RAMS RETURN HOME TO HOST CLEVELAND IN WEEK 8 CONTEST

BIG GAME PASSES BIG NAMES

While leading in receptions and receiving yards last week at Seattle, WR (Big Game) Torry Holt passed Hall of Famers Charlie Joiner and Michael Irvin to move into 21st place on the NFL's all-time receptions list with 752 career receptions.

Holt has tied or led the team in receptions five times this season. At Seattle in Week 7, Holt tied a season-high with eight receptions for a season-high 82 yards. All eight of Holt's receptions came in the second half.

Holt, who leads the team this season with 40 receptions, third most in the NFC, has led the team in receptions every season since 2002. In 2003, he made a career-high 117 catches, second most in team history and seventh most in NFL history. Since 2000, Holt has the second most receptions in the NFL (700).

Holt is only 12 receptions behind Hall of Famer James Lofton, and is only 15 receptions behind former teammate Marshall Faulk.

In his ninth year in the league, Holt continues to climb the NFL receiving charts. Against Arizona in Week 5, Holt passed the 11,000-career receiving yards mark, ranking him 20th on the NFL's all-time list. Holt reached the 11,000-yard mark in 131 games, the fastest of any player in league history.

Since 2000, one year after Holt entered the NFL, he has 10,353 receiving yards, more than any other player in the NFL. From 2000-2005, he had at least 1,300 receiving yards in each season, the first player in league history to record six consecutive 1,300-yard receiving seasons.

Holt has the highest career receiving yards per game average in NFL history with 11,141 receiving yards in 132 games (83.7 avg.)

On the season, he has 40 receptions for 466 yards (11.7 avg.) and three touchdowns. Holt ranks second in the NFC, tied for fourth in the NFL, with 13 third-down receptions

THIS WEEK

The Rams host the Cleveland Browns this week at the Edward Jones Dome. The contest will mark the first time the teams have faced off since the 2003 season and the first time that the Rams have hosted the Browns since 1999. The Rams won those contests, 34-3 in 1999, and 26-20 in 2003.

The Rams and Browns are tied at 10 wins in the all-time series, dating to 1950. The Browns began the series as the dominant team, winning seven of the first 10 contests from 1950-1968, but the Rams have won seven of the last 10 from 1973 to 2003.

The Rams' franchise began in Cleveland in 1936 as a member of the American Football League. The Rams spent nine years in Cleveland before moving to Los Angeles in 1946.

LAST WEEK

Qwest Field, October 21, 2007 (68,164) – The Rams went on the road for a Week 7 matchup with NFC West rival Seattle, falling 33-6. QB Marc Bulger returned to the lineup for the first time since Week 4. WR Torry Holt recorded 82 yard receiving on eight receptions, passing Michael Irvin and Charlie Joiner for 21st place on the NFL's all-time receptions list with 752. P Donnie Jones punted six times for a 52.3-yard average with a long of 80 yards, a career-high that was good for the third longest punt in team history, as well as the league-leading mark this season. LB Will Witherspoon made a career-high 16 tackles, including 15 solo stops. LB Pisa Tinoisamoa reached double figures in total tackles for the third consecutive game, making 12 stops on the day. CB Ron Bartell recorded his first interception of the season, picking off Seattle QB Matt Hasselbeck midway through the second quarter. WR Brandon Williams handled primary kick and punt return duties for the second straight week, picking up a career best 171 yards on seven kickoff returns. K Jeff Wilkins led the team in scoring for the sixth time this season, connecting on field goal attempts of 31 and 29 yards.

THE HEAD COACHES

SCOTT LINEHAN (2nd season as head coach, 2nd with Rams; Career Record: 8-15) – Named twenty-second head coach in franchise history by Owner/Chairman Georgia Frontiere on January 19, 2006. Linehan rallied the Rams to an 8-8 finish in his first season. Quarterback Marc Bulger enjoyed the best season of his career, including 4,301 yards passing and 24 touchdowns. Balancing the offensive attack, Linehan guided Steven Jackson to lead the league with 2,334 combined yards, and set a Rams running back record with 90 catches. Prior to joining the Rams, Linehan was the offensive coordinator of the Miami Dolphins; the Dolphins improved from 29th in 2004 to 14th in total offensive in 2005. Linehan spent three seasons (2002-2004) as offensive coordinator for the Minnesota Vikings. In 2004, Daunte Culpepper posted the fourth-highest single season passer rating in NFL history (110.9). A college quarterback, Linehan was a free agent signee with the Dallas Cowboys before a shoulder injury ended his active career.

ROMEO CRENNEL (3rd season as head coach, 3rd with Cleveland; Career Record: 13-25) – Romeo Crennel was named head coach of the Cleveland Browns on Feb. 8, 2005, the eleventh full-time head coach in team history. Crennel led the Browns to a 6-10 record in 2005 and posted a 4-12 mark in 2006. His resume includes 37 years of coaching experience, including 26 years in the NFL, and has appeared in six Super Bowls, including five Super Bowl rings. Crennel crafted the defense for the New England Patriots and helped the Patriots win three Super Bowls (2001, 2003-2004). In 2003, he was recognized by the Pro Football Writers of America as the NFL's Assistant Coach of the Year. Crennel had previously coached in the NFL with Cleveland (2000), the Jets (1997-99), New England (1993-96), and the Giants (1981-1992), where he was the defensive line coach for the Giants' Super Bowl XXV title.

