving as the head coach of the Packers (1992-98). By winning at least one game in five consecutive postseasons (1993-97) Holmgren joined John Madden (1973-77) as the only coaches in league history to accomplish that feat. In 21 NFL seasons (1999-2006 head coach Seattle, 1992-98 head coach Green Bay, 1986-91 assistant coach San Francisco) Holmgren's teams have a 218-116-1 (.652) record, posted double-digit win totals 12 times, made the postseason 16 times, won three Super Bowls (XXIII, XXIV, and XXXI), and reached two others (XXXII and XL).

THE LAST TIME

Qwest Field, November 12, 2006 (68,175) – For the second time in 2006, the Rams lost to division rivals, the Seattle Seahawks, by a game-winning field goal in the last seconds of the game. WR Isaac Bruce passed WR Irving Fryar (851) for ninth place on the NFL's all-time receptions list with seven receptions (855). QB Marc Bulger passed for 215 yards and tied QB Kurt Warner for fourth place on the Rams' all-time passing yards list with 14,447 yards. The Rams' defense came out strong, recording six sacks for 38 yards, three forced fumbles, and two turnovers. DE Leonard Little had 2.0 sacks, marking his fourth multi-sack game of the season, and 70 sacks for his career. The Rams scored on the first series of the game when rookie DE Victor Adeyanju had an 89-yard fumble return for a touchdown, after Little sacked QB Seneca Wallace, forcing him to fumble. The Seahawks answered with a touchdown, but a 40-yard field goal by K Jeff Wilkins put the Rams up by three (10-7) at the end of the first quarter. The Seahawks regained the lead with a second quarter touchdown. A 42-yard field goal by Wilkins brought the Rams to within one (14-13) at the half. The Rams held Seattle scoreless in the third quarter, and regained the lead (16-14) with a 35-yard field goal by Wilkins. Seattle got back on top in the fourth quarter with a 90-yard punt return for a touchdown, but the Rams regained a 22-21 lead with a 14-yard touchdown run by RB Steven Jackson with 2:30 remaining. A field goal in the last seconds of the game put the Seahawks on top, 24-22, for the final score.

BULGER vs. HASSELBECK

In 2002, the St. Louis Rams and Seattle Seahawks become division foes in the newly re-aligned NFC West.

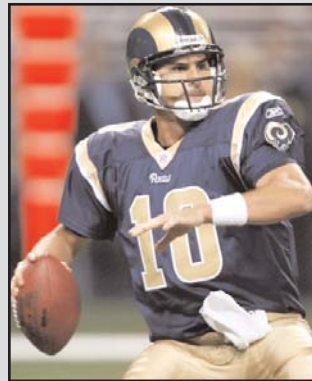
That same season, Marc Bulger started seven games for the Rams after injuries sidelined Kurt Warner, who began the year as the Rams starter at QB.

In Seattle, Matt Hasselbeck became the starter for the Seahawks, starting 10 games, after injuries sidelined opening day starter, Trent Dilfer.

Since that season in 2002, Bulger and Hasselbeck have gone on to become the long-term starters in the NFL, and have proven to be two of the best QBs in the league.

Since 2002, Hasselbeck (17,709) and Bulger (16,998) rank sixth and seventh, respectively, in passing yards. Bulger's 63.9 completion percentage ranks sixth in the NFL since 2002 and Hasselbeck's 61.4 completion percentage ranks 18th. Hasselbeck's 114 touchdowns since 2002, rank fourth and Bulger's 97 touchdowns is tied for 8th. Bulger's 89.7 passer rating is 8th in the NFL since 2002 and Hasselbeck's 87.5 passer rating stands 11th.

A PUNTING JONES

After setting career numbers this season, P Donnie Jones continues to lead the NFL in punting average (50.1 yards) and is third in the NFL in net punting average (42.0 yards). Last week at Baltimore, Jones punted twice for a 44.0 average, with one inside the 20-yard line and a long of 48 yards.

Against Arizona in Week 5, Jones made four punts for a 56.0 average with a long of 60 yards. His 56.0-yard gross average was the best single game average in franchise history, passing Jack Jacobs' 55.8-yard average at Detroit Sept. 27, 1942.

A week earlier at Dallas, Jones punted eight times for a 55.3-yard average with a career long of 66 yards, two touchbacks and four kicks inside the 20-yard line.

