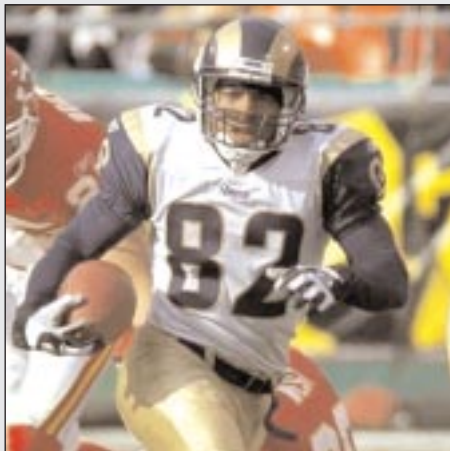
NFC CHAMPION RAMS FACE CARDINALS IN FIRST OF THREE SEASON-ENDING GAMES AGAINST NFC WEST

The NFC Champion St. Louis Rams face the Arizona Cardinals on Sunday, December 15, in the first of three consecutive games against the NFC Western Division. Kickoff of the nationally televised game on ESPN is set for 7:35 p.m. Last week, The Rams (5-8) lost their third straight contest at Kansas City, 49-10. The Cardinals (5-8) won in overtime at home against Detroit, 23-20, ending a six-game losing streak.

This will be the 49th meeting between the Rams and Cardinals, the fourth since the Rams relocated to St. Louis in 1995, and the second in 2002. The Rams lead the series, 25-21-2. In this season's earlier meeting, the Rams won 27-14 at Arizona, 27-14. RB Marshall Faulk totaled a season-high 236 yards and one touchdown (27-178-1 rushing, 5-58-0 receiving) as the Rams won their third straight game on November 3. The Cardinals had won the previous three meetings between the teams, including both since 1996, posting a 20-17 win on Sept. 27, 1998, and taking a come-from-behind 31-28 overtime win in Arizona on Sept. 29, 1996. The Rams last won at home in the series on Sept. 4, 1994, a 14-12 victory in the season opener. The teams have met once in the postseason, with the Rams winning at home, 35-23, in the 1975 NFC Divisional Playoff.

RAMS IN PRIMETIME FOR THIRD TIME THIS SEASON The Rams will play in primetime for the third time this season, the second time at home, and the first time this season on ESPN. The Rams are 1-1 this season, both on Monday Night Football, losing at Tampa Bay 26-14 on Sept. 22, and winning at home vs. Chicago, 21-16, on Nov. 18. The Rams won their last game on ESPN in 2001, winning 24-17 at New England on Nov. 18. **Mike Patrick** will call the action, while **Joe Theismann** and **Paul Maguire** provide analysis. **Suzy Kolber** is the sideline reporter. The game will also be televised live on **ESPN Deportes** with **Eduardo Varela** handling the play-by-play and **Fuad Reveiz** providing analysis. **Luz Ramos** is the sideline reporter.

BIG RETURNS FOR THE LITTLE MAN WR/KR Terrence Wilkins had a career day in Sunday's game at Kansas City. Doing most of his damage on returns, Wilkins gained a career-best 261 all-purpose yards against the Chiefs. Wilkins touched the ball on offense (1-4 rushing, 1-5 receiving), but did his big damage on punt and kickoff returns. He had three punt returns for a season-high 94 yards, and seven kickoff returns for 158 yards, his third-highest total of the season. On a Chiefs' punt on the game's opening possession, Wilkins' fielded the ball at his own 21 near the Rams' sideline, turned right, avoided a would-be tackler at the 22, then turned upfield enroute to a 48-yard punt return to the Kansas City 31-yard line. The punt return took Wilkins over the 1,000-yard mark for punt returns in his career and led to a Rams' field goal. Later in the first quarter, Wilkins had a 36-yard punt return up the Rams' sideline that gave the Rams' field position inside Chiefs' territory.



Wilkins' yardage total topped his previous career best of 248 yards against Miami Oct. 10, 1999, while with the Indianapolis Colts (4-81 receiving, 2-14 punt returns, 4-153-1 kickoff returns). In his fourth season out of Virginia, Wilkins has six carries for 56 yards, five receptions for 31 yards, is averaging 9.7 yards on 25 punt returns, and 22.9 yards on 47 kickoff returns (1,403 all-purpose yards this season. Wilkins ranks ninth in the NFC in punt return average.