THE LAST TIME

Cleveland Browns Stadium, December 8, 2003

(73,108) – The Rams defeated the Cleveland Browns, 26-20, improving their record to 10-3 to clinch an NFC playoff berth. RB Marshall Faulk rushed 24 times for 102 yards for his fourth consecutive 100-yard rushing game. K Jeff Wilkins (33) made three of four field goals, placing him first on the Rams list for most field goals in one season. S Aeneas Williams had two interceptions, tying (Ken Houston) for second place on NFL's all-time list for interceptions returned for touchdowns. The Rams scored first when QB Marc Bulger drove the Rams 47 yards in 11 plays to set K Jeff Wilkins up for a 28-yard field goal to give the Rams the lead, 3-0. Cleveland answered back on their ensuing drive when QB Kelly Holcomb put together a seven-play, 72-yard drive that resulted in a two-yard TD pass to RB Keith Heinrich to take the lead, 7-3. After a DE Leonard Little sack and forced fumble that he recovered, Wilkins made a 26-yard field goal to narrow the margin, 7-6. On the Rams' next possession, Wilkins converted a 29-yard field goal attempt to give the Rams the lead, 9-7. On the Browns' ensuing possession, Williams intercepted a Holcomb pass, returning it 46 yards for a touchdown to expand the lead, 16-7. On Cleveland's following possession, Williams picked off another Holcomb pass, returning it the Rams' 16-yard line, setting up a Bulger touchdown pass to WR Isaac Bruce for a 23-7 halftime lead. On the Browns' first possession of the second half, QB Tim Couch threw a 28-yard touchdown pass to WR Quincy Morgan to narrow the margin, 23-13. On the Rams' next possession, Wilkins made his third field goal, a 37-yard attempt to expand the lead, 26-13. With 1:06 left in the third quarter, Browns' RB Jamel White scored on a two-yard run for the final margin.

RAMS – **Rick Venturi**, Assistant Head Coach/Linebackers, spent the 1994-95 seasons with the Cleveland Browns, first as a secondary coach in 1994 and as defensive coordinator/linebackers coach in 1995...Tight ends coach **Judd Garrett** was an assistant coach at University School (Chagrin Falls, Ohio), where his brother Jim is the offensive coordinator...**Wayne Moses**, running backs coach, worked in the same capacity for Bowling Green State University (Bowling Green, Ohio) from 1981-83...Director/Player Personnel, **Lawrence McCutcheon's** son, Daylon McCutcheon, played for the Browns from 1999-2006...**Jack Faulkner**, administrator of pro personnel, is a native of Youngstown, Ohio and was inducted into the Youngstown Hall of Fame in 1991...**Mel Foels**, college scout, graduated from Bowling Green State University...**Debbie Pollom**, Director/Scouting Administration, worked for the Browns' scouting department from 1984-89...**T Orlando Pace** (reserve/injured), a native of Sandusky, Ohio, attended Sandusky High and was an All-America selection on the offensive and defensive line. Melvin also had a brief stint with the University of Illinois (Champaign, Ill.) before joining the Browns in 2005...**T Ryan Tucker** played for the Rams from 1997-2001 after being selected in the fourth round (121st overall) of the 1997 NFL Draft...**DL Simon Fraser's** father coached rugby at the University of Illinois...**FB Charles Ali** was born in St. Louis, Mo...**DL Louis Leonard** was with the Rams for three games in 2007 before joining the Browns...**TE Richard Angulo** (practice squad) was originally drafted by St. Louis in the seventh round (254th overall) in the 2003 NFL Draft, appearing in six games for the Rams during his rookie season.

A PUNTING JONES

P Donnie Jones is posting Pro Bowl punting numbers this season, as he is first in the NFC, second in the NFL with a 50.5 punting average, and second in the NFC, third in the NFL with a 42.1 net punting average. Jones trails only Denver's Todd Sauerbrun in punting average by less than a yard, but has more than twice the number of punts compared to Sauerbrun.

Last week at Seattle, Jones punted six times for a 52.3-yard average with a career long of 80 yards. The 80-yard punt marked the third longest punt in Rams history, and the longest in the NFL this season. The punt surpassed his then career long of 66 yards that he set in Week 4 at Dallas.

Against Arizona in Week 5, Jones made four punts for a 56.0 average with a long of 60 yards. His 56.0-yard gross average was the best single game average in franchise history, passing Jack Jacobs' 55.8-average at Detroit Sept. 27, 1942.

A week earlier at Dallas, he punted eight times for a then career-high 55.3-yard average with a long of 66 yards, two touchbacks and four kicks inside the 20-yard line.

THE CLEVELAND RAMS

The Rams franchise was once located in Cleveland, beginning in 1936 as a member of the American Football League. In the club's first season, the Rams finished 5-2-2, the second-best mark in the AFL.

In 1937, the Rams joined the National Football League under the direction of owner Homer Marshman. Hugo Bezdek was named the team's first NFL head coach. Over the course of the team's first three seasons in Cleveland, the Rams played in three different stadiums – Municipal Stadium, League Park and Shaw Stadium, named after a high school on Shaw Avenue in Cleveland.

Under the direction of new head coach Earl (Dutch) Clark in 1939, the Rams finished at .500 for the first time as an NFL franchise with a 5-5-1 record as rookie tailback Parker Hall won the Joe Carr Trophy as the NFL's Most Valuable Player.

In 1941, the team was purchased by Daniel F. Reeves and Fred Levy, Jr., but Reeves and Levy departed to join the military in 1942.

The Rams were forced to suspend operations in 1943 for one season due to wartime restrictions and shortages and returned to play in the 1944 season. In 1944, Rams' legend Bob Waterfield, a UCLA product, was a third-round draft choice and joined the team as a T-formation quarterback.

In 1945, the team's final season in Cleveland, Waterfield would lead the Rams to a 9-1 finish, its first NFL West title and the NFL Championship after defeating the Washington Redskins, 15-14, in Cleveland.

