## RAMS RETURN FROM BYE WEEK TO TAKE ON NEW ORLEANS

### BIG GAME T. HOLT

Since 2000, WR Torry Holt has been, and continues to be, one of the most prolific wide receivers to play in the NFL. This season, Holt is steadily climbing the NFL's all-time best charts with each and every game. After eight games, Holt is tied for fifth in the NFC with 46 receptions and ranks eighth in the NFC with 576 receiving yards.

In Week 8 against Cleveland, Holt led the team with 110 receiving yards on six receptions, his first 100-yard receiving performance this season, 44th of his career. His 44 career 100-yard games are third most since 1999, the year Holt entered the NFL. With six receptions this week at New Orleans, Holt will pass WR James Lofton for 20th place on the NFL's all-time receptions list, giving him 764 receptions for his career. Holt is only nine receptions behind former teammate RB Marshall Faulk.

Holt has squared off against New Orleans seven times during the regular season in his career, tallying 37 receptions for 602 yards (16.3 yards/rec. avg.), averaging 86.0 yards per game, with four touchdowns. Holt's best game at New Orleans was in 2000, where he caught five passes for 121 yards.

Holt led the team in receptions and receiving yards in Week 7 at Seattle, catching a season-high eight passes for 82 yards. Holt's performance vaulted him past Hall of Famers Charlie Joiner and Michael Irvin to move into 21st place on the NFL's all-time receptions list.

Against Arizona in Week 5, Holt passed the 11,000-career receiving yards mark. Holt reached the 11,000-yard mark in 131 games, fastest of any player in league history. He is currently 19th on the NFL's receiving yards list. With 138 more receiving yards, Holt will move into 18th place, passing WR Rod Smith.

Holt leads the team in receptions this season, and has done so since 2002. He also leads the team in receiving yards, and has led the team in that category since 2000. In 2003, Holt made a career-high 117 catches for a career-high 1,696 yards and 12 touchdowns. His 117 receptions rank second-most in team history and seventh most in NFL history.

Since 2000, Holt has 10,463 receiving yards, more than any other player in the NFL. From 2000-2005, Holt had at least 1,300 receiving yards in each season, the first player in league history to record six consecutive 1,300-yard receiving seasons.

Holt has the highest career receiving yards per game average in NFL history with 11,251 in 134 games (83.9 avg.).

## **THIS WEEK**

The Rams are on the road this, traveling to New Orleans to face the Saints at the Louisiana Superdome. This contest will be the Rams fifth road game in their last seven games. The game will mark the first time since 2001 since the Rams have traveled to New Orleans.

The Rams hold a 37-30 lead in the overall series, including a victory in the last matchup between the teams, 28-17, at the Edward Jones Dome in the 2005 season.

The series dates to 1970 when the Rams and Saints were division foes in the NFC West after the AFL-NFL merger. The Saints and Rams were members of the NFC West until 2002, when conference re-alignment moved the Saints to the NFC South. Since the realignment, the Rams and Saints have faced off twice, splitting the matchups.

## **LAST GAME**

**Edward Jones Dome, October 28, 2007 (62,777)** – The Rams returned home after two consecutive road games for a Week 8 matchup with the Cleveland Browns, falling by a final score of 27-20. RB Steven Jackson returned to the line-up for the first time since Week 3, rushing eight times for 41 yards and a touchdown before leaving the game at the end of the first quarter with back spasms. Jackson's 41 yards helped him move past Dan Towler (3,493) for fifth place on the Rams all-time rushing yards list. WR Isaac Bruce caught six passes for 70 yards, passing Rams wide receivers coach Henry Ellard (13,827) for 21st on the NFL's all-time scrimmage yards list. WR Torry Holt gained 110 yards on six receptions, recording his first 100-yard game of the 2007 season. LB Will Witherspoon made ten total tackles, reaching double digits for the fourth time in 2007. The Rams jumped out to a 14-0 lead after scoring on their first two drives before Cleveland responded with a field goal and a pair of touchdowns. K Jeff Wilkins converted a 40-yard field goal attempt late in the second quarter to even the score at 17 at halftime. After a Cleveland touchdown and a field goal by each team brought the score to 27-20, the Rams again looked to even the score on their final possession. The drive was halted, however, when QB Marc Bulger was picked off at the Cleveland 28-yard line by Browns CB Leigh Bodden, helping the Browns escape with a 27-20 victory.

## **THE HEAD COACHES**

**SCOTT LINEHAN** (2nd season as head coach, 2nd with Rams; Career Record: 8-16) – Named twenty-second head coach in franchise history by Owner/Chairman Georgia Frontiere on January 19, 2006. Linehan rallied the Rams to an 8-8 finish in his first season. Quarterback Marc Bulger enjoyed the best season of his career, including 4,301 yards passing and 24 touchdowns. Balancing the offensive attack, Linehan guided Steven Jackson to lead the league with 2,334 combined yards, and set a Rams running back record with 90 catches. Prior to joining the Rams, Linehan was the offensive coordinator of the Miami Dolphins; the Dolphins improved from 29th in 2004 to 14th in total offensive in 2005. Linehan spent three seasons (2002-2004) as offensive coordinator for the Minnesota Vikings. In 2004, Daunte Culpepper posted the fourth-highest single season passer rating in NFL history (110.9). A college quarterback, Linehan was a free agent signee with the Dallas Cowboys before a shoulder injury ended his active career.

**SEAN PAYTON** (2nd season as head coach, 2nd with New Orleans; Career Record: 15-11) – Named the fourteenth head coach in Saints history on Jan. 18, 2006 and in his opening season led the Saints to the NFC Championship Game for the first time in club history. A unanimous choice for NFL coach of the year honors after also guiding the team to a 10-6 record and the NFC South title following a dramatic roster overhaul. Came to New Orleans following a three-year stint with Dallas Cowboys, serving as the assistant head coach/passing game coordinator in 2005 after spending his first two seasons as assistant head coach/quarterbacks. Considered one of the NFL's brightest offensive minds, he has led a resurgence in his unit's productivity at each career stop, including in New Orleans, where the Saints featured the league's top-ranked offense in 2006. Additional experience includes four years with the New York Giants (1999-2002), the last three seasons as offensive coordinator. Also previously worked for the Philadelphia Eagles (1997-98) as quarterbacks coach.