ST. LOUIS RAM ISAAC BRUCE JOINS VOLUNTEERS FROM THE HOME DEPOT AND KABOOM! TO REFURBISH THE FOOTBALL FIELD AT NORTHWEST HIGH SCHOOL IN ST. LOUIS

--National Neighborhood MVP Program Honors Bruce for Giving Back to the Community--

Isaac Bruce, wide receiver for the St. Louis Rams, along with volunteers from The Home Depot, organizers from the non-profit organization KaBOOM!, PHL Inc. and members of the local community are joining forces to completely refurbish the football field at Northwest High School in just one day on Tuesday, October 16.

The field refurbishment is part of The Home Depot NFL Neighborhood MVP program that recognizes and celebrates NFL players for their commitment to giving back to their local communities. Bruce was one of 17 players selected league-wide for his support of health and wellness programs for youth. Through the Isaac Bruce Foundation, which is focused on health, wellness, nutrition, fitness and education, Bruce reaches out to youth and teaches them at an early age the importance of a healthy lifestyle. The Home Depot developed the NFL Neighborhood MVP program as part of its ongoing commitment to give back to the communities its associates live and work in.

The football field renovation project will impact the more than 350 students at Northwest High School. The new field will provide more opportunities for students to play in organized leagues, providing them with positive opportunities to build character, and will give them a sense of pride in their school, community and in themselves.

The Home Depot became the "official home improvement sponsor" of the National Football League® in late 2006. To support this partnership, The Home Depot NFL Neighborhood MVP program was created to recognize players who are making a positive impact in their local communities. BIG GAME T. HOLT

WR Torry Holt moved into 24th place on the NFL's all-time receptions list with 744, passing Andre Rison (743), after finishing tied second on the team with four catches for 33 yards at Baltimore last week.

Holt passed the 11,000-receiving yard against Arizona in Week 5 against Arizona, ranking him 20th on the NFL's all-time receiving yards list. Holt reached the 11,000-yard mark in 131 games, the fastest of any player in league history. Holt finished the game leading the team with 89 receiving yards off of five receptions and one touchdown.

At Dallas in Week 4, Torry led the team with five receptions for 52 yards and was the top receiver with five receptions for 63 yards at Tampa Bay in Week 3. In the season opener, he made a season-high eight receptions for 73 yards against Carolina.

Since 2000, one year after Holt entered the NFL, he has 10,271 receiving yards, more than any other player in the league. From 2000-2005, he had at least 1,300 receiving yards in each season, the first player in NFL history with six consecutive 1,300-yard receiving season.

Holt has the most receiving yards (10,675) in a player's first eight seasons in NFL history and has the second most 100-yard receiving games in a player's first eight seasons (43).

This season, Holt has led the team in receiving yards four of six games. On the season, he has 32 receptions for 384 yards (12.0 avg.) and three touchdowns.

RETURNING HOME

St. Louis native and Hazelwood East High graduate, WR Brandon Williams, saw significant action in his first game as a Ram last week at Baltimore.

Williams, who signed with the Rams Oct. 9, five days before the game at Baltimore, served as the team's primary kick returner due to injuries to WR Dante Hall, and also served as the team's third WR after an injury to Drew Bennett in the first half.

Williams set a personal-best with 112 kickoff return yards at Baltimore, on a career-high five kickoff returns. Williams also returned two punts for 22 yards. The 134 combined returned yards were also a career high and the performance marked the second time in Williams' career that he eclipsed the 100-yards returning mark.

Williams served as the primary kick returner for San Francisco in 2006, returning 22 punts for 147 yards with 12 fair catches and returning 16 kickoffs for 380 yards. Williams played in three games with the 49ers this season before being released.

FOR THE LONGEST TIME

Since the Super Bowl era only five wide receiver tandems have been together for nine or more seasons. Rams' WRs Isaac Bruce and Torry Holt (1999-present) represent one pair, joining Pittsburgh's Lynn Swann and John Stallworth (1974-82), Miami's Mark Clayton and Mark Duper (1983-92), San Francisco's Jerry Rice and John Taylor (1987-95) and Denver's Rod Smith and Ed McCaffrey (1995-2003).

The tandem of Bruce and Holt has proven to be one of the most effective long-term wide receiver pairs in NFL history, as Bruce and Holt have more receptions (1,334) and receiving yards (19,975) than any of the other four pairings.