After the championship season, Waterfield became the first unanimous selection as the NFL's MVP and Rams coach Adam Walsh was named Coach of the Year.

RETURNING HOME

St. Louis native and Hazelwood East High graduate, WR Brandon Williams, is glad to be home after posting career days in each of the Rams last two games, his first two games with the team.

Williams, who signed with the Rams Oct. 9, five days before the Week 6 game at Baltimore, has served as the Rams' primary kick returner in the last two contests due to ankle injury to regular return man Dante Hall.

A week after Williams set a personal-best with 112 kickoff return yards and 134 combined return yards (112 kickoff; 22 punt) at Baltimore, Brandon continued the trend with his performance at Seattle last week.

At Seattle, Williams returned seven kickoffs for 171 yards, both career highs. He also added one fair catch on a punt return. The game marked the third time in Williams' career that he eclipsed the 100-yards returning mark in his career.

In two games with the Rams, Williams has returned 12 kickoffs for 283 yards and a 23.6-yard average. Williams needs 97 kickoff return yards to pass the 380 yards he accumulated on 16 kickoffs last year for San Francisco.

Williams served as the primary kick returner for San Francisco in 2006, returning 22 punts for 147 yards with 12 fair catches and returning 16 kickoffs for 380 yards. Williams played in three games with the 49ers this season before being released.

COMMUNITY RAMBLINGS

Rams to Honor Military at Sunday's Game versus the Cleveland Browns

At this Sunday's game, the Rams and team sponsor Boeing will host the annual "Salute to Veteran's" game. As part of the salute, the Rams and Boeing will provide all fans entering the Edward Jones Dome with an American flag lapel pin. The National Anthem will be sung by Navy Petty Officer Generald Wilson and during the performance, a bald eagle from the World Bird Sanctuary will be present. Halftime ceremonies will feature a pass-in-review with all five military branches overseen by General Norton A. Schwartz, Commander of the United States Transportation Command at Scott Air Force Base, Illinois.

PISA MIND

LB Pisa Tinoisamoa notched his third-consecutive double-digit tackle game last week at Seattle. The three-game performance is the first time Pisa has posted double-digit tackles in three consecutive games. Tinoisamoa finished second on the team with 12 tackles (five solo). In Week 6 at Baltimore, he made a team-high 15 tackles (eight solo) and one interception, his first of the season, sixth of his career. In Week 5, Tinoisamoa led the defense with 15 tackles (nine solo) against Arizona. His 42-tackle total of the three-game span marks the most since LB London Fletcher collected 46 tackles over the same span in 2001 (12 vs. Carolina 11/11, 17 @ New England 11/18, 17 vs. Tampa Bay 11/26).

Tinoisamoa led the linebackers with nine tackles (four solo) at Dallas in Week 4, his first game back from missing two games due to injury, .

In playing in only five games, Tinoisamoa is second on the team with 54 tackles (28 solo), one interception and one pass defended.

NO CARRIKER FLAWS

Rams 2007 first-round draft pick NT Adam Carriker made a season-high six tackles (two solo) in Week 7 at Seattle. This total follows a season-high of five tackles (three solo) posted at Baltimore a week earlier.

Carriker, a University of Nebraska product, is in his first year playing an interior position of the defensive line, after playing defensive end in college. His presence has helped plug the middle, where the Rams have not allowed a 100-yard rusher this season.

After seven games, Carriker has 19 tackles (10 solo) and is third on the team with six QB pressures.

WHERE THERE'S A WILL...

Team Captain LB Will Witherspoon had a career-day at Seattle last week, collecting a career-best 16 tackles (15 solo) and one pass defended. The tackle total is the highest for Witherspoon since he made 13 tackles at San Diego (10/29/06). The game is the second time this season in which Witherspoon led the defense in tackles.

The game marked Will's third double-digit tackle of the season, all against NFC West opponents. Against Arizona in Week 5, he made 10 tackles, 1.0 sack, two passes defended and one forced fumble. The sack was his first of the season, 12th of his career.

Against San Francisco in Week 2, Will led the team with 11 tackles (nine solo).

In the season opener, Will led the linebackers with eight tackles (five solo), one pass defended and one fumble recovery.

Witherspoon leads the team after seven games this season with 66 tackles (50 solo), 1.0 sack, four passes defended, three QB pressures, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

Witherspoon led the Rams in tackles last season, his first year with the team.

900 AND COUNTING

As the most tenured Ram on the roster, Isaac Bruce has played more than 180 games in a Rams uniform, but the Week 8 matchup against Cleveland will only be the third time he has faced the Browns in his career. In the previous two games, Bruce has collected seven catches for 75 yards (10.7 avg.) and two touchdowns.

After missing two games with an injury, Bruce caught two passes for 52 yards, with a long of 31 yards at Seattle in Week 7.

Bruce continues to build on his career numbers. He has 904 career receptions, only the seventh player in NFL history to catch at least 900 receptions. In Week 3 at Tampa Bay, Bruce eclipsed the 900-reception mark in 186 games, third fastest to reach the mark behind Marvin Harrison (149) and Jerry Rice (168).

Bruce is the all-time leader in receptions for the Rams and the Rams all-time leader in receiving yards. He is ranked seventh in NFL history with 13,631 career receiving yards. Bruce has the highest receiving yards output of the season for the Rams, amassing 145 yards on eight catches in Week 2 against San Francisco.

On the season, Bruce has 17 catches for 277 yards (15.0 avg.).