## **THE LAST TIME**

**Edward Jones Dome, October 23, 2005 (64,586)** – The Rams improved their record to 3-4 with a 28-17 victory over the New Orleans Saints. The Rams ended the Saints' three-game winning streak at the Edward Jones Dome and earned their first victory over New Orleans since 2001. G Adam Timmerman extended his streak of consecutive games played to 165 and K Jeff Wilkins extended his streak of consecutive PATs made to 295. The Rams were forced to play without starting QB Marc Bulger and both starting WRs Isaac Bruce and Tony Holt, who were down with injuries. RB Steven Jackson stepped up and carried the team with 20 rushes for 97 yards and two rushing touchdowns along with two receptions for another 19 yards. QB Jamie Martin filled in nicely for Bulger, completing 18 of 29 passes for 189 yards, no touchdowns and no interceptions. The Rams were also without starting DE Leonard Little and DT Damione Lewis was ejected in the first quarter after an unnecessary roughness penalty. DE Tyoka Jackson stepped up in place of Little and blocked a field goal, while DTs Jimmy Kennedy and Ryan Pickett combined for nine tackles and a sack. The Rams fell behind the Saints early on two first-quarter touchdown passes by New Orleans QB Aaron Brooks, one to former Ram WR Az-Zahir Hakim, but Jackson got the Rams offense going, first with a 43-yard run on the Rams' first drive and then rumbled six yards for his first of two rushing touchdowns to cut the Saints' lead in half. Saints' K John Carney added a field goal at the beginning of the fourth quarter, but on the Rams next drive Martin hit WR Kevin Curtis with a 42-yard bomb that set up Jackson's second touchdown, cutting the Saints' lead to three. S Adam Archuleta recovered a fumble on the Saints' next drive that put the Rams' offense in position for Curtis to score on a reverse from Jackson and take the lead 21-17. The Saints had the ball with time running out, but S Mike Furrey sealed the game for the Rams with a 67-yard interception return for a touchdown, his first career interception and touchdown since becoming a safety during the offseason.

## **RAMS-SAINTS CONNECTIONS**

**RAMS** – Assistant head coach/linebackers coach **Rick Venturi** coached for the Saints from 1996-2005, spending time as interim head coach (1996), assistant head coach (1997-01) and then defensive coordinator (2002-05)...The last time the Rams faced New Orleans, defensive coordinator **Jim Haslett** was the head coach of the Saints. Haslett joined the Rams in 2006 after six seasons (2000-2005) as head coach of New Orleans, one season as linebackers coach (1995), and one season as defensive coordinator (1996)...Offensive line coach **Paul Boudreau's** first NFL position was with the Saints, coaching the offensive line from 1987-1993...**Judd Garrett**, tight ends coach, began his NFL coaching career with New Orleans working as an offensive assistant from 1997-99...Quarterbacks coach **Doug Nussmeier** was drafted by the Saints in the fourth-round (116th overall) of the 1994 draft and played for the team until 1997...**Willy Robinson**, secondary coach, spent the 2005 season with New Orleans as a senior defensive assistant/secondary coach...**Brad Roll**, assistant strength and conditioning coach, spent the 1981-1986 seasons as the strength and conditioning coach at the University of Louisiana-Lafayette...**QB Marc Bulger** spent the 2000 training camp with the Saints after being drafted by New Orleans in the sixth-round (168th overall) of the 2000 NFL Draft...**C Andy McCollum** played for the Saints from 1994-98...**CB Fakhir Brown** grew up in Mansfield, La. and later attended Grambling State University. Before joining the Rams, Brown also played for the Saints from 2002-05...**DT La'Roi Glover** played for New Orleans from 1997-2001 earning Pro Bowl berths in 2000 and 2001...**DE James Hall** is a native of New Orleans, La. earning All-State honors as a senior at St. Augustine High...**DE Trevor Johnson** spent part of the 2006 season with the Saints seeing action in the last game of the year...**P Donnie Jones** and **RB Travis Minor** grew up in Baton Rouge, La., both attending Catholic High. Jones earned All-State honors and Minor was named *USA Today's* Offensive Player of the Year. Jones later attended Louisiana State University, finishing second in school history in punting average...**DT Claude Wroten** was born in Bastrop, La. before attending Louisiana State University...**CB Jonathan Wade** grew up in Shreveport, La. and attended Shreveport Evangel Christian earning All-America honors from Tom Lemming and *Super Prep*...**RB Antonio Pittman** was a fourth-round (107th overall) draft choice for the Saints in 2007...**T Rob Petitti** played for the Saints in 2006 seeing action in the last game of the regular season...**DE Eric Moore** (practice squad) spent a portion of the 2006 season with Saints before joining the Rams...**QB Brock Berlin** (practice squad), a native of Shreveport, La., led Shreveport Evangel Christian to three consecutive Louisiana state championships while being named both the Gatorade National Player of the Year and *USA Today* National Offensive Player of the Year as a senior...**T Jeremy Parquet** (practice squad) is a native of Destrehan, La., where he was a three-year starter at Robicheaux High...**CB Darius Vinnett** (practice squad) grew up in Destrehan, La. where he was a standout player at Destrehan high school...**WR Dominique Thompson** (practice squad) was born in Fort Polk, La...**Jack Faulkner**, Administrator of Pro Personnel, was an assistant coach and director of player personnel for the Saints from 1967-69.