RT Adam Goldberg who started for the Rams at Tampa Bay and in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, suffered a knee injury versus the Cowboys and is also out for the season. Pace suffered a shoulder injury in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9 and Setterstrom injured his knee during the Rams' Week 3 matchup at Tampa Bay 9/23.

The Rams used their 10th and 11th different offensive line combinations of the season in Week 6 at Baltimore 10/14. Two-time Pro Bowler Marc Bulger starts at QB for the Rams, but was sidelined over the past two contests with a rib injury. In 2007, Bulger has completed 74-of-133 passing attempts for 765 yards with two touchdowns and four interceptions for a 64.9 passer rating. In Week 2 vs. San Francisco 9/16, Bulger totaled 368 passing yards, the 24th 300-yard passing performance of his career. Backing up Bulger, is 14-year veteran **Gus Frerotte**. Frerotte provides valuable experience and is familiar with coach Scott Linehan's offensive system, after spending

time with Linehan while he was the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Minnesota (2003-04) and Miami (2005). Frerotte started in place of Bulger in Week 5 vs. Arizona 10/7 and in Week 6 at Baltimore 10/14. In his first start, Frerotte completed 24-of-43 passes for 262 yards with three touchdowns and three interceptions.

RUNNING BACKS (5) – Wayne Moses

Steven Jackson (4), Brian Leonard (R), Travis Minor (7), Richard Owens (4), Antonio Pittman (R)

Pro Bowler **Steven Jackson** serves as the Rams feature back. In Week 3 vs. Tampa Bay 9/23 Jackson posted his first 100-yard rushing performance of the year, rushing 30 times for 115 yards. Jackson leads the Rams in 2007, with 233 rushing yards on 69 carries. Jackson has been sidelined for three games after suffering a groin injury vs. Tampa Bay. Rams 2007 second-round draft pick **Brian Leonard**, replaces Jackson in the starting lineup. In his second start of his young NFL career in Week 5 vs. Arizona 10/7, Leonard rushed for 102 yards on 18 carries, the first 100-yard rushing performance of his career. Leonard also made five receptions for 33 yards. In his first NFL start in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, Leonard rushed 16 times for 58 yards. The former All-America honoree from Rutgers has made contributions in 2007 as a rusher and as a receiver out of the backfield, rushing 50 times for 199 yards and gaining 98 yards on 15 receptions. **Travis Minor** joined the Rams in the offseason after spending the previous six seasons with Miami. Minor provides added depth and valuable contributions on special teams. Minor saw his most extensive action on offense this season in Week 6 at Baltimore 10/14, leading the Rams with 40 rushing yards on seven carries. Minor made three tackles on special teams vs. Arizona and is tied for second on the squad with six special teams tackles. Rookie **Antonio Pittman**, joined the Rams on a waiver claim 9/2 after being waived by the New Orleans Saints during final roster cuts. Pittman made his NFL debut vs Arizona, playing on special teams. Pittman made his first NFL carry at Baltimore and finished with five carries for 11 yards. Pittman, a fourth-round draft choice of the Saints out of Ohio State, ranks eighth on the Buckeyes' all-time rushing list despite playing only three seasons. **FB Richard Owens** joined the Rams after being signed as a free agent 9/12. Owens, a four-year veteran, was waived by Minnesota during final roster cuts and saw his first action as a Ram at Tampa Bay.

WIDE RECEIVERS (7) – Henry Ellard

Drew Bennett (7), Isaac Bruce (14), Marques Hagans (1), Dante Hall (8), Torry Holt (9), Dane Looker (7), Brandon Williams (2)