FOR THE LONGEST TIME

Since the Super Bowl era only five wide receiver tandems have been together for nine or more seasons. Rams' WRs Isaac Bruce and Torry Holt (1999-present) represent one pair, joining Pittsburgh's Lynn Swann and John Stallworth (1974-82), Miami's Mark Clayton and Mark Duper (1983-92), San Francisco's Jerry Rice and John Taylor (1987-95) and Denver's Rod Smith and Ed McCaffrey (1995-2003).

The tandem of Bruce and Holt has proven to be one of the most effective long-term wide receiver pairs in NFL history, as Bruce and Holt have more receptions (1,344) and receiving yards (20,109) than any of the other four pairings.

LINE DANCING

Due to injuries, the Rams' offensive line has undergone shuffling throughout the 2007 season. Starting RG Richie Incognito missed the first four games of the season due to an ankle injury and starting LT Orlando Pace and starting LG Mark Setterstrom are out for the season. RT Adam Goldberg who started for the Rams at Tampa Bay and in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, suffered a knee injury versus the Cowboys and is also out for the season. Pace suffered a shoulder injury in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9 and Setterstrom injured his knee during the Rams' Week 3 matchup at Tampa Bay 9/23.

The Rams used their 10th and 11th different offensive line combinations of the season in Week 6 at Baltimore 10/14. C Brett Romberg suffered an ankle injury and was replaced by Andy McCullum, who had been starting at LG. Claude Terrell entered the game to replace McCullum. The Rams briefly used an offensive line combination that included Brandon Gorin replacing Milford Brown at RT. Last week at Seattle, the Rams began the game with the same starters that were on the field at Baltimore, but after ankle and knee injuries to Romberg, the line was once again shuffled to include McCollum at C and Terrell at LG.

The Rams have played only one game in which the same offensive line that began the game also finished the contest, a Week 5 matchup vs. Arizona 10/30.

CORNERING THE MARKET

CB Fakhir Brown made five tackles (four solo) and a career-high five passes defended at Seattle last week. A week earlier at Baltimore, he tied a season high with eight tackles (seven solo) and one pass defended.

In Week 5, Brown had one of the best performances of his career, making eight solo tackles, two interceptions, and a then career-high four passes defended against Arizona, he first game back from suspension. Brown's performance marked the first time a Ram had two interceptions in one game since CB Ron Bartell made two interceptions at Minnesota (12/17/06). The picks mark the seventh and eighth interceptions of Brown's career.

Playing in only three games this season, Brown ranks fourth among defensive backs with 21 tackles (19 solo), two interceptions, and a team-high 10 passes defended.

CB Ron Bartell made three solo tackles and one interception at Seattle in Week 7. Bartell picked off QB Matt Hasselbeck in the second quarter on the Rams' 25-yard line, halting the Seahawks scoring drive. The pick was the first of the season for Bartell, fourth of his career. Bartell also added three solo tackles.

In Week 2 against San Francisco, Bartell tied a season-high with six tackles (five solo), two passes defended and nabbed his first career sack, sacking QB Alex Smith for a 13-yard loss.

This season, Bartell is third on the team among defensive backs with 34 tackles (30 solo), 1.0 sack, one interception, and three passes defended.

SAFETY NET

S Corey Chavous saw his first action at Seattle last week after missing two games with a pectoral injury. He tied for the team-high among defensive backs with five tackles (three solo) and one pass defended.

Prior to his injury, Chavous had notched back-to-back double digit tackle games, the first time since 2004. He made 10 tackles (six solo) at Dallas in Week 4, and added 1.0 sack, his first of the season, third of his career. In Week 3, he made 10 tackles (six solo) at Tampa Bay

Despite playing in only five games, Chavous is fourth on the team with 41 tackles (23 solo), 1.0 sack, three passes defended and one forced fumble.

S Oshiomogho Atogwe leads defensive backs and is third on the team with 42 tackles (31 solo), one interception, two passes defended, tied for a team high with two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.

Atogwe tied for the team-high among defensive backs with five tackles (three solo) and one pass defended last week at Seattle.

In 2006, Atogwe tied for the team high with six forced fumbles. In Week 4 at Dallas, Atogwe made eight tackles (five solo), and one interception, his first of the season, fifth of his career. In Week 3 at Tampa Bay, he made six tackles (five solo) one forced fumble and one fumble recovery, earning Rams' Defensive Player of the Game honors.

In the season opener, Atogwe made 10 tackles (nine solo), his first double-digit tackle game of his career.

SACK ARTISTS

DT La'Roi Glover and DE Leonard Little have been among the best in the NFL at sacking the quarterback during their careers. Glover is in his 12th season and finished second on the team with 5.5 sacks in 2006. Little is in his 10th season, and led the team in sacks with 13.0 last season.

Last week at Seattle, Glover recorded the first sack of the 2007 and the 78th of his career, bringing down Seahawks' QB Matt Hasselbeck in the fourth quarter.

In Week 6 at Baltimore, Little recorded his first sack of the season and the 75th of his career, taking down Ravens' QB Kyle Boller and forcing a fumble.

Glover and Little rank tied for 8th and 10th, respectively, on the NFL's career active sack leaders list. The Rams are the only team with two players in the top 10.

A STRONG LEG

K Jeff Wilkins has proven to be one of the best kickers in the NFL. Wilkins' 1,360 career points rank 21st all-time in the NFL and is seventh among active kickers. Wilkins 475 career extra points rank sixth among active kickers and 22nd all time. Wilkins ranks eighth among active kickers in the NFL in career field goals made and 20th all time. His career 81.7 field goal percentage ranks sixth among active kickers.

Wilkins has 295 career field goals, and his 253 field goals as a Ram stands as the Rams' all-time mark. Wilkins' 1,167 points make him the Rams' all-time scoring leader.