COACHES **Mike Martz** is in his third season as Rams' head coach. In 2000, he became the third first-year head coach of a defending Super Bowl champion to lead his team to the playoffs. Last season, he led the Rams to their second Super Bowl appearance in three years. Martz was the fourth rookie head coach in NFL history to win his first six games, and first since 1977 (Red Miller, Denver). Named the 21st head coach in Rams' history by Owner Georgia Frontiere on February 2, 2000, Martz is the fifth head coach to take over a Super Bowl champion and the first since Barry Switzer (Dallas Cowboys) in 1994. Martz was the Rams' offensive coordinator in 1999, and is the mastermind behind one of the most explosive offenses in league history. Since coordinating the Rams' offense three years ago, the Rams have the highest winning percentage in the NFL over the past two and three seasons (.750 and .771, respectively), became the first team in NFL history to score at least 500 points three consecutive seasons (526, 540, 503), and gained more yards over a three-year span (20,177) than any team in NFL history while setting numerous team and league records. Martz is in his second tour of duty with the Rams. He began his NFL coaching career with the Rams as offensive assistant in 1992, and coached tight ends, receivers, and quarterbacks through the 1996 season. In between, Martz was quarterbacks coach of the Washington Redskins from 1997-98. Martz began his coaching career in 1973 at Bullard High in Fresno before moving to the collegiate ranks at San Diego Mesa C.C. (1974, 1976-77), San Jose State (1975), Santa Ana College (1978), and Fresno State in (1979). Martz served as an assistant at the University of Pacific (1980-81) and Minnesota (1982) before moving to Arizona State, where he coached quarterbacks and receivers from 1983-87, and was offensive coordinator from 1987-91. Martz has a 31-18 overall record as Rams' head coach.

Dave McGinnis was named the 38th head coach in Arizona Cardinals' history on December 18, 2000, after serving as the team's interim head coach for the final nine games of the 2000 season and as defensive coordinator since 1996. Prior to joining Arizona, McGinnis spent 10 seasons as linebackers coach for the Chicago Bears. McGinnis began his coaching career at his alma mater, Texas Christian University, as freshman coach from 1973-74. McGinnis also served as an assistant at Missouri (1975-77), Indiana State (1978-81), TCU (1982), and Kansas State (1983-85). He has a 13-25 overall record as Cardinals' head coach.

RADIO KLOU-FM 103.3-FM, the flagship station of the Rams, and **KTRS-AM 550**, will broadcast the game live. **Steve Savard** will handle play-by-play duties, while former Rams' wide receiver **Jack Snow** brings his insight to the color commentary. **Malcolm Briggs** is the sideline reporter. **CBS Radio/Westwood One** will carry a live broadcast game, with **Joel Meyers** handling play-by-play, and **Bob Trumpy** providing analysis. **Rick Walker** is the sideline reporter. **Jones MediaAmerica Radio Network** will broadcast the game in Spanish with **Alvaro Martin** handling play-by-play, and **Danny Marulanda** providing analysis.

A RAMS' WIN OVER THE CARDINALS WOULD:

- Improve the Rams' record to 6-8
- Give the Rams a 3-1 record against the NFC West this season, and a 24-5 record in division games since 1999
- Give the Rams their fifth consecutive home win, their longest streak since winning 13 consecutive games since from 1998-2000
- Give the Rams their seventh consecutive home win in December, dating back to 1998
- End the Rams' three-game losing streak and give the Rams their first win since beating Chicago, 21-16, on Nov. 18
- Give the Rams their second straight win over Arizona, and first victory in St. Louis over the Cardinals since relocating to the Gateway City in 1995

STRONG AT HOME DURING WINNING STREAK During their four-game home winning streak, the Rams have averaged 28.5 points per game, and posted their top two yardage outputs of the season (524 yards vs. San Diego Nov. 10, 478 yards vs. Seattle Oct. 20). During the same time, the defense had their season-lowest and fourth-lowest yardage totals allowed this season (220 vs. Chicago Nov. 18, 256 yards vs. San Diego Nov. 10).

WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK

- **WR Isaac Bruce (944)** needs 56 receiving yards to post his fourth consecutive 1,000-yard season, tying receivers coach Henry Ellard for the team record. It would be Bruce's sixth 1,000-yard season of his nine-year career, extending his team record.
- **RB Marshall Faulk (4,980)** needs 20 rushing yards to become the fourth player in team history with 5,000 rushing yards. He would become the second player in NFL history to rush for at least 5,000 yards with two different teams, joining Hall of Fame RB Eric Dickerson (Rams and Colts).
Faulk (858) needs 142 rushing yards to post his sixth consecutive 1,000-yard season and eighth of his nine-year career. It would be Faulk's fourth consecutive 1,000-yard season with the Rams, tying Hall of Fame RB Eric Dickerson for the team record.
Faulk (16,230) needs 63 yards from scrimmage to move to seventh on the NFL's career list of yards from scrimmage, surpassing Hall of Famer Tony Dorsett (16,293).