The Rams' receiving corps is led by **Torry Holt** and **Isaac Bruce**, two of the best wide receivers in the NFL. Holt and Bruce are one of only five pairs of wide receivers who have played together for nine or more seasons in the Super Bowl era. The pair has totaled 1,334 receptions and 19,975 receiving yards with 118 touchdowns since their first season together in 1999. Holt leads the Rams this season with 32 receptions and 384 yards with three touchdowns. With a 26-yard reception on a Gus Frerotte pass in the fourth quarter of the Week 5 matchup vs. Arizona 10/7, Holt surpassed 11,000 career receiving yards, becoming the fastest player in NFL history to reach the milestone, accomplishing the feat in 131 games. Bruce has added 15 receptions for 203 yards, including posting eight receptions for 145 yards in Week 2 vs. San Francisco 9/16. With his three receptions in Week 3 at Tampa Bay 9/23, Bruce surpassed 900 receptions during his career and reached the milestone in only 186 games, becoming the third-fastest player to reach the mark in NFL history. After spending the past six seasons with the Tennessee Titans, **Drew Bennett** joins the Rams after signing as a free agent in the offseason. Bennett's status for this week's game at Seattle is uncertain after suffering a hamstring injury last week at Baltimore 10/14. Bennett made his first start as a Ram vs. Arizona, catching two passes for 32 yards including a 16-yard touchdown pass. Bennett made his debut for the Rams in Week 2 vs. San Francisco, posting three catches for 42 yards. Bennett was deactivated for the season opening contest vs. Carolina 9/9 after suffering a thigh injury in practice. Joining Bennett as a new addition to the Rams receiving corps is former Kansas City Chief **Dante Hall**. One of the most dynamic return men in NFL history, Hall entered 2007 with 11 return touchdowns, good for third in NFL history. Hall proved his worth quickly in the 2007, returning the opening kickoff of the second half vs. Carolina for 84 yards. Hall produced his first kick return touchdown as a Ram in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, taking a Mat McBriar punt back 85 yards for a touchdown. Hall is tied for second in NFL history with 12 total kick return touchdowns (six kickoff returns, six punt returns). Hall is currently out of the lineup after suffering an ankle injury vs. Arizona. **Dane Looker** is in his fifth year with the Rams and is an important backup at the receiver position and critical on special teams, serving as the holder for K Jeff Wilkins. Looker saw action on offense vs. Carolina 9/9, catching two passes for 10 yards. Second-year receiver **Marques Hagans** joined the Rams' 53-man roster this season after spending the 2006 campaign as a member of the practice squad. Hagans, selected by the Rams in the fifth round of the 2006 NFL Draft, is

a former college quarterback and also serves as the team's emergency signal-caller. Hagans led all Rams receivers at Baltimore with five catches for 74 yards in only his second NFL game. Hagans made his NFL debut vs. Arizona, entering the game in place of Dante Hall who left the game with an ankle injury. Hagans returned one kick-off for 20 yards and also caught one pass for 11 yards.

Brandon Williams joined the Rams five days prior to last week's game at Baltimore, but was called on early to produce. Williams, a St. Louis native, served as the team's primary kick returner due to injuries to Dante Hall, and also served as the team's third WR after an injury to Drew Bennett in the first half. Williams set a personal-best with 112 kickoff return yards at Baltimore, on a career-high five kickoff returns for 112 yards. Williams also returned two punts for 22 yards. The 134 combined returned yards were also a career high and the performance marked the second time in Williams' career that he eclipsed the 100-yards returning mark. Williams spent 2006 with the San Francisco 49ers, serving as the team's primary returner.

TIGHT ENDS (4) – Judd Garrett

Dominique Byrd (2), Joe Klopfenstein (2), Randy McMichael (6), Aaron Walker (5)

Randy McMichael starts at tight end for the Rams, after joining the team as a free agent in the offseason from Miami. McMichael spent five seasons with the Dolphins, one of which was spent under the tutelage of then Dolphins offensive coordinator Scott Linehan. McMichael is a receiving threat and an effective blocker from the tight end position. In Week 5 vs. Arizona 10/7, McMichael scored his first touchdown as a Ram on a 29-yard reception in the fourth quarter. In 2007, McMichael has made 14 receptions for 175 yards and one touchdown. A pair of second-year tight ends, **Joe Klopfenstein** and **Dominique Byrd**, join fifth-year player, **Aaron Walker**, to provide depth at the position. Klopfenstein has made four starts this season, as the Rams have opened many contests in two-tight end sets. Walker made his first start of the season vs. Arizona and also started in Week 6 at Baltimore 10/14.