**SAINTS** – Head coach **Sean Payton** played quarterback at Eastern Illinois (Charleston, Ill.) from 1982-86 and was inducted into the school's Hall of Fame in 2000. Payton also spent the 1996 season coaching for the University of Illinois (Champaign, Ill.)...**Joe Vitt**, assistant head coach/linebackers coach, held the same position with the Rams in 2004 and part of 2005 before being named interim head coach for the final 11 games in St. Louis...**Adam Bailey**, assistant strength and conditioning coach, received his Masters Degree from the University of Missouri and worked as a graduate assistant for the Tigers from 2002-03...**Greg McMahon**, assistant special teams, played defensive back for Eastern Illinois (Charleston, Ill.) from 1978-81 before beginning his coaching career at his alma mater in 1982. McMahon also coached at Southern Illinois University in 1988 and for the University of Illinois from 1992-2004...**DT Brian Young** played for the Rams from 2000-03 after being drafted by St. Louis in the fifth-round (139th overall) of the 2000 NFL Draft...**K Olindo Mare** began his collegiate playing career at MacMurry College (Jacksonville, Ill.) before transferring to Syracuse...**QB Jamie Martin** played for the Los Angeles and St. Louis Rams from 1993-96 and 2001-05. Martin began his NFL career as an undrafted free agent with the Rams...**WR Dante Ridgeway** (practice squad) attended MacArthur High in Decatur, Ill., and was drafted by the Rams in the sixth-round (192nd overall) of the 2005 NFL draft...**LB Troy Evans** was signed as an undrafted free agent by the Rams in 2001 spending the season on the practice squad...**LB Scott Shanle** was drafted by the Rams in the seventh-round (251st overall) of the 2003 NFL draft appearing in six games...**RB Aaron Stecker** played his two final collegiate seasons at Western Illinois (Macomb, Ill.)...**DT Hollis Thomas** is a native of St. Louis attending the Academy of Math and Science but playing for Sumner High, winning a pair of 4A state championships. Thomas attended Northern Illinois (Dekalb, Ill.)...**P Steve Weatherford** played collegiately at the University of Illinois (Champaign, Ill.)...**RB Pierre Thomas** attended the University of Illinois finishing sixth in school history in rushing yards...**Russ Ball**, vice president of football administration, is a graduate of Central Missouri State (Warrensburg, Mo.), and earned his Masters Degree from the University of Missouri...**Ryan Pace**, director of pro scouting, was a four-year letterman at defensive end for Eastern Illinois (Charleston, Ill.) from 1995-99...**Dan Simmons**, equipment manager, graduated from Meramec College in St. Louis, and his father, Bill, held the same position with the St. Louis Football Cardinals...**Conrad Kowal**, senior director of marketing and business, is a graduate of Western Illinois.

## **WHERE THERE'S A WILL...**

Team captain LB Will Witherspoon has been making play after play for the Rams defense this season. In Week 8 against Cleveland, Witherspoon notched his second consecutive double-digit tackle game, fourth of the season, after leading the team with 10 solo tackles and 1.0 sack. Witherspoon sacked QB Derek Anderson in the fourth quarter for a 5-yard loss, forcing Cleveland to punt. The sacked marked Witherspoon's second of the season, 13th of his career. The 10 solo tackles was his fourth-highest solo tackle output of his career. The game was the third time this season Witherspoon has led the team in tackles.

In Week 7 at Seattle, Witherspoon had a career day, collecting a career-best 16 tackles (15 solo) and one pass defended. The tackle total was the highest for Witherspoon since he made 13 tackles at San Diego (10/29/06). The 15 solo tackles also marked a career best, eclipsing his 13 solo tackle mark that Witherspoon set at San Francisco (9/17/06).

Against Arizona in Week 5, he made 10 tackles (eight solo), 1.0 sack, two passes defended, and one forced fumble. Against San Francisco in Week 2, Witherspoon led the team with 11 tackles (nine solo).

In the season opener, Witherspoon led the linebackers with eight tackles (five solo), one pass defended and one fumble recovery.

Witherspoon leads the team with 76 tackles (60 solo), 2.0 sacks, four passes defended, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

Witherspoon also led the team in tackles in 2006, his first season with the team.

## **A PUNTING JONES**

P Donnie Jones is having a Pro-Bowl caliber year, as he leads the NFL with a 50.3-yard punting average, and is third in the NFL with a 41.3-yard net average.

In Week 7 at Seattle, Jones punted six times for a 52.3-yard average with a career-long of 80 yards. The 80-yard punt marked the third longest punt in Rams history, and the longest in the NFL this season. The punt surpassed Jones' then career long in of 66 yards that he set in Week 4 at Dallas.

Against Arizona in Week 5, Jones made four punts for a 56.0 average with a long of 60 yards. His 56.0-yard gross average was the best single game average in franchise history, passing Jack Jacobs' 55.8-average at Detroit Sept. 27, 1942.

A week earlier at Dallas, Jones punted eight times for a then career-high 55.3-yard average with a long of 66 yards, two touchbacks and four kicks inside the 20-yard line.

### **ON THE ROAD AGAIN**

The Rams join the Denver Broncos as one of only two teams in the NFL this season to play six road games in an eight-game period.

The Rams began their stretch in Week 2 at Tampa Bay 9/23 and play the fifth of the six road games this week at New Orleans. The stretch will end after the Week 11 contest at San Francisco, with the team returning to the Edward Jones Dome to face Seattle on Nov. 25.

The Rams six road opponents during the eight-game period - Tampa Bay, Dallas, Baltimore, Seattle, New Orleans and San Francisco - are 26-23 this season, a .531 winning percentage.

The Houston Texans were the only team last season to play six road games in an eight-game stretch.

### **NO CARRIKER FLAWS**

Rams 2007 first-round draft pick NT Adam Carriker made his first sack of his career in Week 8 against Cleveland. Carriker brought down QB Derek Anderson in the beginning of the fourth quarter for a 7-yard loss, forcing Cleveland to settle for a field goal. Carriker also added four tackles (three solo).

Carriker's performance followed his Week 7 performance where he tallied a season-high six tackles (two solo) at Seattle. He posted five tackles (three solo) a week earlier at Baltimore.

Carriker, a University of Nebraska product, is in his first year playing an interior position of the defensive line, after playing defensive end in college. Carriker's presence has helped plug the middle, where the Rams have not allowed a 100-yard rusher this season.

After eight games, Carriker has 23 tackles (13 solo), 1.0 sack and is fourth on the team with six QB pressures.

### **DANDY RANDY**

After five productive seasons with the Miami Dolphins, Randy McMichael was welcome addition to the Rams offense this season. McMichael has been a steady performer during the 2007 campaign, making at least two catches in each of his eight games in a Rams uniform. Against Cleveland in Week 8, he recorded 39 receiving yards on two receptions.

McMichael's season totals include 19 receptions, 248 yards and one touchdown. His 68.4 first-down percentage and 13.1 yard average both rank second among NFC tight ends. During his five plus years in the NFL, McMichael has played in 88 games, totaling 302 receptions, 3,344 receiving yards and 19 touchdowns.

### **DREW BENNETT**

First-year Ram WR Drew Bennett returned to the lineup in Week 8 against Cleveland after being inactive in Week 7 due to a hamstring injury. In his return, Bennett made an immediate impact, notching a season-high six receptions for 63 yards, doubling his previous season high of three receptions for 42 yards vs. San Francisco in Week 2. Bennett's six receptions tied for most on the team, while his 63 yards ranked third. Bennett made an 18-yard reception at the end of the second quarter setting up a 40-yard K Jeff Wilkins field goal that tied the game at 17 going into halftime.