Angel Tree Holiday Party

In an effort to make the 2002 holiday season a more joyous occasion for local underprivileged children, the Rams are pleased to announce a partnership with the Bar Association of Metropolitan St. Louis (BAMSL) and Helping Hands, Healing Hearts, a local non-profit agency. This partnership is an expansion of the Project Angel Tree holiday initiative, which BAMSL began in 1992 to benefit area children with a parent in the Missouri prison system. Since the project's inception, it has grown each year and now includes children in the foster care system.

In 2001, the St. Louis Rams joined this effort by getting Rams players, wives and staff involved in the holiday party. In 2002, as the Rams became more involved, they identified an opportunity to merge the holiday efforts of Helping Hands, Healing Hearts, a local non-profit agency dedicated to helping children in need, together with Project Angel Tree. This year, through the combined efforts of BAMSL, Helping Hands, Healing Hearts and the St. Louis Rams, more than 3,000 children will be invited to the Edward Jones Dome on Saturday, December 14 from 1-4 p.m. to enjoy a day of holiday fun, including live entertainment, a book corner, activity booths, arts and crafts, visits with Santa, Rams players and cheerleaders, and holiday gifts.

Bear Essentials Party

WR Torry Holt will attend the Bear Essentials holiday party on Wednesday, December 11 at the Missouri Baptist Medical Center auditorium at 6:30 p.m. Holt will mingle with the families and present a special gift to the program for from the Holt Foundation. The Holt Foundation, which was founded in memory of his mother, who passed away from cancer, and the Rams Foundation supports "Bear Essentials" program, a program formed 12 years ago at Missouri Baptist Medical Center that meets monthly to provide support to children with a parent who has been diagnosed with cancer.

2002 RAMS OFFENSIVE NOTES The Rams rank 10th in the NFL (fifth in the NFC) in total offense, averaging 358.4 yards per game. St. Louis is 24th in the NFL (13th in the NFC) in rushing offense, averaging 98.9 yards per game. The Rams are third in the NFL (lead the NFC) in passing offense, averaging 259.5 yards per game.

2002 RAMS DEFENSIVE NOTES The Rams rank seventh in the NFL (fourth in the NFC) in total defense, allowing 302.0 yards per game. St. Louis is 10th in the NFL (fourth in the NFC) in rushing defense, allowing 107.2 yards per game. The Rams are sixth in the NFL (fourth the NFC) in passing defense, allowing 194.8 yards per game.

2002 RAMS SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES The Rams rank 18th in the NFL (10th in the NFC) in punt returns, averaging 9.7 yards per return. St. Louis is tied for 18th in the NFL (10th in the NFC) in kickoff returns, averaging 21.3 yards per return. The Rams rank 29th in the NFL (15th in the NFC) in punt coverage, allowing 14.6 yards per return. St. Louis is 32nd in the NFL (16th in the NFC) in kickoff coverage, allowing 25.5 yards per return.

MARTIN'S THE MAN QB Jamie Martin tied a career high with 24 completions in 35 attempts for 218 yards with one touchdown and two interceptions last week at Kansas City. Martin completed passes to eight different receivers in leading the Rams on two scoring drives. Following a 48-yard punt return by WR Terrence Wilkins, Martin completed two of three passes for 16 yards before K Jeff Wilkins made a 36-yard field goal to put the Rams on the board. Later in the quarter, Martin directed a four-play, 51-yard drive in which he completed all four pass attempts to four different receivers: TE Ernie Conwell (12 yards), RB Marshall Faulk (19 yards), WR Torry Holt (12 yards), and ended the drive with an eight-yard touchdown pass to WR Isaac Bruce. Martin has completed 71 of 112 passes for 712 yards with three touchdowns and five interceptions, and has two rushes for seven yards.

THE MARSHALL PLAN RB Marshall Faulk totaled 48 yards on 14 touches last week at Kansas City. Faulk, who did not start, but was in on the game's second play, rushed 10 times for 13 yards and caught four passes for 35 yards.

Faulk, the NFL's Most Valuable Player in 2000, and the offensive player of the year each of the past three seasons, has gained at least 2,000 yards from scrimmage each of the past four seasons (an NFL record). Faulk has scored more points (288) in the past two seasons than any player in the NFL, and has scored more touchdowns over the past two (47), three (59), and four (69) seasons than any player in the NFL, and is third in rushing yards (2,741) since 2000 and 1999 (4,122), and second in rushing yards over the past four seasons (5,441). Faulk also has more rushing touchdowns than any player in the NFL over the past two, three, and four seasons (30, 37, 43, respectively).

Faulk has rushed 183 times for 858 yards and eight touchdowns and has caught 68 passes for 483 yards and two touchdowns. Faulk has 251 touches for 1,341 yards and 10 touchdowns. Faulk leads the Rams, and is ninth in the NFC in rushing, he is third on the Rams, and seventh in the NFC in receptions, is fourth in the NFC and is 14th in the NFL in total yards from scrimmage, and is tied for fourth in the NFC and is tied for 10th in the NFL in touchdowns. Faulk is tied for fourth in the NFC in first downs (64).