OFFENSIVE LINE (8) – Paul Boudreau, Jim Chaney

Alex Barron (3), Milford Brown (6), Brandon Gorin (7), Richie Incognito (3), Nick Leckey (4), Andy McCollum (14), Brett Romberg (4), Claude Terrell (3)

Due to injuries, the Rams' offensive line has undergone shuffling throughout the 2007 season. Starting **RG Richie Incognito** missed the first four games of the season due to an ankle injury, before returning to action in Week 5 vs. Arizona 10/7. Starting **LT Orlando Pace**, starting **LG Mark Setterstrom** and **Adam Goldberg**, who had been serving

as the Rams' starting RT after the injury to Pace, have all been lost for the season. Pace suffered a shoulder injury in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9 and Setterstrom injured his knee during the Rams' Week 3 matchup at Tampa Bay 9/23. **Pace**, a former No. 1 overall pick, had his streak of seven consecutive Pro Bowls snapped last year after his season was derailed by a torn triceps. After six games, the Rams have used 11 different offensive line combinations. **Alex Barron**, a third-year veteran, moves to the left side of the line and serves as the team's starting left tackle in place of the injured Pace. Barron, returns to the position for his most extensive action since he was a senior at Florida State University. **Brett Romberg** serves as the Rams' starting center after winning the job in training camp, the first time in his career that he has been named a full-time starter. **Milford Brown** joined the Rams in training camp to provide depth, but was pushed into service in Week 1 vs. Carolina after Incognito was unable to play. Brown switched positions again after the loss of Pace. With Barron moving to left tackle, Brown took Barron's place on the right side of the line in Week 2 vs. San Francisco. At Tampa Bay, Brown served as a reserve, but was called upon at LG after the injury to Setterstrom. Brown returned to the starting lineup at RT in Week 5 vs. Dallas 10/7. Veteran center **Andy McCollum** returns for his 14th NFL season and after serving as a valuable backup in the beginning of the year, McCollum has moved into the starting lineup at LG, a position he hasn't played extensively since the 2003 season. **Claude Terrell** provides added depth at the guard position, and started at right guard for the Rams vs. San Francisco and at Tampa Bay in place of Incognito and started at left guard at Dallas after the loss of Setterstrom. **C Nick Leckey**, who has also played G, was signed 10/6.

DEFENSE / SPECIAL TEAMS

DEFENSIVE LINE (8) – Brian Baker, Mike Cox

Victor Adeyanju (2), Adam Carriker (R), La'Roi Glover (12), James Hall (8), Trevor Johnson (4), Leonard Little (10), Clifton Ryan (R), Claude Wroten (2).

DE Leonard Little, the Rams' all-time leader in sacks since the statistic was made official in 1982, starts at left defensive end. Little recorded his first sack of the 2007 season in Week 6 at Baltimore 10/14 and now ranks 10th among active players with 75.0 sacks. This season Little has totaled 22 tackles and nine quarterback pressures, including four pressures in the Week 5 game vs. Arizona 10/7. **DE James Hall** starts at right end for the Rams after joining the Rams in the offseason in a trade with Detroit. In his first game as a Ram in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9, Hall notched four total tackles, including one tackle for loss. Hall pro-

duced four tackles and three quarterback pressures vs. Arizona. At Baltimore, Hall recorded his second sack of the season and finished the game with five tackles. Hall leads Rams' defensive linemen with 27 takedowns. **DT La'Roi Glover** and **DT Adam Carriker** start along the inside of the Rams' defensive line. Glover, who is in his 12th season, stands ninth among active players with 77 sacks. Glover has 20 tackles through the first six games of the 2007 season. Glover notched three tackles and had three quarterback pressures at Baltimore. Carriker, the Rams' 2007 first-round draft pick is playing nose tackle and at the 'three-technique' after a standout career at defensive end for Nebraska. In his debut vs. Carolina, Carriker notched three assisted tackles and has 13 total tackles on the year. Carriker made a career-high five tackles at Baltimore and added one quarterback pressure. **DT Clifton Ryan** has been called upon to give the Rams' significant playing time after second-year player DT Claude Wroten was suspended for four games. Ryan proved to be ready to contribute as he saw increased action in the Week 2 matchup vs. San Francisco. Ryan, led the Rams' defensive linemen with eight total tackles including two sacks and also caused a fumble by 49ers QB Alex Smith, which he recovered himself. Ryan became the first Rams' rookie since Sean Gilbert in 1992 to record two sacks in a game. Ryan's 2.0 sacks rank third among NFL rookies. At Baltimore, Ryan led Rams' defensive linemen with seven tackles. Ryan's 27 tackles are tied with James Hall for the most among Rams defensive linemen. **Wroten** returned last week Baltimore, and made one tackle. **DE Victor Adeyanju** had a promising rookie season in 2006, and provides important depth on the defensive line. At Baltimore, Adeyanju recovered a fumble by Ravens' QB Kyle Boller and returned it 24 yards to the Baltimore 16 yard line. **DE Trevor Johnson** also provides depth at the defensive end position for the Rams. Johnson, who has made six tackles in 2007, joined the Rams in the offseason after splitting time between the New York Jets and New Orleans in 2006. In Week 3 at Tampa Bay, Johnson recorded his first sack of the season, dropping Tampa QB Jeff Garcia for an 11-yard loss.