Against Arizona in Week 5, Bennett scored his first touchdown as a Ram, a 16-yard reception in the second quarter. Bennett has 14 receptions for 157 yards (11.2 avg.) and one touchdown this season.

## **900 AND COUNTING**

Sunday's matchup with New Orleans marks the 14th time Isaac Bruce has lined up against the Saints, a former division rival. Bruce's career numbers against New Orleans include 74 receptions, 1,397 receiving yards, 17.7 yards per catch and 99.8 yards per game. His 11 touchdown receptions against the Saints are a personal best against any one team.

The last remaining Los Angeles Ram on the roster, Bruce continues to build on his career numbers in his 14th year in the league. His 910 receptions and 13,701 receiving yards ranks seventh on both the NFL's all-time receptions list and all-time receiving yards list. In Week 3 at Tampa Bay, Bruce eclipsed the 900-reception mark in 186 games, making him the third fastest player to reach the milestone behind Marvin Harrison (149) and Jerry Rice (168). In addition to his standing in the NFL record books, Bruce tops both the Rams all-time receptions and all-time receiving yards lists.

Bruce is coming off a solid Week 7 performance against Cleveland, picking up 70 yards on six receptions. Bruce has the highest single-game receiving output for the Rams in 2007, amassing 145 yards on eight catches in Week 2 against San Francisco.

On the season, Bruce has 23 receptions for 325 yards.

## **PISA MIND**

After three consecutive double-digit tackle games, team captain LB Pisa Tinoisamoa continued his strong play adding seven (five solo) tackles in Week 8 against Cleveland. The four-game performance has produced 49 tackles, more than he totaled in 11 games played last season.

Tinoisamoa finished second on the team with 12 tackles (five solo) in Week 7 at Seattle. In Week 6 at Baltimore, he made a team-high 15 tackles (eight solo) and one interception, his first of the season, sixth of his career. ## **ONE HALL OF A PLAYER**

First-year Ram DE James Hall has been an added plus on the defensive line this season. Hall led the defensive line with seven tackles (five solo) against Cleveland in Week 8. His seven tackles tied a season high that he set in Week 2 when he tallied seven tackles against San Francisco.

Hall nabbed his second sack of the season in Week 6 at Baltimore, where he brought down QB Kyle Boller for a 2-yard loss. Hall made his first sack of the season in Week 2 against San Francisco, sacking QB Alex Smith for a 5-yard loss.

On the season, Hall has 32 tackles (16 solo), 2.0 sacks and two passes defended.

## **SAFETY NET**

Ss Corey Chavous and Oshiomogho Atogwe have been among the leaders in tackles on the team this season. In Week 8 against Cleveland, Chavous finished second on the team with nine tackles (five solo), his second-highest tackle total of the season.

At Seattle in Week 7, Chavous saw his first action after missing two games with an injury. He tied for a team-high among defensive backs with five tackles (three solo) and one pass defensed.

Prior to his injury, Chavous had notched back-to-back double digit tackle games, the first time since 2004. He made 10 tackles (six solo) at Dallas in Week 4, and added 1.0 sack, his first of the season, third of his career. In Week 3, he made 10 tackles (six solo) at Tampa Bay.

Despite playing in only six games, Chavous is third on the team with 50 tackles (28 solo), 1.0 sack, three passes defensed and one forced fumble.

S Oshiomogho Atogwe is fourth on the team with 49 tackles (35 solo), one interception, three passes defensed, tied for a team high with two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.

Against Cleveland, he made seven tackles (four solo), his third highest tackle total of the season, with one pass defensed.

Atogwe tied for a team-high among defensive backs with five tackles (three solo) and one pass defensed at Seattle in Week 7.

In 2006, Atogwe tied for the team high with six forced fumbles, developing a knack for causing turnovers. In Week 4 at Dallas, Atogwe made eight tackles (five solo), and one interception, his first of the season, fifth of his career. In Week 3 at Tampa Bay, he made six tackles (five solo) one forced fumble and one fumble recovery, earning Rams' Defensive Player of the Game honors.

In the season opener, Atogwe made 10 tackles (nine solo), his first double-digit tackle game of his career.

## **ACTION JACKSON**

The offense got a boost in Week 8 with the return of RB Steven Jackson to the lineup. Jackson, who led the NFL in scrimmage yards last season, rushed eight times for 41 yards and a touchdown in the first quarter before having to leave the game with back spasms and did not return. Jackson scored on a 2-yard run in the first quarter to give the Rams a 7-0 lead. The score was set up on a 22-yard run by Jackson, his longest of the season. Jackson's touchdown was the Rams' first rushing touchdown of the season, Jackson's 26th rushing touchdown of his career.

The game was Jackson's first since missing four games with a groin injury. In Week 3 at Tampa Bay, Jackson rushed a season-high 30 times for a season-high 115 yards. The game marked his 11th 100-yard rushing performance of his career, first of the season.

In Week 2 against San Francisco, Jackson rushed 21 times for 60 yards and in the season opener against Carolina, he made 18 carries for 58 yards.

Although Jackson has played in only four games, he is second on the team with 274 rushing yards on 77 carries with one touchdown with a long of 22 yards.

RT Adam Goldberg who started for the Rams at Tampa Bay and in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, suffered a knee injury versus the Cowboys and is also out for the season. Pace suffered a shoulder injury in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9 and Setterstrom injured his knee during the Rams' Week 3 matchup at Tampa Bay 9/23.

The Rams used their 13th and 14th different offensive line combinations of the season in Week 8 vs. Cleveland. Andy McCollum started the game at C in place of Brett Romberg who missed the contest with an ankle injury. Milford Brown, who had been starting at RT, moved to LG and Brandon Gorin took over at RT. After a knee injury to Richie Incognito, Nick Leckey replaced Incognito in the lineup. It was the first time in Leckey's four-year NFL career that he played at G.

The Rams have used six different starting offensive line combinations and will likely use their seventh as Incognito undergoes knee surgery this week, leaving his status for the rest of the season in question. The Rams have played only one game in which the same offensive line that began the game also finished the contest, a Week 5 matchup vs. Arizona 10/30.

## **SACK ARTISTS**

DT La'Roi Glover and DE Leonard Little have been among the best in the NFL at sacking the quarterback during their careers. Glover is in his 12th season and finished second on the team with 5.5 sacks in 2006. Little is in his 10th season, and led the team in sacks with 13.0 last season.