BIG GAME T. HOLT WR Torry Holt caught four passes for 45 yards last week against the Chiefs. Holt's first catch of the game, a 12-yard reception in the first quarter, set up WR Isaac Bruce's eight-yard touchdown catch on the ensuing play. Holt is approaching his third consecutive season with at least 1,000 receiving yards, and would move to third on the Rams' career list of most seasons with 1,000 yards, surpassing Hall of Famer Tom Fears. Holt, who entered this season with more receiving yards since the 2000 season than any player in the NFL (2,998) and the third-highest receiving yards total in the NFL since 1999 (3,786), has 69 receptions for 992 yards and two touchdowns in 2002. Holt is tied for the team lead, tied for fifth in the NFC (WR Isaac Bruce) and tied for 15th in the NFL in receptions, and leads the Rams, is fifth in the NFC and 12th in the NFL in receiving yards.

BEEF CONWELL AND BIG B. TEs Ernie Conwell and Brandon Manumaleuna combined to catch five passes for 42 yards last week at Kansas City. Conwell (3-17) had a 12-yard reception in the first quarter to set up the Rams' touchdown. Manumaleuna (2-25) tied a career-high in receptions and had a 15-yard catch on the Rams' second possession. Conwell (25-307-1) and Manumaleuna (7-100-0) have combined for 32 receptions for 407 yards and one touchdown, while Conwell also had five rushes for 27 yards and one touchdown.

BRUCE, THERE HE IS WR Isaac Bruce scored his 62nd career touchdown last week at Kansas City, catching an eight-yard scoring pass from QB Jamie Martin in the first quarter. Bruce, who led the Rams with five receptions for 47 yards, extended franchise record of receiving touchdowns and receptions while moving closer to the team record for receiving yards. Bruce became the franchise leader in receptions at Washington Nov. 24, and became the first player in team history with 600 receptions at Philadelphia Dec. 1.

This season, Bruce has caught 69 passes for 944 yards and five touchdowns and three rushes for 18 yards. Bruce is tied for the team lead, and tied for fifth in the NFC (WR Torry Holt) and tied for 15th in the NFL in receptions, and is second on the Rams, eighth in the NFC, and 15th in the NFL in receiving yards.

PROEHL PATROL WR Ricky Proehl tied a season high in receptions with four for 33 yards last week at Kansas City. Three of Proehl's passes resulted in first downs for the Rams as Proehl equalled his top reception games of 2002 set at Tampa Bay Sept. 23, at San Francisco Oct. 6, and at Washington Nov. 24. This season, Proehl has made 34 receptions for 636 yards and four touchdowns. Of Proehl's catches in 2002, 26 have gained first downs, 14 of them on third down. Proehl is tied for 11th in the NFC in third down receptions, despite having less catches for the season than all but one player in the Top 20 in the third down receptions category. THE RAGING HUSKER DE Grant Wistrom made seven tackles, including one for loss, last week at Kansas City. Wistrom, playing near his hometown of Webb City, Mo. for just the second time in his career, tackled QB Trent Green for a three-yard loss following a Green fumble, forcing the second of two Chiefs' three-and-out possessions in the first quarter. Wistrom, coming off consecutive games at Washington and at Philadelphia in which he set career highs in tackles in each contest, has made 37 tackles (including three for loss), 2.5 sacks, five quarterback pressures, one pass defense,d and one fumble recovery in the past four games. In his fifth season out of Nebraska, Wistrom is third on the team with 87 tackles (including three for loss), is second on the team in sacks (4.5) and quarterback pressures (29), and has one interception, three passes defensed, one forced fumble and a career-best two fumble recoveries.

GREASE IS THE WORD DT Ryan Pickett made six tackles last week at Kansas City. Pickett, coming off a career-high tying 10-tackle game at Washington and a career-high setting 12-tackle game at Philadelphia in consecutive weeks, has had a breakthrough season in 2002. Nicknamed "Big Grease" after his father, Pickett has made at least four tackles 10 consecutive games, and 11 of 12 games this season. THE MIGHTY KIM For the third consecutive week, FS Kim Herring posted career best in tackles. After tying his NFL best with nine stops against Washington and Philadelphia in consecutive weeks, Herring made 14 tackles, including one for loss, last week at Kansas City. Herring, who originally set a career-best with nine tackles in Game 2 vs. the New York Giants, also set a career high with eight solo tackles. This season, Herring is fifth on the Rams with a career-high 80 tackles, leads the Rams with three interceptions, has 10 passes defensed, and one fumble recovery.