Wilkins has converted 351 consecutive extra points, the second-longest streak in NFL history behind Denver K Jason Elam's streak of 371 consecutive extra point conversions from 1993-2002.

OFFENSE

QUARTERBACKS (2) – Doug Nussmeier

Marc Bulger (7), Gus Frerotte (14)

Two-time Pro Bowler Marc Bulger starts at QB for the Rams, but was sidelined over the past two contests with a rib injury. In Week 2 vs. San Francisco 9/16, Bulger totaled 368 passing yards, the 24th 300-yard passing performance of his career. Backing up Bulger, is 14-year veteran **Gus Frerotte**. Frerotte provides valuable experience and is familiar with coach Scott Linehan's offensive system, after spending time with Linehan while he was the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Minnesota (2003-04) and Miami (2005). Frerotte started in place of Bulger in Week 5 vs. Arizona 10/7 and in Week 6 at Baltimore 10/14. In his first start, Frerotte completed 24-of-43 passes for 262 yards with three touchdowns and three interceptions.

RUNNING BACKS (5) – Wayne Moses

Steven Jackson (4), Brian Leonard (R), Travis Minor (7), Richard Owens (4), Antonio Pittman (R)

Pro Bowler **Steven Jackson** serves as the Rams feature back. In Week 3 vs. Tampa Bay 9/23 Jackson posted his first 100-yard rushing performance of the year, rushing 30 times for 115 yards. Jackson has been sidelined for four games after suffering a groin injury vs. Tampa Bay. Jackson ranks second on the Rams in 2007 with 233 rushing yards on 69 carries. Rams 2007 second-round draft pick **Brian Leonard**, replaces Jackson in the starting lineup. In his second start of his young NFL career in Week 5 vs. Arizona 10/7, Leonard rushed for 102 yards on 18 carries, the first 100-yard rushing performance of his career. Leonard also made five receptions for 33 yards. In his first NFL start in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, Leonard rushed 16 times for 58 yards. The former All-America honoree from Rutgers has made contributions in 2007 as a rusher and as a receiver out of the backfield, rushing 62 times for 243 yards and gaining 98 yards on 15 receptions. **Travis Minor** joined the Rams in the offseason after spending the previous six seasons with Miami. Minor provides added depth and valuable contributions on special teams. Minor saw his most extensive action on offense this season in Week 6 at Baltimore 10/14, leading the Rams with 40 rushing yards on seven carries. Minor made three tackles on special teams vs. Arizona and is second on the squad with seven special teams tackles. Rookie **Antonio Pittman**, joined the Rams on a waiver claim 9/2 after being waived by the New Orleans Saints during final roster cuts. Pittman made his NFL debut vs

Arizona, playing on special teams. Pittman made his first NFL carry at Baltimore and finished with five carries for 11 yards. Pittman, a fourth-round draft choice of the Saints out of Ohio State, ranks eighth on the Buckeyes' all-time rushing list despite playing only three seasons. **FB Richard Owens** joined the Rams after being signed as a free agent 9/12. Owens, a four-year veteran, was waived by Minnesota during final roster cuts and saw his first action as a Ram at Tampa Bay.

WIDE RECEIVERS (8) – Henry Ellard

Drew Bennett (7), Isaac Bruce (14), Marques Hagans (1), Dante Hall (8), Torry Holt (9), Dane Looker (7), Travis Taylor (8), Brandon Williams (2)

The Rams' receiving corps is led by **Torry Holt** and **Isaac Bruce**, two of the best wide receivers in the NFL. Holt and Bruce are one of only five pairs of wide receivers who have played together for nine or more seasons in the Super Bowl era. The pair has totaled 1,344 receptions and 20,109 receiving yards with 118 touchdowns since their first season together in 1999. Holt leads the Rams this season with 40 receptions and 466 yards with three touchdowns. In Week 7 at Seattle 10/21, Holt made eight receptions and passed Hall of Famers Charlie Joiner and Michael Irvin to move into 21st place on the NFL's all-time receptions list with 752 career receptions. With a 26-yard reception on a Gus Frerotte pass in the fourth quarter of the Week 5 matchup vs. Arizona 10/7, Holt surpassed 11,000 career receiving yards, becoming the fastest player in NFL history to reach the milestone, accomplishing the feat in 131 games. Bruce has added 17 receptions for 255 yards, including posting eight receptions for 145 yards in Week 2 vs. San Francisco 9/16. With his three receptions in Week 3 at Tampa Bay 9/23, Bruce surpassed 900 receptions during his career and reached the milestone in only 186 games, becoming the third-fastest player to reach the mark in NFL history. After spending the past six seasons with the Tennessee Titans, **Drew Bennett** joins the Rams after signing as a free agent in the offseason. Bennett made his first start as a Ram vs. Arizona, catching two passes for 32 yards including a 16-yard touchdown pass. Bennett made his debut for the Rams in Week 2 vs. San Francisco, posting three catches for 42 yards. Bennett was deactivated for the season opening contest vs. Carolina 9/9 after suffering a thigh injury in practice. Joining Bennett as a new addition to the Rams receiving corps is former Kansas City Chief **Dante Hall**. One of the most dynamic return men in NFL history, Hall entered 2007 with 11 return touchdowns, good for third in NFL history. Hall proved his worth quickly in the 2007, returning the opening kickoff of the second half vs. Carolina for 84 yards. Hall produced his first kick return touchdown as a Ram in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, taking a Mat McBriar punt back 85 yards for a touchdown. Hall is