In Week 7 at Seattle, Glover recorded the first sack of the 2007 and the 78th of his career, bringing down Seahawks' QB Matt Hasselbeck in the fourth quarter.

In Week 6 at Baltimore, Little recorded his first sack of the season and the 75th of his career, taking down Ravens' QB Kyle Boller and forcing a fumble.

Glover and Little rank tied for 8th and 10th, respectively, on the NFL's career active sack leaders list. The Rams are the only team with two players in the top 10.

## **A STRONG LEG**

K Jeff Wilkins has proven to be one of the best kickers in the NFL. Wilkins' 1,368 career points rank 20th all-time in the NFL and is seventh among active kickers. Wilkins 477 career extra points rank sixth among active kickers and 22nd all time. Wilkins ranks eighth among active kickers in the NFL in career field goals made and 20th all time. Wilkins' career 81.8 field goal percentage ranks sixth among active kickers.

Wilkins has 297 career field goals, and his 255 field goals as a Ram stands as the Rams' all-time mark. Wilkins' 1,175 points make him the Rams' all-time scoring leader.

Wilkins has converted 353 consecutive extra points, the second-longest streak in NFL history behind Denver K Jason Elam's streak of 371 consecutive extra point conversions from 1993-2002.

## **ON THE MARC**

QB Marc Bulger recorded his 25th career 300-yard passing game (including four 400-yard passing games) against Cleveland in his second week back after missing two games to injury.

Bulger connected with WR Torry Holt in the first quarter for a touchdown pass giving the Rams an early 14-0 lead. The score marked the 41st career touchdown pass from Bulger to Holt and ranks tied for second among active quarterback-receiver duos.

Completing 24 of 36 passes, his 310 yards ranked Bulger third in passing yards in Week 8 in the NFL placing him behind Drew Brees and Donovan McNabb. Bulger's 25 career 300-yard passing games rank's seventh among active quarterbacks. Since 2002, Bulger is also ranked seventh in passing yards (17,533) and eighth in touchdowns (98).

Bulger had his 24th career 300-yard passing game against San Francisco in Week 2 completing 24 of 41 passes for 368 yards and a touchdown.

### **OFFENSE**

#### **QUARTERBACKS (2) – Doug Nussmeier**

Marc Bulger (7), Gus Frerotte (14)

Two-time Pro Bowler Marc Bulger starts at QB for the Rams. In Week 2 vs. San Francisco 9/16, Bulger totaled 368 passing yards, the 24th 300-yard passing performance of his career. In Week 8 vs. Cleveland, Bulger passed for 310 yards, the 25th 300-yard passing performance in his career. Backing up Bulger, is 14-year veteran **Gus Frerotte**. Frerotte provides valuable experience and is familiar with coach Scott Linehan's offensive system, after spending time with Linehan while he was the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Minnesota (2003-04) and Miami (2005). Frerotte started in place of Bulger in Week 5 vs. Arizona 10/7 and in Week 6 at Baltimore 10/14. Frerotte saw brief action vs. Cleveland, temporarily playing for Bulger after Bulger suffered a thumb injury. In his first start, Frerotte completed 24-of-43 passes for 262 yards with three touchdowns and three interceptions.

#### **RUNNING BACKS (5) – Wayne Moses**

Steven Jackson (4), Brian Leonard (R), Travis Minor (7), Richard Owens (4), Antonio Pittman (R)

Pro Bowler **Steven Jackson** serves as the Rams feature back. In Week 3 vs. Tampa Bay 9/23 Jackson posted his

first 100-yard rushing performance of the year, rushing 30 times for 115 yards. Jackson returned to the starting lineup in Week 8 vs. Cleveland after being sidelined for four games after suffering a groin injury vs. Tampa Bay. Jackson ranks second on the Rams in 2007 with 274 rushing yards on 77 carries. Rams 2007 second-round draft pick **Brian Leonard** started four games in place of Jackson. In his second start of his young NFL career in Week 5 vs. Arizona 10/7, Leonard rushed for 102 yards on 18 carries, the first 100-yard rushing performance of his career. Leonard also made five receptions for 33 yards. In his first NFL start in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, Leonard rushed 16 times for 58 yards. The former All-America honoree from Rutgers has made contributions in 2007 as a rusher and as a receiver out of the backfield, rushing 77 times for 276 yards and gaining 129 yards on 18 receptions. **Travis Minor** joined the Rams in the offseason after spending the previous six seasons with Miami. Minor provides added depth and valuable contributions on special teams. Minor saw his most extensive action on offense this season in Week 6 at Baltimore 10/14, leading the Rams with 40 rushing yards on seven carries. Minor made three tackles on special teams vs. Arizona and is second on the squad with seven special teams tackles. Rookie **Antonio Pittman**, joined the Rams on a waiver claim 9/2 after being waived by the New Orleans Saints during final roster cuts. Pittman made his NFL debut vs. Arizona, playing on special teams. Pittman made his first NFL carry at Baltimore and finished with five carries for 11 yards. Pittman, a fourth-round draft choice of the Saints out of Ohio State, ranks eighth on the Buckeyes' all-time rushing list despite playing only three seasons. **FB Richard Owens** joined the Rams after being signed as a free agent 9/12. Owens, a four-year veteran, was waived by Minnesota during final roster cuts and saw his first action as a Ram at Tampa Bay.

#### **WIDE RECEIVERS (8) – Henry Ellard**

Drew Bennett (7), Isaac Bruce (14), Marques Hagans (1), Dante Hall (8), Torry Holt (9), Dane Looker (7), Travis Taylor (8), Brandon Williams (2)