LINEBACKERS (7) – Rick Venturi

Brandon Chillar (4), Quinton Culberson (R), Chris Draft (9), Tim McGarigle (1), Raonall Smith (6), Pisa Tinoisamoa (5), Will Witherspoon (6)

Six-year veteran **Will Witherspoon** starts at middle linebacker for the Rams and ranks first on the team with 50 tackles in 2007. Witherspoon started fast this season, totaling eight tackles, one pass defended and one fumble recovery in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9 and added 11 total tackles in Week 2 vs. San Francisco. Witherspoon made 10 tackles, including 1.0 sack in Week 5 vs. Arizona 10/7. Witherspoon has 23 double-digit tackle games in his career, including eight as a Ram. Witherspoon led the team in tackles in

2006, his first season with the team. Starting at strongside linebacker, **Brandon Chillar** had seven tackles and one forced fumble in the Rams' season opener vs. Carolina and posted a season-high eight tackles in Week 3 at Tampa Bay 9/23. Chillar made six tackles and had one quarterback pressure in Week 6 at Baltimore. Chillar's 34 tackles on the year, rank fifth on the team. Chillar also sees action on special teams and ranks third on the team with four special teams tackles. **Pisa Tinoisamoa**, starts at weakside linebacker and has 42 tackles in 2007, the second-highest total on the team. Tinoisamoa missed the Week 2 matchup vs. San Francisco and the Week 3 contest at Tampa Bay with an ankle injury, but Tinoisamo returned to action in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, making nine total tackles. Tinoisamo led the Rams with 15 total tackles vs. Arizona, the second-highest total of his career, bettered only by the 18 tackles made at Detroit 12/28/03. Tinoisamoa continued to make an impact at Baltimore with his second consecutive double-digit tackle game. Tinoisamoa finished the game with a team-leading 15 tackles, tying the second-best mark of his career achieved the week prior vs. Arizona. The Rams acquired free agent **Chris Draft** in the offseason, and the nine-year veteran from Stanford, is an important backup and special teams player, with the ability to be a starter. Draft has 16 total tackles in 2007 and started at weakside linebacker vs. San Francisco and at Tampa Bay in place of Tinoisamo. Draft made three total tackles on defense and adding one tackle on special teams vs. San Francisco and six tackles at Tampa Bay. **Raonall Smith** is a valuable asset on special teams and provides depth at linebacker. In the 2007 season opener vs. Carolina, Smith notched two special teams tackles and added one special teams tackle vs. San Francisco. He is tied for fourth on the squad with three special teams tackles. Smith missed the contests vs. Arizona and at Baltimore with a knee injury. 2006 seventh-round draft choice **Tim McGarigle** spent last season on the Rams' practice squad, but has found a home on the team's active roster this season despite being slowed by a hamstring injury in the preseason. McGarigle serves as a backup linebacker and is an important special teams player. McGarigle is tied for fourth on the team with three special teams tackles, all of which he notched in the contest vs. Arizona. Undrafted rookie free agent **Quinton Culberson** from Mississippi State rounds out the linebacking corps. Culberson was inactive in the season-opener, but saw his first NFL action in Week 2 vs. San Francisco, notching two special teams tackles and earning Special Teams Player of the Week from the team's coaches. Culberson earned his second Special Teams Player of the Week honors for his play at Baltimore last week.

SECONDARY (9) – Willy Robinson, Ron Milus

Oshiomogho Atogwe (3), Ron Bartell (3), Eric Bassey (1), Fakhir Brown (8), Corey Chavous (10), Tye Hill (2), Todd Johnson (5), Bhawoh Jue (7), Jonathan Wade (R).