tied for second in NFL history with 12 total kick return touchdowns (six kickoff returns, six punt returns). Hall is currently out of the lineup after suffering an ankle injury vs. Arizona. **Dane Looker** is in his fifth year with the Rams and is an important backup at the receiver position and critical on special teams, serving as the holder for K Jeff Wilkins. Looker saw action on offense vs. Carolina 9/9, catching two passes for 10 yards. Second-year receiver **Marques Hagans** joined the Rams' 53-man roster this season after spending the 2006 campaign as a member of the practice squad. Hagans, selected by the Rams in the fifth round of the 2006 NFL Draft, is a former college quarterback and also serves as the team's emergency signal-caller. Hagans led all Rams receivers at Baltimore with five catches for 74 yards in only his second NFL game. Hagans made his NFL debut vs. Arizona, entering the game in place of Dante Hall who left the game with an ankle injury. Hagans returned one kickoff for 20 yards and also caught one pass for 11 yards. **Brandon Williams**, who signed with the Rams Oct. 9, five days before the Week 6 game at Baltimore, has served as the Rams' primary kick returner in the last two contests due to Hall's ankle injury. A week after Williams set a personal-best with 112 kickoff return yards and 134 combined return yards (112 kickoff; 22 punt) at Baltimore, Williams continued the trend with his performance at Seattle last week. At Seattle, Williams returned seven kickoffs for 171 yards, both career highs. He also added one fair catch on a punt return. The game marked the third time in Williams' career that he eclipsed the 100-yards returning mark in his career. **WR Travis Taylor** signed with the Rams 10/17 before the game at Seattle. Taylor, a former first-round draft choice, made his Rams debut last week at Seattle, catching one pass for four yards.

TIGHT ENDS (4) – Judd Garrett

Dominique Byrd (2), Joe Klopfenstein (2), Randy McMichael (6), Aaron Walker (5)

Randy McMichael starts at tight end for the Rams, after joining the team as a free agent in the offseason from Miami. McMichael spent five seasons with the Dolphins, one of which was spent under the tutelage of then Dolphins offensive coordinator Scott Linehan. McMichael is a receiving threat and an effective blocker from the tight end position. In Week 5 vs. Arizona 10/7, McMichael scored his first touchdown as a Ram on a 29-yard reception in the fourth quarter. In 2007, McMichael has made 17 receptions for 209 yards and one touchdown. A pair of second-year tight ends, **Joe Klopfenstein** and **Dominique Byrd**, join fifth-year player, **Aaron Walker**, to provide depth at the position. Klopfenstein has made five starts this season in either a two-tight end set or at fullback. Walker made his first start of the season vs. Arizona and also started in Week 6 at Baltimore 10/14.

OFFENSIVE LINE (8) – Paul Boudreau, Jim Chaney

Alex Barron (3), Milford Brown (6), Brandon Gorin (7), Richie Incognito (3), Nick Leckey (4), Andy McCollum (14), Brett Romberg (4), Claude Terrell (3)

Due to injuries, the Rams' offensive line has undergone shuffling throughout the 2007 season. Starting **RG Richie Incognito** missed the first four games of the season due to an ankle injury, before returning to action in Week 5 vs. Arizona 10/7. Starting **LT Orlando Pace**, starting **LG Mark Setterstrom** and **Adam Goldberg**, who had been serving as the Rams' starting RT after the injury to Pace, have all been lost for the season. Pace suffered a shoulder injury in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9 and Setterstrom injured his knee during the Rams' Week 3 matchup at Tampa Bay 9/23. **Pace**, a former No. 1 overall pick, had his streak of seven consecutive Pro Bowls snapped last year after his season was derailed by a torn triceps. After six games, the Rams have used 11 different offensive line combinations. **Alex Barron**, a third-year veteran, moves to the left side of the line and serves as the team's starting left tackle in place of the injured Pace. Barron, returns to the position for his most extensive action since he was a senior at Florida State University. **Brett Romberg** serves as the Rams' starting center after winning the job in training camp, the first time in his career that he has been named a full-time starter. His status for this week's contest vs. Cleveland is uncertain after suffering a left ankle injury in Week 6 at Baltimore and then injuring his right ankle last week at Seattle. **Milford Brown** joined the Rams in training camp to provide depth, but was pushed into service in Week 1 vs. Carolina after Incognito was unable to play. Brown switched positions again after the loss of Pace. With Barron moving to left tackle, Brown took Barron's place on the right side of the line in Week 2 vs. San Francisco. At Tampa Bay, Brown served as a reserve, but was called upon at LG after the injury to Setterstrom. Brown returned to the starting lineup at RT in Week 5 vs. Dallas 10/7. Veteran center **Andy McCollum** returns for his 14th NFL season and after serving as a valuable backup in the beginning of the year, McCollum has moved into the starting lineup at LG, a position he hasn't played extensively since the 2003 season. **Claude Terrell** provides added depth at the guard position, and started at right guard for the Rams vs. San Francisco and at Tampa Bay in place of Incognito and started at left guard at Dallas after the loss of Setterstrom. **C Nick Leckey**, who has also played G, was signed 10/6.

DEFENSE / SPECIAL TEAMS

DEFENSIVE LINE (8) – Brian Baker, Mike Cox

Victor Adeyanju (2), Adam Carriker (R), La'Roi Glover (12), James Hall (8), Trevor Johnson (4), Leonard Little (10), Clifton Ryan (R), Claude Wroten (2).