The Rams' receiving corps is led by **Torry Holt** and **Isaac Bruce**, two of the best wide receivers in the NFL. Holt and Bruce are one of only five pairs of wide receivers who have played together for nine or more seasons in the Super Bowl era. The pair has totaled 1,356 receptions and 20,289 receiving yards with 119 touchdowns since their first season together in 1999. Holt leads the Rams this season with 46 receptions and 576 yards with four touchdowns. In Week 8 vs. Cleveland 10/28, Holt posted his first 100-yard receiving game, catching six passes for 110 yards with one touchdown. In Week 7 at Seattle 10/21, Holt made eight receptions and passed Hall of Famers Charlie Joiner and Michael Irvin to move into 21st place on the NFL's all-time receptions list with 752 career receptions. With a 26-yard reception on a Gus Frerotte pass in the fourth quarter of the Week 5 matchup vs. Arizona 10/7, Holt surpassed 11,000 career receiving yards, becoming the fastest player in NFL history to reach

the milestone, accomplishing the feat in 131 games. Bruce has added 17 receptions for 255 yards, including posting eight receptions for 145 yards in Week 2 vs. San Francisco 9/16. With his three receptions in Week 3 at Tampa Bay 9/23, Bruce surpassed 900 receptions during his career and reached the milestone in only 186 games, becoming the third-fastest player to reach the mark in NFL history. After spending the past six seasons with the Tennessee Titans, **Drew Bennett** joins the Rams after signing as a free agent in the offseason. Vs. Cleveland, Bennett had his best game as a Ram, tying for the team lead with six catches and gained 63 yards receiving. Bennett made his first start as a Ram vs. Arizona, catching two passes for 32 yards including a 16-yard touchdown pass. Bennett made his debut for the Rams in Week 2 vs. San Francisco, posting three catches for 42 yards. Bennett was deactivated for the season opening contest vs. Carolina 9/9 after suffering a thigh injury in practice. Joining Bennett as a new addition to the Rams receiving corps is former Kansas City Chief **Dante Hall**. One of the most dynamic return men in NFL history, Hall entered 2007 with 11 return touchdowns, good for third in NFL history. Hall proved his worth quickly in the 2007, returning the opening kickoff of the second half vs. Carolina for 84 yards. Hall produced his first kick return touchdown as a Ram in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, taking a Mat McBriar punt back 85 yards for a touchdown. Hall is tied for second in NFL history with 12 total kick return touchdowns (six kickoff returns, six punt returns). Hall is currently out of the lineup after suffering an ankle injury vs. Arizona. **Dane Looker** is in his fifth year with the Rams and is an important backup at the receiver position and critical on special teams, serving as the holder for K Jeff Wilkins. Looker saw action on offense vs. Carolina 9/9, catching two passes for 10 yards. Second-year receiver **Marques Hagans** joined the Rams' 53-man roster this season after spending the 2006 campaign as a member of the practice squad. Hagans, selected by the Rams in the fifth round of the 2006 NFL Draft, is a former college quarterback and also serves as the team's emergency signal-caller. Hagans led all Rams receivers at Baltimore with five catches for 74 yards in only his second NFL game. Hagans made his NFL debut vs. Arizona, entering the game in place of Dante Hall who left the game with an ankle injury. Hagans returned one kickoff for 20 yards and also caught one pass for 11 yards. **Brandon Williams**, who signed with the Rams Oct. 9, five days before the Week 6 game at Baltimore, has served as the Rams' primary kick returner in the last two contests due to Hall's ankle injury. A week after Williams set a personal-best with 112 kickoff return yards and 134 combined return yards (112 kickoff; 22 punt) at Baltimore, Williams continued the trend with his performance at Seattle last week. At Seattle, Williams returned seven kickoffs for 171 yards, both career highs. He also added one fair catch on a punt return. **WR Travis Taylor** signed with the Rams 10/17 before the game at Seattle. Taylor, a former first-round draft choice, made his Rams debut in Week 7 at Seattle, catching one pass for four yards.

### **TIGHT ENDS (4) – Judd Garrett**

Dominique Byrd (2), Joe Klopfenstein (2), Randy McMichael (6), Aaron Walker (5)

**Randy McMichael** starts at tight end for the Rams, after joining the team as a free agent in the offseason from Miami. McMichael spent five seasons with the Dolphins, one of which was spent under the tutelage of then Dolphins offensive coordinator Scott Linehan. McMichael is a receiving threat and an effective blocker from the tight end position. In Week 5 vs. Arizona 10/7, McMichael scored his first touchdown as a Ram on a 29-yard reception in the fourth quarter. In 2007, McMichael has made 19 receptions for 248 yards and one touchdown. A pair of second-year tight ends, **Joe Klopfenstein** and **Dominique Byrd**, join fifth-year player, **Aaron Walker**, to provide depth at the position. Klopfenstein has made five starts this season in either a two-tight end set or at fullback. Walker has started in a two-tight end set three times this season.

### **OFFENSIVE LINE (8) – Paul Boudreau, Jim Chaney**

Alex Barron (3), Milford Brown (6), Brandon Gorin (7), Richie Incognito (3), Nick Leckey (4), Andy McCollum (14), Brett Romberg (4), Claude Terrell (3)

Due to injuries, the Rams' offensive line has undergone shuffling throughout the 2007 season. Starting **RG Richie Incognito** missed the first four games of the season due to an ankle injury, before returning to action in Week 5 vs. Arizona 10/7. His status for the rest of the season is in question as he will undergo knee surgery for an injury sustained against Cleveland in Week 8. Starting **LT Orlando Pace**, starting **LG Mark Setterstrom** and **Adam Goldberg**, who had been serving as the Rams' starting RT after the injury to Pace, have all been lost for the season. Pace suffered a shoulder injury in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9 and Setterstrom injured his knee during the Rams' Week 3 matchup at Tampa Bay 9/23. **Pace**, a former No. 1 overall pick, had his streak of seven consecutive Pro Bowls snapped last year after his season was derailed by a torn triceps. After six games, the Rams have used 11 different offensive line combinations. **Alex Barron**, a third-year veteran, moves to the left side of the line and serves as the team's starting left tackle in place of the injured Pace. Barron, returns to the position for his most extensive action since he was a senior at Florida State University. **Brett Romberg** serves as the Rams' starting center after winning the job in training camp, the first time in his career that he has been named a full-time starter. **Milford Brown** joined the Rams in training camp to provide depth, but was pushed into service in Week 1 vs. Carolina after Incognito was unable to play. Brown switched positions again after the loss of Pace. With Barron moving to left tackle, Brown took Barron's place on the right side of the line in Week 2 vs. San Francisco. At Tampa Bay, Brown served as a reserve, but was called upon at LG after the injury to Setterstrom. Brown returned to the starting lineup at RT in Week 5 vs. Dallas 10/7. Brown started at left guard in Week 8 vs. Cleveland, after an injury to Romberg

caused more shuffling on the offensive line. Veteran center **Andy McCollum** returns for his 14th NFL season and after serving as a valuable backup in the beginning of the year, McCollum has moved into the starting lineup at LG, a position he hasn't played extensively since the 2003 season. Vs. Cleveland, McCollum moved back to his natural position of C after Romberg was unable to play due to an ankle injury. **C Nick Leckey**, who has also played G, was signed 10/6. Leckey saw his first action of the year filling in for an injured Incognito at RG vs. Cleveland.