S Corey Chavous, a 10-year veteran, starts at strong safety for the Rams and provides valuable leadership for a secondary that features only three other players with five or more years of experience. Chavous ranks fourth on the team with 36 total tackles and notched eight total tackles in each of the Rams first two games. Chavous missed the Rams Week 5 game vs. Arizona 10/7 and the Week 6 contest at Baltimore 10/14 with a pectoral injury. In Week 3 at Tampa Bay 9/23 Chavous led the team with 10 tackles including six solo stops. Chavous posted his second consecutive game with 10 tackles in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, leading the team. Starting free safety **S Oshiomogho Atogwe** got off to a fast start in 2007, leading the team in tackles with 10 in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9. Atogwe's 37 tackles are third on the team in 2007. Atogwe, who has shown a propensity for making big plays, recorded his first forced fumble and fumble recovery of the season at Tampa Bay. He continued his strong play at Dallas, notching eight tackles and intercepting a Tony Romo pass, returning it 31 yards. At Baltimore, Atogwe forced a fumble and made three tackles. **CB Ron Bartell**, has started at cornerback in the Rams first six games after the absence of Fakhir Brown for four games due to suspension and a recent injury to regular starter Tye Hill. Bartell has impressed notching 31 tackles including 1.0 sack in 2007. **Brown** returned from his four-game suspension last week vs. Arizona and made an immediate impact as a starter. Brown made his presence known immediately and had arguably the best game of his career, leading the secondary with eight solo tackles, two interceptions and a career-high four passes defended. Brown recorded a career-high two interceptions for 12 yards. His two picks led the NFL in Week 5 and marked the first time a Ram had multiple interceptions in a game since CB Ron Bartell tallied two against Minnesota (12/31/06). Brown made eight tackles at Baltimore and had one pass defended. **CB Tye Hill**, a second-year player out of Clemson, is a Rams regular starter at cornerback, but missed four games due to a back injury that was suffered in practice prior to the Week 2 contest vs. San Francisco. Hill returned to the lineup at Baltimore, serving as the team's nickelback before moving into the left cornerback spot after Bartell injured a finger. Hill finished with three tackles and one pass defended. **S Todd Johnson**, aquired in the off-season as a free agent, provides valuable experience and is a standout on special teams. In Week 1 vs. Carolina, Johnson shared the Rams' special teams Player of the Week honors with LB Brandon Chillar after Johnson notched two special teams tackles. Johnson's seven special teams tackles rank first on the team. Johnson's experience has proven valuable after injuries in the secondary. S

Jerome Carter was placed on the reserve/injured list after injuring his foot vs. Arizona. With Chavous already out due to a pectoral injury, Johnson moved into the starting lineup at strong safety at Baltimore, and led Rams' defensive backs with nine tackles. 2007 third-round pick **CB Jonathan Wade** contributes as a backup in the secondary this season and is a gunner on the Rams' punt coverage teams. Wade, who earned *Associated Press* All-Southeastern Conference honors while at Tennessee, has seen extensive action this season as the team's nickelback. Wade has made three tackles on special teams this season and has nine tackles on defense. **CB Eric Bassey** was added to the roster 10/12 from the practice squad and played in his first NFL game at Baltimore, seeing action on special teams.

SPECIAL TEAMS (3) – Al Roberts, Todd Downing

Donnie Jones (4), Chris Massey (6), Jeff Wilkins (14)

K Jeff Wilkins, a 14-year veteran, has converted on 10-of-14 field goal attempts this season. Wilkins has been successful on all five of his PAT attempts this season and continues his streak of 351 consecutive PAT, which stands as a Rams' franchise-record and ranks second in NFL history behind Jason Elam's streak of 371 consecutive extra point conversions from 1993-2002. Wilkins has converted 293 career field goals, which stands as the Rams' all-time mark and his 1,161 points make him the Rams' all-time scoring leader. **LS Chris Massey**, one of the most consistent players at his position, continues long snapping duties, while **P Donnie Jones** plays his first season with the Rams after spending 2006 in Miami. Jones has been one of the best punters in the league this season. Jones leads the NFL after six games with a 50.1 punting average. In Week 5 vs. Arizona 10/7, His 56.0-yard gross average was the best single game average in franchise history, passing Jack Jacobs' 55.8-yard average at Detroit Sept. 27, 1942. A week earlier at Dallas, he punted eight times for a then career-high 55.3-yard average with a career long of 66 yards, two touchbacks and four kicks inside the 20-yard line. Jones also ranks second in the NFC, third in the NFL with a 42.0 net punting average.