DE Leonard Little, the Rams' all-time leader in sacks since the statistic was made official in 1982, starts at left defensive end. Little recorded his first sack of the 2007 season in Week 6 at Baltimore 10/14 and now ranks 10th among active players with 75.0 sacks. This season Little has totaled 23 tackles and nine quarterback pressures, including four pressures in the Week 5 game vs. Arizona 10/7. Little has been playing through pain as he deals with a toe injury. **DE James Hall** starts at right end for the Rams after joining the Rams in the offseason in a trade with Detroit. In his first game as a Ram in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9, Hall notched four total tackles, including one tackle for loss. Hall produced four tackles and three quarterback pressures vs. Arizona. At Baltimore, Hall recorded his second sack of the season and finished the game with five tackles. In Week 7 at Seattle 10/21, Hall tied his season-high with five tackles including three solo stops. Hall leads Rams' defensive linemen with 32 takedowns. **DT La'Roi Glover** and **DT Adam Carriker** start along the inside of the Rams' defensive line. Glover, who is in his 12th season, is tied for eighth among active players with 78.0 sacks after posting his first sack of the season last week at Seattle along with four solo tackles and one quarterback pressure. Glover has 24 tackles this season. Glover notched three tackles and had three quarterback pressures at Baltimore. Carriker, the Rams' 2007 first-round draft pick is playing nose tackle and at the 'three-technique' after a standout career at defensive end for Nebraska. In his debut vs. Carolina, Carriker notched three assisted tackles and has 13 total tackles on the year. Carriker made a then career-high five tackles at Baltimore and added one quarterback pressure. Carriker bettered his career high a week later at Seattle, notching six stops and one quarterback pressure. **DT Clifton Ryan** has been called upon to give the Rams' significant playing time after second-year player DT Claude Wroten was suspended for four games. Ryan proved to be ready to contribute as he saw increased action in the Week 2 matchup vs. San Francisco. Ryan, led the Rams' defensive linemen with eight total tackles including two sacks and also caused a fumble by 49ers QB Alex Smith, which he recovered himself. Ryan became the first Rams' rookie since Sean Gilbert in 1992 to record two sacks in a game. Ryan's 2.0 sacks rank third among NFL rookies. At Baltimore, Ryan led Rams' defensive linemen with seven tackles. Ryan's 31 tackles are second to James Hall for the most among Rams defensive linemen. **Wroten** returned last week Baltimore, and made one tackle. At Seattle, Wroten made two tackles and had two quarterback pressures. **DE Victor Adeyanju**

had a promising rookie season in 2006, and provides important depth on the defensive line. At Baltimore, Adeyanju recovered a fumble by Ravens' QB Kyle Boller and returned it 24 yards to the Baltimore 16 yard line. Adeyanju saw the most significant playing time of the season at Seattle, helping to spell Leonard Little who was limited by a toe injury. Adeyanju finished the game with five total tackles. **DE Trevor Johnson** also provides depth at the defensive end position for the Rams. Johnson, who has made six tackles in 2007, joined the Rams in the offseason after splitting time between the New York Jets and New Orleans in 2006. In Week 3 at Tampa Bay, Johnson recorded his first sack of the season, dropping Tampa QB Jeff Garcia for an 11-yard loss.

LINEBACKERS (6) – Rick Venturi

Brandon Chillar (4), Quinton Culberson (R), Chris Draft (9), Tim McGarigle (1), Pisa Tinoisamoa (5), Will Witherspoon (6)

Six-year veteran **Will Witherspoon** starts at middle linebacker for the Rams and ranks first on the team with 66 tackles in 2007. In Week 7 at Seattle, Witherspoon had a career day, totalling a personal-best 16 tackles including 15 solo tackles. The performance marked Witherspoon's 24 double-digit tackle game and the 9th of his career with the Rams. Witherspoon started fast this season, totaling eight tackles, one pass defended and one fumble recovery in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9 and added 11 total tackles in Week 2 vs. San Francisco. Witherspoon made 10 tackles, including 1.0 sack in Week 5 vs. Arizona 10/7. Witherspoon led the team in tackles in 2006, his first season with the team. Starting at strongside linebacker, **Brandon Chillar** had seven tackles and one forced fumble in the Rams' season opener vs. Carolina and posted a season-high eight tackles in Week 3 at Tampa Bay 9/23. Chillar made six tackles and had one quarterback pressure in Week 6 at Baltimore. Chillar's 36 tackles on the year, rank fifth on the team. Chillar also sees action on special teams and ranks fourth on the team with four special teams tackles. **Pisa Tinoisamoa**, starts at weakside linebacker and has 54 tackles in 2007, the second-highest total on the team. Tinoisamo led the Rams with 15 total tackles vs. Arizona, the second-highest total of his career, bettered only by the 18 tackles made at Detroit 12/28/03. Tinoisamoa continued to make an impact at Baltimore with his second consecutive double-digit tackle game. Tinoisamoa finished the game with a team-leading 15 tackles, tying the second-best mark of his career achieved the week prior vs. Arizona. At Seattle, Tinoisamoa posted a third consecutive double-digit tackle game, making 12 total tackles. Tinoisamoa missed the Week 2 matchup vs. San Francisco and the Week 3 contest at Tampa Bay with an ankle injury, but Tinoisamo returned to action in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, making nine total tackles. The Rams acquired free agent **Chris Draft** in

the offseason, and the nine-year veteran from Stanford, is an important backup and special teams player, with the ability to be a starter. Draft has 16 total tackles in 2007 and started at weakside linebacker vs. San Francisco and at Tampa Bay in place of Tinoisamo. Draft made three total tackles on defense and adding one tackle on special teams vs. San Francisco and six tackles at Tampa Bay. 2006 seventh-round draft choice **Tim McGarigle** spent last season on the Rams' practice squad, but has found a home on the team's active roster this season despite being slowed by a hamstring injury in the preseason. McGarigle serves as a backup linebacker and is an important special teams player. McGarigle is tied for fourth on the team with four special teams tackles, notching three of the tackles in the contest vs. Arizona. Undrafted rookie free agent **Quinton Culberson** from Mississippi State rounds out the linebacking corps. Culberson was inactive in the season-opener, but saw his first NFL action in Week 2 vs. San Francisco, notching two special teams tackles and earning Special Teams Player of the Week from the team's coaches. Culberson earned his second Special Teams Player of the Week honors for his play at Baltimore last week.