## ***DEFENSE / SPECIAL TEAMS***

### **DEFENSIVE LINE (8) – Brian Baker, Mike Cox**

Victor Adeyanju (2), Adam Carriker (R), La'Roi Glover (12), James Hall (8), Trevor Johnson (4), Leonard Little (10), Clifton Ryan (R), Claude Wroten (2).

**DE Leonard Little**, the Rams' all-time leader in sacks since the statistic was made official in 1982, starts at left defensive end. Little recorded his first sack of the 2007 season in Week 6 at Baltimore 10/14 and now ranks 10th among active players with 75.0 sacks. This season Little has totaled 23 tackles and nine quarterback pressures, including four pressures in the Week 5 game vs. Arizona 10/7. Little has been playing through pain as he deals with a toe injury. **DE James Hall** starts at right end for the Rams after joining the Rams in the offseason in a trade with Detroit. In his first game as a Ram in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9, Hall notched four total tackles, including one tackle for loss. Hall produced four tackles and three quarterback pressures vs. Arizona. At Baltimore, Hall recorded his second sack of the season and finished the game with five tackles. In Week 7 at Seattle 10/21, Hall tied his season-high with five tackles including three solo stops. In Week 8 vs. Cleveland 10/28 Hall again tied his season-high with seven tackles, including five solo tackles. Hall leads Rams' defensive linemen with 39 takedowns. **DT La'Roi Glover** and **DT Adam Carriker** start along the inside of the Rams' defensive line. Glover, who is in his 12th season, is tied for eighth among active players with 78.0 sacks after posting his first sack of the season in Week 7 at Seattle along with four solo tackles and one quarterback pressure. Glover has 27 tackles this season. Glover notched three tackles and had three quarterback pressures at Baltimore. Carriker, the Rams' 2007 first-round draft pick is playing nose tackle and at the 'three-technique' after a standout career at defensive end for Nebraska. In his debut vs. Carolina, Carriker notched three assisted tackles and has 13 total tackles on the year. Carriker made a then career-high five tackles at Baltimore and added one quarterback pressure. Carriker bettered his career high a week later at Seattle, notching six stops and one quarterback pressure. In Week 8 vs. Cleveland 10/28, Carriker notched his first sack of the season by taking down Browns' QB Derek Anderson. Carriker finished the game with four total tackles. **DT Clifton Ryan** has been called upon to give the Rams' significant playing time after second-year player DT Claude Wroten was suspended for four games. Ryan proved to be ready to contribute as he saw

increased action in the Week 2 matchup vs. San Francisco. Ryan, led the Rams' defensive lineman with eight total tackles including two sacks and also caused a fumble by 49ers QB Alex Smith, which he recovered himself. Ryan became the first Rams' rookie since Sean Gilber in 1992 to record two sacks in a game. Ryan's 2.0 sacks rank third among NFL rookies. At Baltimore, Ryan led Rams' defensive linemen with seven tackles. Ryan's 34 tackles are second to James Hall for the most among Rams defensive linemen. **Wroten** returned last week Baltimore, and made one tackle. At Seattle, Wroten made two tackles and had two quarterback pressures. **DE Victor Adeyanju** had a promising rookie season in 2006, and provides important depth on the defensive line. At Baltimore, Adeyanju recovered a fumble by Ravens' QB Kyle Boller and returned it 24 yards to the Baltimore 16 yard line. Adeyanju saw significant playing at Seattle, helping to spell Leonard Little who was limited by a toe injury. Adeyanju finished the game with five total tackles. Adeyanju made his first start of the season vs. Cleveland, filling in for Leonard Little who was sidelined with a toe injury. **DE Trevor Johnson** also provides depth at the defensive end position for the Rams. Johnson, who has made six tackles in 2007, joined the Rams in the offseason after splitting time between the New York Jets and New Orleans in 2006. In Week 3 at Tampa Bay, Johnson recorded his first sack of the season, dropping Tampa QB Jeff Garcia for an 11-yard loss.

#### **LINEBACKERS (6) – Rick Venturi**

Brandon Chillar (4), Quinton Culberson (R), Chris Draft (9), Tim McGarigle (1), Pisa Tinoisamoa (5), Will Witherspoon (6)

Six-year veteran **Will Witherspoon** starts at middle linebacker for the Rams and ranks first on the team with 66 tackles in 2007. In Week 7 at Seattle, Witherspoon had a career day, totalling a personal-best 16 tackles including 15 solo tackles. The performance marked Witherspoon's 24 regular season double-digit tackle game and the 9th of his career with the Rams. This season, Witherspoon has had four games with 10 or more tackles. Witherspoon led the team in tackles in 2006, his first season with the team. Starting at strongside linebacker, **Brandon Chillar** had seven tackles and one forced fumble in the Rams' season opener vs. Carolina and posted a season-high eight tackles in Week 3 at Tampa Bay 9/23. Chillar made six tackles and had one quarterback pressure in Week 6 at Baltimore. Chillar's 42 tackles on the year rank fifth on the team. Chillar also sees action on special teams and ranks fifth on the team with four special teams tackles. **Pisa Tinoisamoa**, starts at weakside linebacker and has 61 tackles in 2007, the second-highest total on the team. Tinoisamo led the Rams with 15 total tackles vs. Arizona, the second-highest total of his career, bettered only by the 18 tackles made at Detroit 12/28/03. Tinoisamoa continued to make an impact at Baltimore with his second consecutive double-digit tackle game. Tinoisamoa finished the game with a team-leading 15 tackles, tying the second-best mark of his career achieved the week prior vs. Arizona. At Seattle, Tinoisamoa posted a third consecutive double-digit

tackle game, making 12 total tackles. Tinoisamoa missed the Week 2 matchup vs. San Francisco and the Week 3 contest at Tampa Bay with an ankle injury, but Tinoisamo returned to action in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, making nine total tackles. The Rams acquired free agent **Chris Draft** in the offseason, and the nine-year veteran from Stanford, is an important backup and special teams player, with the ability to be a starter. Draft has 17 total tackles in 2007 and started at weakside linebacker vs. San Francisco and at Tampa Bay in place of Tinoisamo. Draft made three total tackles on defense and adding one tackle on special teams vs. San Francisco and six tackles at Tampa Bay. 2006 seventh-round draft choice **Tim McGarigle** spent last season on the Rams' practice squad, but has found a home on the team's active roster this season despite being slowed by a hamstring injury in the preseason. McGarigle serves as a backup linebacker and is an important special teams player. McGarigle is tied for fourth on the team with four special teams tackles, notching three of the tackles in the contest vs. Arizona. Undrafted rookie free agent **Quinton Culberson** from Mississippi State rounds out the linebacking corps. Culberson was inactive in the season-opener, but saw his first NFL action in Week 2 vs. San Francisco, notching two special teams tackles and earning Special Teams Player of the Week from the team's coaches. Culberson earned his second Special Teams Player of the Week honors for his play at Baltimore in Week 6.