SECONDARY (9) – Willy Robinson, Ron Milus

Oshiomogho Atogwe (3), Ron Bartell (3), Eric Bassey (1), Fakhir Brown (8), Corey Chavous (10), Tye Hill (2), Todd Johnson (5), Bhawoh Jue (7), Jonathan Wade (R).

S Corey Chavous, a 10-year veteran, starts at strong safety for the Rams and provides valuable leadership for a secondary that features only three other players with five or more years of experience. Chavous ranks fourth on the team with 41 total tackles and notched eight total tackles in each of the Rams first two games. Chavous missed the Rams Week 5 game vs. Arizona 10/7 and the Week 6 contest at Baltimore 10/14 with a pectoral injury. In Week 3 at Tampa Bay 9/23 Chavous led the team with 10 tackles including six solo stops. Chavous posted his second consecutive game with 10 tackles in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, leading the team. Starting free safety **S Oshiomogho Atogwe** got off to a fast start in 2007, leading the team in tackles with 10 in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9. Atogwe's 37 tackles are third on the team in 2007. Atogwe, who has shown a propensity for making big plays, recorded his first forced fumble and fumble recovery of the season at Tampa Bay. He continued his strong play at Dallas, notching eight tackles and intercepting a Tony Romo pass, returning it 31 yards. At Baltimore, Atogwe forced a fumble and made three tackles. **CB Tye Hill**, a second-year player out of Clemson, is a Rams regular starts at cornerback, but missed four games due to a back injury that was suffered in practice prior to the Week 2 contest vs. San Francisco. Hill returned to the lineup at Baltimore, serving as the team's nickelback before moving into the left cornerback spot after Bartell injured a finger. Hill finished with three tackles and one

pass defended. **CB Ron Bartell** serves as the team's nickelback, but started at cornerback in the Rams first six games after the absence of Fakhir Brown for four games due to suspension and an injury to Hill. Bartell has impressed notching 34 tackles including 1.0 sack and making one interception. **Brown** returned from his four-game suspension in Week 5 vs. Arizona and made an immediate impact as a starter. Brown made his presence known immediately and had arguably the best game of his career, leading the secondary with eight solo tackles, two interceptions and a career-high four passes defended. Brown recorded a career-high two interceptions for 12 yards. His two picks led the NFL in Week 5 and marked the first time a Ram had multiple interceptions in a game since CB Ron Bartell tallied two against Minnesota (12/31/06). Brown made eight tackles at Baltimore and had one pass defended. Last week at Baltimore, Brown made five tackles and had five passes defended. **S Todd Johnson**, aquired in the offseason as a free agent, provides valuable experience and is a standout on special teams. In Week 1 vs. Carolina, Johnson shared the Rams' special teams Player of the Week honors with LB Brandon Chillar after Johnson notched two special teams tackles. Johnson's nine special teams tackles rank first on the team. Johnson's experience has proven valuable after injuries in the secondary. S Jerome Carter was placed on the reserve/injured list after injuring his foot vs. Arizona. With Chavous already out due to a pectoral injury, Johnson moved into the starting lineup at strong safety at Baltimore, and led Rams' defensive backs with nine tackles. 2007 third-round pick **CB Jonathan Wade** contributes as a backup in the secondary this season and is a gunner on the Rams' punt coverage teams. Wade, who earned *Associated Press* All-Southeastern Conference honors while at Tennessee, is third on the team with five tackles on special teams and has nine tackles on defense. **CB Eric Bassey** was added to the roster 10/12 from the practice squad and played in his first NFL game at Baltimore, seeing action on special teams.

SPECIAL TEAMS (3) – Al Roberts, Todd Downing

Donnie Jones (4), Chris Massey (6), Jeff Wilkins (14)

K Jeff Wilkins, a 14-year veteran, has converted on 12-of-18 field goal attempts this season. Wilkins has been successful on all five of his PAT attempts this season and continues his streak of 351 consecutive PAT, which stands as a Rams' franchise-record and ranks second in NFL history behind Jason Elam's streak of 371 consecutive extra point conversions from 1993-2002. Wilkins has converted 295 career field goals, which stands as the Rams' all-time mark and his 1,167 points make him the Rams' all-time scoring leader. **LS Chris Massey**, one of the most consistent players at his position, continues long snapping duties, while **P Donnie Jones** plays his first season with the Rams after spending 2006 in Miami. Jones is posting Pro Bowl punting

numbers, as he is first in the NFC, second in the NFL with a 50.5 punting average, and second in the NFC, third in the NFL with a 42.1 net punting average. In Week 7 at Seattle 10/21, Jones punted six times for a 52.3-yard average with a career long of 80 yards. The 80-yard punt marked the third longest punt in Rams history, and the longest in the NFL this season. The punt surpassed his then career long of 66 yards that he set in Week 4 at Dallas. Against Arizona in Week 5 10/7, Jones made four punts for a 56.0 average with a long of 60 yards. His 56.0-yard gross average was the best single game average in franchise history, passing Jack Jacobs' 55.8-average at Detroit Sept. 27, 1942. A week earlier at Dallas 9/30, he punted eight times for a then career-high 55.3-yard average with a long of 66 yards, two touchbacks and four kicks inside the 20-yard line.