#### **SECONDARY (9) – Willy Robinson, Ron Milus**

Oshiomogho Atogwe (3), Ron Bartell (3), Eric Bassey (1), Fakhir Brown (8), Corey Chavous (10), Tye Hill (2), Todd Johnson (5), Hanik Milligan (5), Jonathan Wade (R).

**S Corey Chavous**, a 10-year veteran, starts at strong safety for the Rams and provides valuable leadership for a secondary that features only three other players with five or more years of experience. Chavous ranks third on the team with 50 total tackles and notched eight total tackles in each of the Rams first two games. Chavous missed the Rams Week 5 game vs. Arizona 10/7 and the Week 6 contest at Baltimore 10/14 with a pectoral injury. In Week 3 at Tampa Bay 9/23 Chavous led the team with 10 tackles including six solo stops. Chavous posted his second consecutive game with 10 tackles in Week 4 at Dallas 9/30, leading the team. Starting free safety **S Oshiomogho Atogwe** got off to a fast start in 2007, leading the team in tackles with 10 in Week 1 vs. Carolina 9/9. Atogwe's 49 tackles are fourth on the team in 2007. Atogwe, who has shown a propensity for making big plays, recorded his first forced fumble and fumble recovery of the season at Tampa Bay. He continued his strong play at Dallas, notching eight tackles and intercepting a Tony Romo pass, returning it 31 yards. At Baltimore, Atogwe forced a fumble and made three tackles. **CB Tye Hill**, a second-year player out of Clemson, starts at cornerback, but missed four games due to a back injury that was suffered in practice prior to the Week 2 contest vs. San Francisco. Hill returned to the lineup at Baltimore, serving as the team's nickelback before moving into the left cornerback spot after Bartell injured a finger. Hill finished with three tackles and one pass defensed. **CB Ron Bartell** serves as the team's

nickelback, but started at cornerback in the Rams first six games after the absence of Fakhir Brown for four games due to suspension and an injury to Hill. Bartell has impressed notching 35 tackles including 1.0 sack and making one interception. **Brown** returned from his four-game suspension in Week 5 vs. Arizona and made an immediate impact as a starter. Brown made his presence known immediately and had arguably the best game of his career, leading the secondary with eight solo tackles, two interceptions and a career-high four passes defended. Brown recorded a career-high two interceptions for 12 yards. His two picks led the NFL in Week 5 and marked the first time a Ram had multiple interceptions in a game since CB Ron Bartell tallied two against Minnesota (12/31/06). Brown made eight tackles at Baltimore and had one pass defended. In Week 6 at Baltimore, Brown made five tackles and had five passes defended. **S Todd Johnson**, acquired in the offseason as a free agent, provides valuable experience and is a standout on special teams. In Week 1 vs. Carolina, Johnson shared the Rams' special teams Player of the Week honors with LB Brandon Chillar after Johnson notched two special teams tackles. Johnson's nine special teams tackles rank first on the team. Johnson's experience has proven valuable after injuries in the secondary. **S Jerome Carter** was placed on the reserve/injured list after injuring his foot vs. Arizona. With Chavous already out due to a pectoral injury, Johnson moved into the starting lineup at strong safety at Baltimore, and led Rams' defensive backs with nine tackles. 2007 third-round pick **CB Jonathan Wade** contributes as a backup in the secondary this season and is a gunner on the Rams' punt coverage teams. Wade, who earned *Associated Press* All-Southeastern Conference honors while at Tennessee, is third on the team with five tackles on special teams and has nine tackles on defense. **CB Eric Bassey** was added to the roster 10/12 from the practice squad and played in his first NFL game at Baltimore, seeing action on special teams. Bassey made two tackles on special teams vs. Cleveland in Week 8. **S Hanik Mulligan** joined the Rams as a free agent after the bye week 11/5. Mulligan entered the NFL as a sixth-round draft choice of the San Diego Chargers in the 2003 NFL Draft and was named to the Pro Bowl as a special teams player after the 2005 season.

### **SPECIAL TEAMS (3) – Al Roberts, Todd Downing**

Donnie Jones (4), Chris Massey (6), Jeff Wilkins (14)

**K Jeff Wilkins**, a 14-year veteran, has converted on 12-of-18 field goal attempts this season. Wilkins has been successful on all five of his PAT attempts this season and continues his streak of 353 consecutive PAT, which stands as a Rams' franchise-record and ranks second in NFL history behind Jason Elam's streak of 371 consecutive extra point conversions from 1993-2002. Wilkins has converted 297 career field goals, which stands as the Rams' all-time mark and his 1,175 points make him the Rams' all-time scoring leader. **LS Chris Massey**, one of the most consistent players at his position, continues long snapping duties, while **P Donnie Jones** P Donnie Jones is having a Pro-Bowl caliber year, as he leads the NFL with a 50.3-yard punting

average, and is third in the NFL with a 41.3-yard net average. In Week 7 at Seattle, Jones punted six times for a 52.3-yard average with a career long of 80 yards. The 80-yard punt marked the third longest punt in Rams history, and the longest in the NFL this season. The punt surpassed his then career long in of 66 yards that he set in Week 4 at Dallas. Against Arizona in Week 5, Jones made four punts for a 56.0 average with a long of 60 yards. His 56.0-yard gross average was the best single game average in franchise history, passing Jack Jacobs' 55.8-average at Detroit Sept. 27, 1942. A week earlier at Dallas, he punted eight times for a then career-high 55.3-yard average with a long of 66 yards, two touchbacks and four kicks inside the 20-yard line.
